THE MATCHUPS

The Concordia-St. Paul women's basketball team (4-9, 1-6 NSIC) will play their next four conference games on the road, as they head to Wayne State (12-4, 6-2 NSIC) and #12 Augustana (12-0, 8-0 NSIC) this weekend and will travel to Upper Iowa and Winona State the following weekend. This will be the second time that Concordia faces each of these opponents, as they are all South Division teams.

LAST TIME OUT

The Bears are coming off a 0-2 conference weekend, falling to both #19 Northern State and MSU Moorhead at home. Junior Anna Schmitt and sophomore Brianna Miller were consistent performers in both games, as Schmitt averaged 18.0 points a game and tallied 11 assists, and Miller averaged 14.5 points and 5.5 rebounds. Miller shot especially efficiently, connecting on 65.0% (13-20) of her shots from the field, 50.0% (1-2) from three, and 100.0% (2-2) from the line.

On Saturday against Northern State, the Wolves outscored the Bears in every quarter, eventually winning 86-71. The Bears shot fairly well themselves throughout the game, connecting on 40.7% (24-59) from the field and 36.8% (7-19) from three, posting their best percentages since playing Upper Iowa on December 8th. The Wolves, however, capitalized on 16 more points from the floor and scored 14 more points in the paint than the Bears. Northern State also dominated the boards, holding a decisive 46-22 rebounding edge. Back-to-back threes in the fourth quarter from Haydn Becker and Schmitt got the Bears within eight points of the Wolves with 5:17 still left in the game, but Northern State held on, eventually winning by 15.

The following day, the Bears held the lead for the majority of the second half, but the Dragons made a late comeback, going on a 13-6 point run in the final minute and a half of the game to win 66-60. Seven different CSP players scored in the contest, with three of them reaching double figures. Schmitt led the way with 15, but Miller and Dorr were right behind her with 14 and 13 points, respectively. Dorr also helped out on the boards, tallying seven rebounds, three of which were offensive. Junior guard Kayla Miller led all rebounders in the game, though, compiling a career-high ten boards.

WAYNE STATE SERIES HISTORY

With the 79-62 loss to the Wildcats earlier this year, the Bears dropped slightly below .500 in their series history with Wayne State, as CSP now holds a 19-20 record against their Nebraska opponents. Also with the win in early December, the Wildcats have won the last two straight. The Bears last defeated Wayne State on December 3rd, 2016, when the Bears outscored their opponents by 12 in the final quarter to win 86-66 at Rice Auditorium in Wayne, Nebraska. CSP is 7-10 when playing the Wildcats on the road, but have gotten their last two wins against the Wildcats when playing them in Wayne.

LAST MEETING VS WSC

The Bears were defeated by Wayne State earlier this year by a final score of 79-62. The Bears got down early in the first quarter, but quickly bounced back in the second quarter, as a jumper from Schmitt tied up the game heading into half-time. The Wildcats had a strong third quarter, though, holding the Bears to only 12 points, compared to scoring their own 23. Helping the outcome was the fact that WSC shot a noteworthy 56.6% (30-53) from the field and 84.2% (16-19) from the line. The Bears were held to a lower field goal percentage (36.2%), but connected on more threes (42.9%) than their opponents (30.0%).

The Bears were led by Anna Schmitt in the contest, as she scored 24 points while also recording four assists. Freshman Ellie Gess recorded her career-high 17 points in the contest, shooting 46.1% (6-13) and 57.1% (4-6) from beyond the arc. Sophomore Brianna Miller was the final Golden Bear to reach double figures in this game, scoring ten.

ABOUT THE WILDCATS

Wayne State is 12-4 on the year so far and 6-2 in the NSIC. Since playing the Bears in December, the Wildcats have gone 4-1, defeating U-Mary, Minot State, Sioux Falls, and Southwest Minnesota State, while falling to #14 Augustana.

