THIS WEEK: FIRST ROAD GAME OF 2017

Concordia-St. Paul hosts St. Cloud State in week three in an NSIC North-South Division contest. The Golden Bears are seeking their first win against SCSC as the teams prepare to square off for the fifth time in the series which started in 2010.

MEET THE 2017 TEAM CAPTAINS

Concordia head coach **Shannon Currier** has announced four captains for the 2017 season with senior tight end **Matt Bjork** (De Pere, Wis.) repeating as a two-time captain. He's joined by seniors **Andrew Capirchio** (CB, Fountain Hills, Ariz.) and **Frantz Polimice** (LB, Palm Bay, Fla.) and fourth year sophomore **Rich Kelly** (OG, Plainfield, Ill.).

To become a captain, players had to go through a formal application process that also included reading three books, community service and obtain letters of recommendation. The team voted on the applicants who completed the process to select its captains. Three, Johnson, Nabak and Chapes were selected during the spring season with Bjork earning the distinction following fall camp.

ABOUT THE HUSKIES

Like the Golden Bears, the Huskies enter Saturday's tilt with a 1-1 record after grabbing an impressive 41-26 win at Southwest Minnesota State as well as dropping their home opener to Winona State 34-10. Despite ranking just ninth in scoring offense (25.5 points per game) and 13th in scoring defense (30.0 points per game) in the NSIC, St. Cloud State ranks in the top half in yardage on both sides of the ball, including seventh in total offense (364.5 yards per game) and third in total defense (297.5 yards allowed per game).

Through the first two weeks, it's the SCSU run game that has carried the offense. The Huskies have gobbled up 197.5 yards per game on the ground, led by running back Joe Blando. Blando's 243 rushing yards (121.5 per game) are good for third in the league while his two rushing touchdowns also rank fifth. While it's been the running game that has shined so far for St. Cloud State, quarterback Dwayne Lawhorn also ranks ninth in the NSIC with 353 yards in the air to balance things out a bit on offense. Lawhorn's top targets in the early going have been John Solberg (nine catches for 119 yards) and Derek Kumerow (nine catches for 100 yards) while Sam Hartman has been the main man near the goal line by grabbing both of the team's receiving touchdowns.

While the offense has been able to break free in the run game, the SCSU defense has been even better at stopping the run. St. Cloud State enters Saturday with the second fewest yards against on the ground in the NSIC, holding opponents to just 92 yards rushing overall on 52 carries for a measly 1.8 yards per tote. Jake Schley and Brady Westart have played a big role in that success as Schley leads the team with 3.5 tackles for loss while Brady Westart follows close behind with 3.0. Westart is also tied for the team lead along with Jerry Duckworth with 14 total tackles.

SERIES NOTES: ST CLOUD STATE 4, CONCORDIA 0

The Golden Bears and Huskies met for the first time in 2010 and SCSU has captured victories in each of the four meetings since. In the series, SCSU has not allowed Concordia to score more than 13 points and has yet to score less than 28 with the closest margin being the 18-point Husky win in 2015 in St. Cloud. The Huskies have been to Sea Foam Stadium twice, a 35-10 win in 2010 and a 34-3 win in 2013. SCSU has been nationally-ranked in two of the matchups, #10 in 2011 and #24 in 2013.

The Golden Bears and Huskies will meet for the first time under head coach **Shannon Currier**, as the series started in 2010.

LAST MEETING, 2015: SCSU 28, CONCORDIA 10

In the 2015 season opener, Concordia rolled up 358 yards and held the host Huskies to 295 but it was SCSU who came away with the double-digit win, 28-10.

Concordia also had a 20-13 advantage in first downs and 31:40 to 28:20 in time of possession.

It was turnovers and missed opportunities that held CSP from victory as the Bears committed three turnovers, missed a pair of fourth downs deep in the SCSU red zone and went 4-13 on third downs.

SCSU countered by playing turnover free football, converting 7-14 on third down and putting the ball in the end zone on all four trips to the red zone.

Concordia was led by **Alex Carr** on the ground as the junior ran for 144 yards on 16 carries while junior **Darius Chapes** contributed 43 yards on 12 carries. CSP rushed for 188 yards on the day.

Trailing 21-3 in the third quarter, CSP used big plays to get back in the game. A 35-yard connection from **Corey Cole** to **Alquawn Vickers** set up runs of 25 and 20 yards by Carr to put the ball on the 10 yard line. A few plays later, Cole hit **Bruce Russell** for a 17-yard touchdown over the middle to make it a 21-10 game with 8:47 to play in the third quarter.

