WITH COACH CURRIER

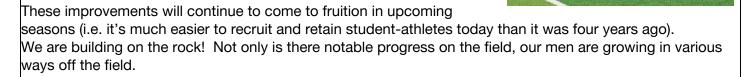

JOSEPH MAPSON



Joseph Mapson, originally from Champaign, IL was a standout play maker in his three years with the Golden Bears (2001-2003). He teamed up with his twin brother Joe to form one of the most dangerous receiver combinations in NCAA DII football. Joseph was a wide receiver, punt and kick returner and even played both ways (cornerback) in the Mineral Water Bowl his senior year.

Joseph Mapson was named the NSIC Offensive Newcomer of the Year in his first season

on campus in 2001. He went on to be a three-time All-NSIC selection and by his senior year he earned All-NSIC First Team honors at as a wide receiver and as a returner. Both Joseph and twin brother Joe were inducted into CSP's Hall of Fame this fall.

He explained that his most cherished memory was playing alongside his twin brother. The important aspects of life that Joseph learned while playing football at CSP was how to be spiritually in tune with God, the importance of building positive relationships with others, and always be willing to learn and work hard for yourself and your family.
