THE MATCH UPS

The Concordia-St. Paul women's basketball team (10-12, 7-9 NSIC) returns home this weekend for a set of NSIC North matchups. The Golden Bears will take on Bemidji State University (7-13, 4-12 NSIC) on Friday, February 7th at 5:30 p.m. followed by a game against the University of Minnesota-Crookston (4-16, 3-13 NSIC) on February 8th at 3:30 p.m.

LAST TIME OUT

Last weekend, the Bears split against Northern State (W, 62-54) and Minnesota State-Moorhead (L, 66-67) on the road.

The win against Northern State was a major team effort as eight of ten Golden Bears to hit the floor contributed to the scoreboard. Sophomore Sydney Schultz led the team with 12 points and seven rebounds on 62.5% (5-8) shooting as she dominated in the paint for CSP.

Concordia had the lead for the entirety of the game and shot 46.9% (23-49) from the field but struggled from the three to finished just 5 out of 18 (27.8%) of their attempts. The Wolves were held to 34 https://www.youtube.com/NorthernSunConf.6% (18-52) shooting from the floor and 15% (3-20) from three. Their only three-pointers occurred in the first half of the game and NSU went 0-9 in the second half.

On Saturday afternoon against the Dragons, it was an even battlefield until the final minute. The Golden Bears developed a two-point lead late in the fourth quarter but MSUM's Brooklyn Liegel was able to drop a tricky three-pointer from the corner to gain a one-point lead with 6.5 seconds to go.

Unable to find the open bucket before the final buzzer, CSP out-shot Moorhead from the floor, concluding the night on 41.7% (25-60) shooting while holding MSUM to 39.7% (25-63). The Bears also won the three-point battle, going 8-for-17 (47.1%) while the Dragons hit 6 of 20 (30%).

Danielle Schaub hit a total of five threes on the night (5-7) to match her career-high and led the Bears with 15 points while on the court for all 40 minutes. Schultz had another productive night in the paint, collecting her fifth double-double of the season with 12 points and 11 rebounds.

BSU SERIES HISTORY

Concordia has had success against the Beavers all-time, going 31-12 in their 43 matchups. The Golden Bears have won the last five of six games between the two programs and 28 of the last 31. Concordia is 19-9 playing Bemidji at home in regular season play.

LAST TIME AGAINST BSU

On February 27th last year, the Golden Bears matched up against the Beavers for the first round of the NSIC Tournament. In an unexpected upset, BSU defeated CSP 73-70 at the Gangelfhoff Center.

The Beavers had outstanding shooting from the three-point line, finishing 12 of 22 on a 54.5% shooting downtown. They were especially sharp in the second half, hitting 6-8 from long range and shot 8-12 from the field in the fourth quarter.

The Golden Bears got off to good start, holding the Beavers scoreless for the first 3:30 of the game and taking a 5-0 lead right off the bat. Bemidji State would inch back into the game near the end of the quarter, bringing the deficit to one at 11-10. The Golden Bears would answer back with a 9-0 run, capped by a Riley Wheatcraft left-handed layup. However, BSU would hit a corner three at the buzzer to make the score 20-13 going into the second quarter.

Last year's seniors were big scoring contributors, but Sidney Wentland was strong from the floor to score seven points while collecting six rebounds.

SCOUTING THE BEAVERS

The Beavers have struggled the last few weeks and are coming into Friday's matchup on a five-game losing streak. Bemidji ranks seventh in the NSIC in field goal percentage at 42.5% and eighth in three-point percentage at 32.8%. They struggle from the line, ranking 15th for free throw shooting and averaging 68.3% on the season.

The squads scoring leader is Trinity Myer who averages 14.0 points per game (12th NSIC) on 45.5% shooting from the floor (6th NSIC). The sophomore guard is also the teams leading re-

bounder, averaging 5.4 a game and shares the ball well with 4.0 assists per game (4th NSIC).

Taylor Bray is a strong forward for the Beavers, putting up 10.3 points each game and has nine blocks on the season. Rachael Heittola is a key player off the bench, scoring 9.9 points a game and grabbing 5.0 rebounds.

CROOKSTON SERIES HISTORY

The Golden Bears are 24-9 all-time against the Golden Eagles. Minnesota Crookston has won two of the last three games in the series and has also been victorious in five of the last eight. Concordia is 14-4 all-time against Crookston at the Gangelhoff Center.

LAST TIME AGAINST UMC

The Golden Bears and the Golden Eagles faced off a year ago when CSP closed the game with a 24-12 run to secure the 67-59 win. UMC was up 47-43 with 7:05 to go in the game but Concordia came out in the fourth quarter ready to shoot. The Bears shot 53.8% from the floor after shooting no higher than 31.6% in the previous three quarters.

The Golden Bears held a distinct advantage in two statistical categories. CSP shot their best free throw percentage of the year by going 16-17 from the stripe (94.1%) while UMC shot 68.2%. They also outscore the Golden Eagles in transition, scoring 12 points on the fast break.

The top scorers of the game were all 2019 seniors, but Sidney Wentland contributed five points and four rebounds in her 28 minutes of play. Meghan DuBois also put up five points as a freshman and dished out an assist in the win.

SCOUTING THE GOLDEN EAGLES

UMC was stuck in an eight-game losing streak until defeating Minot and SMSU. After two wins, the Golden Eagles fell to the University of Sioux Falls this past weekend.

