THIS WEEK: BEARS LOOK TO SPOIL UMARY HOMECOMING
 After falling 35-28 in its homecoming game at Sea Foam Stadium last week to Northern State, the Concordia-St. Paul football team (2-4 NSIC, 2-2 South) looks to spoil the University of Mary's (0-6 NSIC, 0-4 North) homecoming this Saturday at 2 p.m. at the Community Bowl in Bismarck.

Each team is attempting to put a losing streak in the past: for CSP it's a 13-game road losing streak dating back to a week 2 win at Minnesota Crookston in 2016 as CSP started head coach Shannon Currier's second stint leading the program with a 2-0 record that year. For UMary, it's a 15-game losing streak against the NSIC South Division dating back to a week 3 win in the 2014 season against Concordia-St. Paul. The Marauders have also lost 10-straight games overall, last beating Minnesota Crookston in week 7 last season.

LISTEN TO SHANNON CURRIER'S COACHES SHOW

New this year, the **Coach Shannon Currier Show** debuted on 1440 AM KYCR radio in the Twin Cities following the prep football game of the week. The show is hosted by **Wally Langfellow** of Minnesota Score, and will be a weekly airing following the prep football game of the week, typically in the 9 p.m. to 10 p.m. hour. This week's show is the fourth episode and features player guest interviews with junior offensive lineman **Rich Kelly** and sophomore linebacker **Andy Aune**.

For fans who miss the show or are outside of the radio station's Twin Cities reach, the entire show will also be accessible via the CSP Bears Podcast, available in Spotify, iTunes, Google Play Music, Stitcher and TuneIn Radio. It will be available either late Friday night after the initial airing or on Saturday morning.

For the second time this year, the CSP Bears Podcast featured a Concordia football player, with this week's guest senior kicker **Jonas Schenderlein**. The German native talked about his upbringing, first experiences with American football and what it's like being scouted by multiple NFL franchises. The first-ever episode featured senior transfer quarterback **Dom McKinzy**.

2018 TEAM CAPTAINS

Concordia head coach **Shannon Currier** has announced plans to have rotating team captains each week throughout the fall

season, starting back in the first week of fall training camp. Captains are selected by the coaching staff based on performance on the field and as a leader in practice, meetings and in general day-to-day activities.

On offense, senior tight end **John Damrow** is joined by four-time game captain junior offensive lineman **Rich Kelly** while junior defensive lineman **Kelly Pierce** repeats as defensive game captain and is joined by sophomore defensive end **Chris Garrett**.

SERIES HISTORY: UMARY 4, CONCORDIA 3

The Golden Bears look to even the series entering the eighth meeting between the programs, with the Marauders winning three of the last four but CSP coming off a 17-0 shutout win in the most recent game at Sea Foam Stadium in 2016. Although Concordia has won in Bismarck, North Dakota in a decade, last winning 17-7 at the Community Bowl in 2008, they've only made one trip to North Dakota's capital city since, falling 20-13 in the 2014 season. CSP holds a 2-1 road record against UMary, also winning the first meeting between the teams, 22-19 in 2006. The teams played four years in a row when the series began in 2006 to 2009 but now play every other year in the NSIC North-South Division format.

In head coach **Shannon Currier's** tenure (2000-03 & 2016-present), he holds a 1-0 record with the only meeting being the 2016 shutout at Sea Foam Stadium (17-0).

LAST MEETING, 2016: CONCORDIA 17, UMARY 0

The last time CSP and UMary met, the Golden Bears claimed a 17-0 victory. That game took place on September 3rd, 2016 at Sea Foam Stadium, and opened the season for both teams.

In Shannon Currier's first game back as the head coach of the Golden Bears, CSP claimed their first shutout since 2013, limiting the Marauders to just 208 yards of total offense. The secondary was especially stout in that contest, holding UMary to just 63 passing yards.

