It was a bittersweet ending to the 2018 football season, as CSP ended its final game at Winona State with a 24-20 loss. The Golden Bears held the Warrior offense to a mere 60 yards of rushing, while CSP racked up over 200 yards of rushing.

A pivotal part of the game was with 12:19 left in the fourth quarter and the Golden Bears took a 20-17 lead after Jonas Schenderlein secured a 56 yard field goal. The team effectively managed the clock and converted four first downs to drive the ball to the Warriors 40-yard line. However, after failing to convert a 3rd & 2 and 4th & 2, the Golden Bears' drive ended. Winona State capitalized on this and drove for the winning touchdown

with 36 seconds remaining.

Although we did not reach our goal for wins this season, we produced a respectable 5-6 record. There were three very competitive games that the team lost; two of those were in the remaining seconds of the game. However, CSP won as many games this season as the totality of the last three seasons combined.

I am proud of the hard work and dedication each player has given this year. We have shown improvements, and I am excited about the direction the team is heading. The confidence of the football team has grown significantly as the relentless play and enthusiasm were evident in the final two games of the season. The leadership of our team did a great job of motivating their teammates to finish the season strong.

The only way to keep improving is looking at what is within our control. We are a team that returns all 11 defensive starters and 10 offensive starters. Our momentum is strong and we will continue to trend upward focusing on our future and what we can do to improve our performance as a team.

Eric commented that Golden Bear football was and is a culture that inspires accountability for everyone to perform on and off the field. It took years after his playing experience to understand the importance of mentors pushing him beyond his own limitations. The growth that took place while at CSP has given him confidence to

accomplish his goals.

When asked about the advice he would pass on to CSP players today, he stated, "slow it down, and enjoy the process. Embrace the transition from "starting over." Learn as much as possible from older players and coaches who have a wealth of experience as this will propel you into the largest gains of your growth you will experience.