As a team, Wayne State is averaging 76.4 points per game, which is the second highest average in the NSIC, while holding their opponents to 63.0 points. They are shooting 43.9% from the field, which is the fourth highest in the conference and are first in the NSIC in free-throw shooting, hitting 79.9% of attempts from the line, while also making an average of eight more free-throws than their opponents. The Wildcats are averaging 38.8 rebounds per game, which is 2.3 more than their opponents and an average of 7.6 more than Concordia.

The Wildcats return 11 players and add five new faces to this year's team. Among the returners is senior forward Paige

Ballinger, who was the team's leading scorer last season and currently leads the team in scoring this year with 11.4 points per game. Ballinger also averages 5.8 rebounds a game and has 36 blocks in her sixteen games played. Senior Maggie Schulte also averages double digit points, with 10.6 per game, and leads the team in rebounding, averaging 6.8 a game.

AUGUSTANA SERIES HISTORY

The Bears fell to Augustana earlier this season to fall to 11-15 in their all-time history against the Vikings since playing them once in 1994 and 2001 and then regularly since 2004. CSP is 7-3 against Augie at home, but only 2-9 when playing them in Sioux Falls. Concordia last defeated Augustana last season on January 7th, winning 83-77 at home. Before that victory, the Vikings had won the last four straight. The last time that the Bears have beaten Augustana in Sioux Falls was in December of 2013.

LAST MEETING VS AUGIE

CSP last faced the Vikings on December 1st, 2017 when Augustana defeated the Bears 72-50 at the Gangelhoff Center. Concordia did not shoot well in the contest, being held to only 32.1% (17-53) from the floor, 27.3% (9-33) from three, and 43.8% from the line (7-16), whereas the Vikings shot better in every category, capitalizing on 11 more field goals. Second chance points were also costly, as Augie scored 15 off of offensive rebounds, compared to CSP's one.

The Bears were outscored by seven in the first two quarters to trail by 14 at the half. CSP fared a little better in the second half, posting a better field goal percentage and scoring more points, but it was too late as the Vikings went on to win by 22. Gess was the leading scorer for the Bears, scoring 16 points, and Schmitt finished with 14. Dorr led the rebounding efforts, with six.

ABOUT THE VIKINGS

The Vikings remain undefeated at 12-0 and 8-0 in NSIC play, which is the best start in program history for Augustana. Coaches around the nation have made note and rank the Vikings as the #12 team in the country. Since playing the Golden Bears in early December, Augie has posted wins against Minnesota State, Minot State, U-Mary, Wayne State, and most recently against Southwest Minnesota State on December 30th and Sioux Falls on December 31st.

As a team, Augustana is averaging the most points in the NSIC, at 83.9 points per game, which is an average of 21.2 points more than their opponents. The team also ranks third in field goal percentage (45.8%), fourth in three-point percentage (36.1%), second in free-throw percentage (78.7%), and first in turnover margin (7.42).

The Vikings have an experienced roster, returning 14 players from last year's season, including all of last year's starters and leading scorers. Augustana presents a balanced offense, as four different players are averaging between 11.8 and 14.2 points per game. The team also applies heavy pressure on defense, forcing 250 turnovers so far this season. Senior guard Logan O'Farrell does a little bit of everything for the Vikings, as she leads the team in minutes (27.6), scoring (14.2), and steals (54), while being tied for the most rebounds (6.2), and having the second most assists (4.7). Junior center Shelby Selland is tied with O'Farrell for the highest rebounding average with 6.2 per game. Selland also averages 12.3 points per game and has a team-leading 25 blocks on the year so far.

KEY STATS

-Junior guard **Anna Schmitt** returned to play after a few games off due to an injury and picked up right where she left off, leading the Bears both days with 21 points against #19 Northern State and 15 points against MSU Moorhead. Schmitt also averaged 5.5 assists and 4.5 rebounds per game over the weekend.

-**Schmitt** is ranked first in the conference in scoring (21.1 ppg), ninth in field goal percentage (45.4%), third in free-throw percentage (89.6%), fifth in three-pointers per game (2.2), ninth in assists per game (3.1), and ninth in minutes per game (32.0).