Crookston averages 61.1 points per game (15th NSIC) and the team is shooting 37.5% from the floor (15th NSIC). The squad struggles from downtown, shooting 27.8% from three this season.

Starters for the Golden Eagles vary, with nobody on the roster starting all 20 games. Abby Guidinger is a player to watch, averaging 10.0 points per game and 13 blocks this season (14th NSIC). The strongest rebounder is Bren Fox with 6.4 a game (14th NSIC) while scoring 8.0 points each contest. The most efficient shooter is Julia Peplinski at 47.9% from the floor and 7.1 points per game.

KEY STATS

The Golden Bears continue to be one of the top three-point shooting teams in the conference, ranking third at 36.8%. They're the best shot blockers in the NSIC, averaging 4.41 blocked shot per game. They also rank sixth in scoring at 71.4 points and 10th in field goal percentage at 41.6%.

Sidney Wentland continues to be the top scorer for CSP, averaging 12.9 points a game and ranking 16 in the NSIC. Her 1.3 blocked shots each game put her in 6th place in the conference. Sydney Schultz entered the NSIC rankings for rebounding after her performances last weekend, averaging 5.4 rebounds a game to rank 24th. She ranks 14th on the offensive end, grabbing 1.9 o-boards a game.

Danielle Schaub is sixth in the conference for three-point shooting, having 49 on the season and 2.2 each game. She also has the teams highest assist-to-turnover ratio at 1.7 (4th NSIC) and highest number of minutes played each game at 34.0 (3rd NSIC).

In steals, Meghan DuBois grabs 2.0 a contest to rank third in the conference and distributes the ball well enough to rank number ten in the NSIC for assists per game (3.5).

Amanda Johnson enters her fourth full season after officially being named the program's ninth head basketball coach in April, 2016 following a successful stint as interim head coach in the second half of the 2015-16 season.

One of the top post players in Concordia basketball history, Johnson assumed the interim head coach position during winter break of the 2015-16 season and led the program to a 9-10 record highlighted by a 9-6 finish that included an NSIC Sanford Health Tournament first round victory.

In her first full season in 2016-17, Johnson led the team to a fifth place finish in the NSIC and a third place finish in the South Division as the team compiled a record of 19-10 (15-7 NSIC) on the season.

She's completed her year coaching in the program, spending the first two as a graduate assistant before a promotion to the top assistant position on staff for a year and a half.

Johnson returned to the Golden Bears in 2012-13 after a strong stint as a professional player in Australia. She returned to pursue a master's degree in sport management and initially was tabbed with working with the post players. As a graduate assistant, the Golden Bears captured two NSIC Championships and an NCAA Central Region Championship with a trip to the Elite Eight during

her first two years on staff.

Concordia Playing Career

The two-time All-Region performer led the Golden Bears to back-to-back NSIC regular season and tournament championships and was two-time NSIC Player of the Year in the process. Johnson set the school single-season scoring record with 551 points as a junior in 2006-07 as she led the Golden Bears to the NCAA Central Region Championship game and the school's second Sweet 16 run.

She averaged 16.8 points and 8.6 rebounds while shooting 52.4% from the floor and finished as Concordia's seventh all-time leading scorer despite playing three years for the Golden Bears (2005-08).

She had a 30-point, 20-rebound performance in the 2006-07 region title game. Her 726 career rebounds rank second in Concordia's Division II-era (1999-present), just 16 shy of the school record. She also scored 1,426 career points in 94 games, adding 112 steals and 81 blocked shots.

The St. Croix Lutheran High School graduate was a business and marketing major at Concordia as an undergraduate. She began her college career at Division I Winthrop University, playing in 27 games with three starts with a Big South Freshman of the Week award.

Coaching Beginning

Johnson brings prior coaching experience to the Golden Bear huddle, working as an assistant coach at New Life Academy.

Professional Playing Career

After her Concordia playing career came to a close, Johnson pursued professional basketball in Australia, playing for the Ringwood Hawks where she was a 2010 Big V League MVP and helped the Hawks to a Victoria State Championship. She posted averages of 15.6 points and 14.3 rebounds most recently.

She had also worked at Freedom Mortgage in the Twin Cities between Australian seasons.

Amanda is married to men's basketball assistant coach Eric Johnson. They currently reside in Hudson, Wis with their son, Jase, and daughter, Skylar.

Assistant Coach notes:

Kristen Lee joined the Concordia women's basketball coaching staff in the summer of 2018. The Dawson, Minnesota native and graduate of St. Catherine University (exercise sports science) in St. Paul will primarily work with guards while assisting in all aspects of the program.

Her college coaching career began as a graduate assistant at SMSU where she earned a master's degree in physical education. She also served as a coach with the Minnesota Fury AAU program. Lee was most recently the top assistant at Northwestern (Iowa), which made a run to the NAIA DII national semifinals.

Haydn Becker enters her second season as a graduate assistant for the Golden Bears in 2019-20. Prior to joining the coaching staff, Becker was an NSIC All-Academic selection for Concordia. She made 53 appearances, including 13 starts, over her two seasons after transferring in from Sioux Falls. Becker graduated from CSP with a degree in Elementary Education and is currently pursuing a Master's degree in Educational Leadership.

Kyrh Fredenburg is a first year graduate assistant for the Golden Bears basketball team. A 2019 graduate, Fredenburg played in 110 games for the Golden Bears and made 86 starts. She holds the all-time career record in rebounds with a total of 913 grabs. The Coon Rapids, Minnesota native is currently pursuing her Master's degree in elementary education and early childhood.