The Huskies responded with another touchdown while taking over five minutes off the clock to move just 57 yards on 10 plays to make it a three score game, 28-10 late in the third.

Concordia was stopped on a fourth and goal from the 11 yard line as backup quarterback **Ben Schramski** was stopped at the two yard line, ending the comeback threat.

Jordan Halverson led CSP's defense with 11 tackles followed by **Breon Hoosier** with 10 tackles. **Chazz Roberts** added a sack and blocked a field goal attempt.

LAST WEEK: BEMIDJI STATE 54, CONCORDIA 17

In week one, CSP used a defense that held Minot State scoreless in three trips to the end zone, blocked a field goal and was lights out on third downs (2-13) in shutting out the Beavers.

Offensively, CSP was efficient and opportunistic in exploiting what was available. In the first half, that was through the passing game as sophomores **Maxon Hutton** and **Marcus Gustaveson** combined for 111 yards on five passes. In the second half, it was the run game as sophomore **Darnell Rolle** gashed Minot for 84 yards on six carries in the third quarter alone before the backup committee rushed for over 60 yards in the fourth.

The Golden Bears weren't able to translate that success against the same named opponent in week two, the Beavers of Bemidji State. Although the defense was able to hold BSU to 3-12 on third downs and limited the Beavers to 13 points in three trips to the red zone.

But it was big plays and turnovers that led to a 40-0 halftime lead for BSU and a 54-17 final score. The Golden Bears had five turnovers and a -3 differential and BSU scored on six plays of at least 20 yards and four plays of 56-plus yards.

In the first quarter, BSU had a 10-2 advantage in first downs and mounted a 224-17 margin in total offense.

From there, Concordia compiled 310 yards of total offense in the final three quarters while BSU had 334 the rest of the way.

At the end of the day, CSP was 4-18 on third downs, 1-3 on fourth and scored just once in four trips to the end zone, a 19-yard pass from **Maxon Hutton** to **Gabe Steed** early in the third quarter. The Hutton-to-Steed connection was set up by CSP's special teams, a strength of the program as the Bears forced and recovered a fumble on the return.

Following a BSU score, CSP's special teams continued to shine as **Elias Arlington** returned a kickoff 91 yards for a touchdown. Late in the game, it was **Jonas Schenderlein** for CSP's special teams, delivering a 50-yard field goal.

Offensively, Hutton completed 12-35 for 163 yards and a touchdown but was sacked three times and picked off four times. Backup **Trevor Tillett** completed 7-15 for 62 yards in relief.

Eight different players caught passes for Concordia led by **Jake Tanner**'s six catches for 44 yards while **Deeon Schumann** led the unit with 55 receiving yards on two catches.

Arlington added three catches for 42 yards and led the team with 154 all-purpose yards (3-42 rec, 2-112 KR).

On the ground, **Darnell Rolle** led a stable of backs with 11 carries for 37 yards while three others had between 15 and 18 rushing yards and Hutton added 11 despite the three sacks sapping yardage from his rushing total.

Defensively, **Brian Szutkowski** had seven tackles (all solo) and a pass breakup and **Mitch Zillman** also had seven tackles. **Malik Patterson** had a sack in his debut and **Dion Wallisch** had a pair of red zone pass deflections.

STANDOUT SPECIAL TEAMS UNITS

A preseason emphasis was placed on the importance of special teams across all of the units: kickoff and punt coverage, kickoff and punt return, kick and punt block and the kicking game. CSP already brought a pair of All-NSIC specialists to the kicking game, and invested heavily on practice time to ensure the rest of the units would be as efficient as the two legs.

On coverage, sophomore running back **Darnell Rolle** has four special teams tackles including three in week one.

Long snapper **Dalton Smerchek** forced and recovered a fumble on punt coverage in the red zone at Bemidji State, setting up an easy touchdown for the offense.

The team has produced a blocked kick (**Dylan Wood**, blocked FG vs Minot, **Cole Riemer** blocked PAT at BSU) in each game while not allowing a blocked kick on either unit.

In the return game in week one, **Jake Tanner** had three punt returns for 68 yards with a long of 43 and is among the nation's top-15 in punt return average (15.4) on the year (5-77). **Elias Arlington** added a 91-yard kickoff return for a touchdown in week two as CSP averages 35.0 yards on four kickoff returns on the year compared to opponents' 18.5 on just two returns as **Jonas Schenderlein** has converted seven of his nine kickoffs to touchbacks.