CSP racked up rushing yards to move the ball, gaining 222 yards on the ground in the win. They were led by 113 yards on 13 carries from senior running back **Darius Chapes**.

NOTES ABOUT THE MARAUDERS

UMary enters the matchup with an 0-6 record in the first year under former Marauder quarterback **Craig Bagnell** as head coach.

The Marauders enter Saturday's affair with a 15 game losing streak against the NSIC South Division and hold a 7-19 record against the South Division since the NSIC began divisional play in 2012, but holds a 2-1 record against CSP during that same time period.

After losing by one point in the opener to St. Cloud State, the Marauders have dropped each of their matchups since then by at least 13 points.

UMary has faced an average score of 42.6 to 16.6 per game, both marks rank 15th in the NSIC.

The Marauders are averaging 88.7 yards per game rushing, 2.7 yards per rush, and have scored seven rushing TDs. Their opponents have been more successful on the ground, rushing for 228.3 yards, 4.9 per carry, and have scored 16 rushing TDs.

The leading rusher for UMary is **Bryan Lumsden**. The freshman has averaged 31.8 yards per game and 3.8 yards per rush. Tight end **Colton Farmer** is the second leading rusher (22.2/game & 4.9/carry).

The Marauders have used their passing attack more frequently in 2018. Freshman QB **Jason Hoekstra** has averaged 28.8 passing attempts a game, completing 53.5% of his passes. Hoekstra has thrown for 157.8 yards per game, with five TDs and 10 INTs.

The go-to receiver for UMary has been **Luke Little**. The sophomore has 23 catches on the season for an average of 72.4 yards per game. **DeShawn Gay** has caught the most TDs for the Marauders (3), also averages the second most yards per game (29.3).

The Marauders have allowed 252 yards per game through the air, last in the NSIC. They have also given up 20 passing TDs, the second most in the conference.

Junior LB **Grady Blewett** leads the team with 44 tackles, including 5.0 TFL. Fellow LB **Maxwell Askew** leads the team with 6.0 TFL and has also recorded an INT and FF.

UMary has struggled on 3rd downs on both sides, converting 28.9% on offense, while allowing 48.7% on defense.

UMary is just 1-1 on FG on the season and have a net average of 35.2 yards on kickoffs, with nine touchbacks.

Junior transfer **Ron Johnson** also made his debut at QB in the contest, passing 11-20 for 116 yards. Johnson also rushed for 50 yards and a touchdown in the Saturday night contest.

LB **Antonio Zepeda** racked up 14 tackles to lead the Golden Bears on the defensive side of the ball, and CSP generated pressure all night with nine tackles for loss in the win. DL **Kelly Pierce** led the way with 2.0 TFLs, both sacks. LB **Billy Brown** also had eight tackles, including 1.5 for loss.

Concordia put points on the board in their first drive, as Jonas Schenderlein knocked home a 43-yard field goal to put CSP up 3-0.

The score would remain the same until the fourth, as a 10-play, 80-yard drive by the Golden Bears resulted in a one-yard TD run by Chapes. After UMary turned the ball over on downs near midfield, CSP was able to find the end zone once again, this time on a two-yard TD run by Johnson.

Senior defensive lineman **Re'Shon Howard** sealed the game with an interception in the final minute, putting an exclamation on CSP's first win of the season.

CSP held the Marauders to 3-14 on third down and 1-3 on fourth down. The Golden Bears out-gained UMary 338 to 208 for Currier's first win in his second stint with the program.

LAST WEEK: NORTHERN STATE 35, CONCORDIA 28

The Golden Bears squared off against Northern State last week-end for homecoming at Sea Foam Stadium, dropping the game 35-28 to the Wolves.

It was a tale of turnovers for CSP, as the Golden Bears out-gained NSU 494-352 in total offense, but lost the turnover margin 6-0.

