Joe's best memory at CSP was meeting his wife Whitney Mapson, and playing alongside his twin brother Joseph Mapson.

Joe met his wife Whitney at Concordia-St. Paul and

IN LOVING MEMORY OF COACH RUSSELL GARY

(July 31, 1959-March 10, 2019)



Russell Gary, brought a substantial amount of credibility to our program and was the most decorated former player on staff. He was a collegiate All-American while at the University of Nebraska. Additionally, he was the 29th pick in the 1981 draft by the New Orlean Saints. His NFL career spanned nearly seven years.

When Coach Gary spoke, players listened. He was an incredible mentor for so many

players and provided subtle coaching points that enhanced their performance. Coach Gary was respected by so many as a person and coach. He lifted others up and he leaves a tremendous legacy.



WELCOME COACH TAYLOR!



Coach Oliver Taylor replaces Houston Jones as Passing Game Coordinator

Coach Taylor comes to CSP from FCS Delaware State University, where he served as wide receivers coach. Prior of Delaware State, he coached wide receivers at Saginaw Valley, where he mentored freshman receiver Chad Gailliard to Honorable Mention All-America, First Team All-Conference, and Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference Freshman-of-the-Year honors in 2017.

Prior to joining Saginaw Valley, Taylor was the wide receivers coach at Widener University (Pa.). In 2015, the Widener offense was the conference leader in passing yards per game (316.0), while three players earned All-Conference recognition. Taylor

was running backs coach at Widener in 2012. That season, the Pride reached the NCAA Division III national quarterfinals and ranked eighth in the country in the final season poll. The 2012 Widener squad was top in its conference and fifth in the nation in total offense, while also ranking in the Top 10 in scoring and passing. At the conclusion of the 2012 season, Taylor left Widener to become the wide receivers coach at Division II Seton Hill University (Pa.).

Taylor attended Howard High School in Wilmington, Delaware. After high school he attended prep school at Hargrave Military Academy for one year. He then enrolled at Delaware State University (2003-2007) where he was a member of the Hornets' 2007 MEAC Championship and first-ever NCAA playoff team. Taylor graduated from Delaware State with a Bachelor's of Science degree in Business Management.