Schenderlein is also 2-2 on field goals including his second career 50-plus yarder (50) at Bemidji State.

ALL-CONFERENCE KICKING GAME RETURNS

The Golden Bears return an All-NSIC kicking tandem in 2016 All-NSIC South Division First Team kicker **Jonas Schenderlein** and Second Team punter **Sam Maedke**. The duo are in their third years as the starter at the positions, with Maedke now a senior and Schenderlein a junior. Schenderlein has added kickoffs to his repertoire for 2017. MEET THE STARTING QB: MAXON HUTTON

In head coach Shannon Currier's offensive philosophy, versatility is valued across the field from up front, to the backs and receivers and includes the quarterback. The Golden Bears have three multi-faceted quarterbacks on the roster, 2016 starter **Ron Johnson**, third year spot starter **Trevor Tillett** and the 2017 starter **Maxon Hutton**. While comfortable with all three in the huddle, Hutton claimed the starting nod out of camp and is expected to be a versatile playmaker with his feet and arm while minimizing turnovers and avoiding pressure.

In game one in his first career start, Hutton was not sacked and committed just one turnover while engineering a balanced offense that played comfortably with the lead in a 24-0 win over Minot State.

HEAD COACH SHANNON CURRIER | 5TH SEASON



Originally the eighth head coach of Concordia football in 2000, Shannon Currier returned to lead the program for his second stint in December, 2015.

He entered his fifth season leading the team in 2016 and remains the program record holder for career winning percentage.

In his first stint, he compiled a 32-12 (.727) record and brought the program its first NSIC Championship in 2003 when he was named NSIC Coach of the Year. The conference title also brought a berth in the Mineral Water Bowl, the first postseason game in school history.

He coached Concordia to four consecutive winning seasons and is the only coach in program history to achieve the feat - consecutive or cumulative.

THE GRIFF MYTH - PROTECTING HOME TURF

The team also established the longest home winning streak in school history under his guidance. Known to the teams as the "Griff Myth," Concordia tallied 19 consecutive home victories down the street at Griffin Stadium. The streak began in 2002 and stretched two years after Currier left through the 2005 season, finally falling at the beginning of 2006.

In Currier's first four years, his teams only lost two home games, producing a record of 18-2 after winning his first and last nine home games.

downs and added six rushing touchdowns. Tillett has played in 10 games in his career, passing for 859 yards and four touchdowns.

SOPHOMORES SPEARHEAD OFFENSE

In week one, the skill positions were led by a sophomore trio that could be a playmaking force for years to come. Quarterback **Maxon Hutton** engineered the offense effectively, using big plays with the arm in the first half in building a lead before ceding to the run game in the second half to preserve the win. He finished with 199 yards of total offense (168 pass, 31 rush).

His top target was sophomore **Marcus Gustaveson** (6-116, 1 TD) as the duo connected for a career-long (for each) 45 yard play to set-up an 11 yard touchdown between the pair in the second quarter. Gustaveson topped 100 yards in the first half.

On the ground, sophomore **Darnell Rolle** rushed for the bulk of his 107 yards in the third quarter (6-84), finishing with 17-107 and a touchdown after going for just 11 for 23 in the first half. In his first career 100-yard day, Rolle wasn't used in the fourth quarter as the deep backfield helped preserve the big lead.

GUSTAVESON READY TO BREAK OUT

Sophomore **Marcus Gustaveson** had a pair of 100-yard games as a freshman when the lights were shining brightest against UMD (7-115, 2) in week three and Augustana in week 10 (10-129, 1). He led the team in catches (41), yards (564) and touchdowns (5) as a true freshman while missing one game and being slowed in parts of others due to injury. In the spring, he became a two-sport star by breaking the program record in the shot put at the NSIC Outdoor Track & Field Championships hosted on his home turf at Sea Foam Stadium.

He opened 2017 with his third 100-yard receiving game of his career with 6-116 and a touchdown in a 24-0 win over Minot. He was targeted early and often at BSU in week two, but was held without a catch against the BSU secondary.

Through two weeks, CSP is using its depth in the passing game as three players have six catches (Gustaveson, **Deceon Schumann** & **Jake Tanner**), eight players have two or more catches and nine players have caught passes. Schumann is putting a stamp on early season success with six catches for 95 yards in two games while Tanner had a six-catch game at BSU (44 yards).