Northern State got the on the board first in what turned out to be a back-and-forth contest until the final horn. The Wolves scored on an 82-yard interception return as **Alex Gray** picked off a **Dom McKinzy** pass and took it all the way back for a TD.

CSP tied the score at seven with a one-yard TD run by **Jeremiah Pierce-Johnson**. The Wolves took the lead back on a 44-yard TD pass from **Hunter Trautman** to **Dakota Larson**. Larson, a freshman WR, led NSU with seven catches for 141 yards.

The Golden Bears knotted the score up once again with a QB sneak, as the quarterback McKinzy rumbled into the end zone from a yard out. Trautman found Larson once again for the Wolves to give them the lead, as the two connected on 35-yard touchdown pass to take a 21-14 edge into halftime.

On the offensive side of the ball for the Golden Bears, playmakers **Lajuan Preston** and **MJ Williams** stood out. The sophomore RB Preston racked up 141 yards on the ground on 21 carries. The junior Williams led the Golden Bears in receiving with seven catches for 115 yards, including a pair of spectacular grabs in the second half.

Concordia started with the ball to begin the second half, marching 75 yards down the field on 14 plays, culminating in a nine-yard TD pass from McKinzy to **Keyon Walters**. NSU broke the 21-21 tie with a 27-yard TD pass from Trautman to RB **Chaka Kelly**.

The Bears once again answered with a scoring drive to bring the score to 28-28. This drive took just two plays, as McKinzy connected on a 44-yard pass to Williams and scored on a 36-yard TD rush by RB **Emanuel Jones**.

Turnovers spoiled the remainder for the fourth quarter for the Bears, as they managed to stop the Wolves on a fourth down play, but gave the ball right back with McKinzy's fourth interception of the game.

After NSU scored on a six-yard Trautman TD pass with six minutes to go, the Golden Bears had an empty possession before stopping Northern State again and forcing them to punt. A muffed punt by the Golden Bears sealed the game, as Northern State took over with 1:35 to play and kneeled the final two plays.

The QBs had big days, as McKinzy went 19-31 for 262 yards (CSP career-high) and touchdown while Trautman went 16-27 with 235 yards and four scores.

On the defensive side of the ball, sophomore DL **Chris Garrett** made an impact with seven tackles, 2.5 for loss and 2.5 sacks for the Golden Bears. **Andy Aune** and **Dez Bassett** led in tackles with eight a piece.

The Golden Bears out-gained Northern State 232-100 in rushing

yards and converted 27 first down to NSU's 17. Even with the six turnovers, CSP held the time of possession edge in the game as well, 34 to 26 minutes.

FROM THE "GRIFF MYTH" TO "HOME SWEET FOAM"

Prior to head coach **Shannon Currier** returning to lead the Golden Bears, CSP had posted an 11-24 record at Sea Foam Stadium and had never posted more than two home wins in a row with just two winning seasons since football returned to campus in 2009.

In his first two seasons, Currier and the Golden Bears won just three home games (3-8), but the 2017 team won its home opener and home finale, starting the season on a high note and then finishing strong.

The 37-20 win in the 2017 finale over SMSU started a three game home winning streak for the first time in Sea Foam Stadium's history and the first three game home winning streak since the 2005 NSIC Championship season, played down the street at St. Paul Central High School's Griffin Stadium with the streak coming to a close in week six of 2018 with a 35-28 loss to Northern State.

In Currier's first term leading the Bears, he posted an 18-2 home record at Griffin Stadium, starting the "Griff Myth," a 19-game home winning streak that began in 2002 and spanned four full seasons of perfect home football (2002, 2003, 2004, 2005).

Currier now holds a 23-11 career record in home games at Concordia and has the Bears off to a 2-1 start to the 2018 home slate.

HOME OPENER SUCCESS

Concordia head coach **Shannon Currier** has improved to 7-0 in his CSP career in home openers including 3-0 at Sea Foam Stadium in his second stint. Across the seven home opener wins between Sea Foam and Griffin Stadium, Currier's Bears have average a 29.4 to 8.3 margin of victory, a total of 206 to 58.

