One of the most important roles that I have as the head football coach is to recruit, hire and retain a quality coaching staff. Like the old adage illustrates, "it takes a village to raise a child," it also takes a quality football coaching staff to influence the young men that comprise our program. I have been blessed to have attracted high character coaches, along with much needed continuity within the staff.

Our football coaching staff consists of 14 people. There are coaches who are full time employees at CSP, coaches who teach at local high schools and coach football at CSP, and some young men that are just beginning their careers as graduate assistants and student assistants. Values that I believe are critical when selecting staff members or team members include: being humble, having excellent interpersonal skills and

having a strong desire to be great.

Continuity is very beneficial for program development, yet the staff has experienced a few losses from last year. We return 9 assistant coaches from last year's staff. Two coaches advanced their career and accepted NCAA Division I coaching opportunities. Additionally, we also lost a mainstay and one of the best mentors the program has ever had in Coach Russell Gary as he suffered a heart attack last spring. Through this change, we welcome additions to our staff, as new coaches bring different ideas, perspectives and processes that enhance the program.

Through fall camp I have noticed an unselfish attitude amongst the coaches and all coaches have been willing to take on any role that will benefit our program. We are holding our young men more accountable and the bar has been set higher than in the past.

We are extremely fortunate to have such a wonderful group of men leading our players. In addition, I am thankful for the support from their families. Coaching college football is not a 9-5 job. As of today, we have gone 18 straight days, working at least 15 hours per day. With that schedule, it puts a lot of stress on wives, significant others and families. I cannot thank each of these gentlemen enough for the long hours, personal sacrifices, and hard work that they put into our program every day.

DEFENSIVE COACHING STAFF

CRAIG STERN- DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR`



Coach Stern and I grew up together in the small town of Cosmos, MN. We were 2 of the 18 students in our graduating class. While I was the head coach at CSP during 1999-2003, Craig was the Defensive Coordinator. Together, we grew the program to its first NCAA conference championship. He has extensive experience coordinating defenses (20 years) which makes him one of the top DII coordinators in the NSIC.

This will be Coach Stern's third year leading the Golden Bear defense. Under his watch, the defense has improved immensely. Comparing statistics from 2017 to 2018 in key defensive categories, the defense went from 146th in the country to 80th in 2018. The

rush defense went from 155th to 45th, and defensive sacks moved from 76th to 11th. The 4th down defense also vastly improved from 105th to 6th nationally. We also

return 9 starters to the defense.

Loyalty on a college coaching staff is critical, and Coach Stern defines loyalty. When asked about what he enjoys outside of football, Coach Stern sarcastically laughs. He knows and has experienced the intense time commitment. He appreciates spending time with his family and recreation on or near the water.

CSP FOOTBALL ALUMNI-WHERE IS HE NOW?


SHAWN FONDOW (1996-1999)