YOUTH IN THE SUNSHINE STATE BACKFIELD

Led by true sophomore **Darnell Rolle** (Miami), Concordia's running backs share multiple common traits: the top three in the rotation all come from Florida, and all three are underclassmen as Rolle is joined by freshmen **Lajuan Preston** (Fort Myers) and **Shaq Johnson** (St. Petersburg). In the opener, the trio combined for 165 yards on 25 attempts (6.6 avg) led by Rolle (17-107, TD). The backfield is deeper than the three youngest from Florida, however, as junior **RaQuan Cunnigan** is second on the team among running backs in attempts (11), yards (50) and average (4.5) with Rolle leading the team across the board (28-144, 5.1). Johnson (10) and Preston (8) are right there with Cunnigan on carries with Johnson adding 42 yards and a touchdown and Preston bringing 18 yards.

OFFENSIVE LINE GROWS IN STRENGTH, CONTINUITY

When head coach **Shannon Currier** was hired in December, 2015 he inherited four offensive linemen. In 2016, the Golden Bears provided the young offensive line a chance to compete and play as true freshmen, gaining valuable experience early in their careers. This year, the starting five up front include junior tackles **Ben Lawrence** and **Terrell Taylor** with a sophomore interior of **Hunter Kauffman** at center surrounded by **Rich Kelly** and **Ethan Aune** at the guard spots. The team is not expected to play a true freshman up front this year and only has one senior.

The experience of playing together with game experience, along with spring football and offseason workouts to gain strength will pay dividends as the 2017 season progresses as well as into future seasons.

DEFENSIVE LINE FEATURES EIGHT MAN ROTATION

The 2017 defensive line two deep features a bright future with fourth year starting nose tackle **Chazz Roberts** as the only senior and junior defensive tackle **Adam Miller** as the only junior on the unit. Sophomores **Dylan Wood**, **Cole Riemer** and **Kelly Pierce** start along side Roberts and all three made an impact as

freshmen a year ago.

Roberts has made 102 tackles with 20.0 for loss and five sacks in his career to lead the group. Adding youth to the mix on the second line are redshirt freshmen **Rahiem Ladson** and **Malik Patterson** and true freshman **Chris Garrett**. Garrett had a strip sack in the red zone to help preserve the 24-0 shutout win in his career debut. Riemer and Pierce each have seven tackles with 1.5 for loss while Wood and Roberts have six and five, respectively.

Wood and Riemer have each blocked a kick on special teams as well.

VETERAN LINEBACKERS LEAD THE WAY

The starting linebackers for CSP are among the most experienced position on the roster with seniors **Billy Brown** and **Frantz Polimice** on the outsides and junior **Mitch Zillman** at the Mike. Senior **JJ Przybylka** also sees significant time at the Mike and junior **Isaiah Walker** adds experience at SLB behind Brown. The veteran players are joined by true freshmen **Blake Evans** and **Gabe Nkumu**.

Zillman leads the unit and is second on the defense with 11 tackles while Evans and Polimice each have eight tackles.

Przybylka's two tackles in the season opener put him at the 100 milestone for his career.

HOOSIER MAKES AN IMPACT FOR THE SAFETIES

Senior strong safety **Breon Hoosier** had a strong debut in 2017 with a pair of sacks blitzing from the strong safety position. Now a fourth year contributor, Hoosier has 110 career tackles, 5.0 for loss, the sacks were the first of his career and he has seven pass breakups with an interception.

He's flanked by sophomore **Brian Szutkowski** at the free safety position who leads the team with 12 tackles. One of the faster players on the team, Szutkowski had five tackles, 1.0 for loss, a pass breakup and a hurry in his first career start and added seven solo tackles in week two along with a pass breakup.

Junior **Brandon Russell** provides depth with 82 career tackles, 6.0 for loss and produced 48 tackles (5.0 for loss) a year ago. Freshman **Dez Bassett** has also factored in the rotation and played in each game this season.

TRANSFERS START AT THE CORNER

Senior captain **Andrew Capirchio** returns at one starting corner spot after working his way into spot starts as a junior transfer from Scottsdale Community College. He's made five tackles with one pass breakup in the first two games.

Opposite him is first year junior transfer **Dion Wallisch** from Minnesota Crookston. He's tied for second on the team with 11 tackles (one for loss) and has two pass breakups. Wallisch played in 10 games in 2015 as a redshirt freshman, finishing fourth on the team with 56 tackles with 4.5 for loss and a sack. He showed his tackling ability in week one by leading the defense with eight total tackles (seven solo) and added a tackle for loss.

Making their debuts in week one at the position were redshirt freshman **Desmond Hudnall** and true freshman **Lorenzo Kendricks**.