TURNOVERS MATTER

Just a year ago, Concordia was plagued by the turnover margin on both sides, creating just over one per game on defense (with just three INTs) while committing nearly two giveaways per outing. CSP only won the turnover margin twice and had a negative in the take/give six times. The result led to Concordia being outscored 47-22 off turnovers.

But a program that had four defensive coordinators in four years from 2014 to 2017 is thriving in its second year under **Craig Stern's** direction. The squad has already forced 10 turnovers in six games this year and its six interceptions are double last season's total output. Additionally, the defense forced at least two turnovers in each of the first four games to start the 2018 campaign.

In those first four weeks, CSP held a 28-0 scoring advantage behind a +5 in the take/give (9-to-4).

But in the past two weeks, things have flipped as the squad has dropped back-to-back games for the first time this year, combining for a -8 (1-to-9) in losses at #8 UMD and at home to Northern State. In doing so, CSP has been outscored 37-0 off turnovers, punctuated by the 28-0 off six turnovers to NSU in week six.

TOUGH ROAD SLATE IN 2018

The Golden Bears have had among the strongest road schedules to start the 2018 season. The week five 32-3 loss at #8 Minnesota Duluth marked the third-straight nationally-ranked opponent to start the 2018 season. Concordia opened the year with a heart-breaking 27-24 loss at #20 Sioux Falls despite leading 24-20 after a field goal extended the lead with 32 seconds left. The Cougars started on their own 40 with 26 seconds to play and scored in four plays, completing three straight passes and scoring with three seconds to play. Concordia then fell 46-13 at #2 Minnesota State in week three, taking a 14-6 deficit into the second quarter despite being even in first downs (6-6) and trailing by just five yards of total offense (139-134) at the quarter break. Minnesota State then converted a 3rd-and-17 with a 27-yard touchdown pass early in the second quarter. The back-breaking score not only put MSU ahead 21-6 in the second quarter in Mankato, it was the start of a 32-0 quarter for MSU that included a pair of safeties on back-to-back defensive plays for MSU.

CSP's last win over a nationally-ranked team was a 27-24 win vs #24 Wayne State in 2011 at Sea Foam Stadium and the last win over a nationally-ranked team on the road was a 28-26 win at #11 Minnesota State in CSP's 2010 Mineral Water Bowl campaign. CSP has now lost 17 straight games to ranked teams, but the 2018 schedule does not feature another ranked opponent in the AFCA Coaches Poll.

The team's 0-3 road record, albeit against all nationally-ranked opponents, is part of a 13-game road losing streak dating back to September 10, 2016 in a 41-18 win at Minnesota Crookston in week two to get the team off to a 2-0 start to head coach **Shannon Currier's** second stint leading the program.

CSP TOPS QUALITY OPPONENTS

Although Concordia has dropped three games at nationally-ranked opponents, it has enjoyed a 63-14 scoring margin in home victories over Upper Iowa (34-7) and Wayne State (29-7).

The wins were quality decisions, not just for scoring margin, but the 2017 Golden Bears were 2-9 NSIC, 1-6 South, with Upper Iowa and Wayne State both posting 6-5 overall seasons in 2017, the Wildcats 4-3 in the division and Peacocks a 3-4 division squad.

Entering 2018, Concordia was tabbed 14th in the NSIC Preseason Coaches Poll, with Wayne State picked ninth and Upper Iowa 11th overall. In the NSIC South, CSP was picked seventh, behind Wayne State (5th) and Upper Iowa (6th).

Through six weeks, Concordia has faced the #1, #3 and #4 teams in

the 16-team NSIC according to the preseason poll and Concordia's schedule overall ranks as #39 in the country (17-13).