-**Brianna Miller** was named CSP Athlete of the Week for the first time in her career after averaging 14.5 points per game in the last two contests, scoring a career-high fifteen against Northern State. Miller shot 65.0% in the last two games and had a career-high eight rebounds and four assists against MSU Moorhead.

-Senior **Haydn Becker** scored a career-high 14 points against Northern State, while also securing a career-high five rebounds, which led the Bears in that game.

-**Lindsay Dorr** was the third CSP player to be in double figures against MSU Moorhead, finishing with 13 points and seven rebounds, three of which were offensive. Dorr ranks 14th in the conference in rebounding, averaging 6.5 boards a game.

-Junior **Kayla Miller** compiled a career-high ten rebounds against the Dragons to lead all rebounders in the contest.

Amanda Johnson enters her second full season after officially being named the program's ninth head basketball coach in April, 2016 following a successful stint as interim head coach in the second half of the 2015-16 season.

One of the top post players in Concordia basketball history, Johnson assumed the interim head coach position during winter break of the 2015-16 season and led the program to a 9-10 record highlighted by a 9-6 finish that included an NSIC Sanford Health Tournament first round victory.

In her first full season in 2016-17, Johnson led the team to a fifth place finish in the NSIC and a third place finish in the South Division as the team compiled a record of 19-10 (15-7 NSIC) on the season.

She's completed her fifth year coaching in the program, spending the first two as a graduate assistant before a promotion to the top assistant position on staff for a year and a half.

Johnson returned to the Golden Bears in 2012-13 after a strong stint as a professional player in Australia. She returned to pursue a master's degree in sport management and initially was tabbed

with working with the post players. As a graduate assistant, the Golden Bears captured two NSIC Championships and an NCAA Central Region Championship with a trip to the Elite Eight during her first two years on staff.

Concordia Playing Career

The two-time All-Region performer led the Golden Bears to back-to-back NSIC regular season and tournament championships and was two-time NSIC Player of the Year in the process. Johnson set the school single-season scoring record with 551 points as a junior in 2006-07 as she led the Golden Bears to the NCAA Central Region Championship game and the school's second Sweet 16 run.

She averaged 16.8 points and 8.6 rebounds while shooting 52.4% from the floor and finished as Concordia's seventh all-time leading scorer despite playing three years for the Golden Bears (2005-08).

She had a 30-point, 20-rebound performance in the 2006-07 region title game. Her 726 career rebounds rank third in Concordia's Division II-era (1999-present). She also scored 1,426 career points in 94 games, adding 112 steals and 81 blocked shots.

The St. Croix Lutheran High School graduate was a business and marketing major at Concordia as an undergraduate. She began her college career at Division I Winthrop University, playing in 27 games with three starts with a Big South Freshman of the Week award.

Coaching Beginning

Johnson brings prior coaching experience to the Golden Bear huddle, working as an assistant coach at New Life Academy.

Professional Playing Career

After her Concordia playing career came to a close, Johnson pursued professional basketball in Australia, playing for the Ringwood Hawks where she was a 2010 Big V League MVP and helped the Hawks to a Victoria State Championship. She posted averages of 15.6 points and 14.3 rebounds most recently.

Amanda is married to men's basketball assistant coach Eric Johnson. They currently reside in Hudson, Wis with their son, Jase.

Assistant Coach notes:

Ashley Ellis-Milan enters her fourth season at Concordia as the program's top assistant in the 2017-18 season after spending her first two years as a graduate assistant. She's no stranger to campus as a St. Paul Central High School graduate before continuing her playing career just a few miles away at the University of Minnesota.

After her career in maroon and gold, she played professionally in Germany, Greece and a stint with the Minnesota Lynx. Ashley graduated from Minnesota with a degree in education and is pursuing a master's in educational leadership at Concordia.

Sophie Kenney joined the Concordia women's basketball coaching staff as a graduate assistant working with the guards for the 2016-17 season. Kenney was a standout at Augustana University, earning All-NSIC Second Team honors as a senior, also being named to the NSIC All-Tournament Team. She was also a three-time NSIC All-Academic student-athlete at AU where she was a business communications and English double-major.