SOUTH DIVISION TURNAROUND

With Concordia's 37-20 win in the 2017 season finale over SMSU, the Golden Bears snapped a 20-game losing streak in the NSIC South Division. After ending 2014 on a four game winning streak - all South Division wins - to end the year 4-3 in the NSIC South, the Golden Bears went winless in the division in 2015 and 2016 before the 2017 victory over the Mustangs.

The Golden Bears have now won three of their last five NSIC South contests, with all three wins coming at Sea Foam Stadium.

INSIDE THE NUMBERS: WEEK 2 GROUND DOMINATION

Just how significant was Concordia's ground game dominance in its week two 34-7 home opener win over Upper Iowa? It carries historical significance as the program continues to rise.

The Golden Bears rushed for 271 yards on 46 carries while holding Upper Iowa to just 17 yards on 24 attempts. The 254 yard margin on the ground was the biggest disparity since the 2005 NSIC Championship season, achieved twice that year, a 346 yard margin (459-113) in a 73-13 win over Minnesota Crookston in week seven and a 306 yard margin (337-31) in a 46-20 win over Wayne State in week nine.

It's the first time Concordia rushed for over 200 and held an opponent under 100 yards since a 2014 week two 28-21 loss to

HEAD COACH SHANNON CURRIER | 7TH SEASON



Originally the eighth head coach of Concordia football in 2000, Shannon Currier returned to lead the program for his second stint in December, 2015.

He's second in program history in both total victories and career winning percentage.

In his first stint, he compiled a 32-12 (.727) record and brought the program its first NSIC Championship in 2003 when he was named NSIC Coach of the Year. The conference title also brought a berth in the Mineral Water Bowl, the first postseason game in school history.

He coached Concordia to four consecutive winning seasons and is the only coach in program history to achieve the feat - consecutive or cumulative.

THE GRIFF MYTH - PROTECTING HOME TURF

The team also established the longest home winning streak in school history under his guidance. Known to teams of the era as the "Griff Myth," Concordia tallied 19 consecutive home victories down the street at Griffin Stadium. The streak began in 2002 and stretched two years after Currier left through the 2005 season, finally falling at the beginning of 2006.

In Currier's first four years, his teams only lost two home games, producing a record of 18-2 after winning his first and last nine home games.

He opened his return to the program with a 17-0 shutout win over U-Mary in 2016, snapping a 6-game home losing streak and a former school record 8-game overall losing streak.

CAREER AT TRUMAN

Following the program's 2003 NSIC Championship run, Currier accepted the head coach position at Truman (State) University where he turned a losing program into a pair of 6-5 winning campaigns in his third and fourth seasons.

His tenure was highlighted in his third year, leading the Bulldogs to a 6-3 record in a strong MIAA, finishing fourth in the league. He left the program following a 4-7 season in 2008 with a 20-35 overall record.

PRIOR TO REJOINING CONCORDIA'S SIDELINES

Following his departure from Truman, Currier spent seven years working outside of the coaching profession as a senior sales manager with iHigh.com working to build a digital platform for high school sports, reaching up to 1.5 million Minnesotans in his final year with the company.

NSIC BACKGROUND & ST. PAUL PRIVATE EDUCATION

He arrived at Concordia in 1999 as offensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator for former head coach and athletics director Dan O'Brien, now an assistant coach for the University of Minnesota.

Prior to joining Concordia, Currier spent two years each in similar roles at Southwest Minnesota State and Minnesota Crookston following his start in college coaching at Bemidji State as an offensive graduate assistant where earned his master's degree in physical education.

A native of Cosmos, Minnesota, Currier was a quarterback at Hamline University where he graduated with a degree in physical education in 1993.

Northern State when the Bears rushed 45 times for 223 yards and held the Wolves to 76 yards on 33 carries.

The 271 yards is the most CSP has achieved since a 2014 week 10 win over Augustana (47-328) and the fewest rushing yards allowed since a 2012 season opening 32-26 loss to UMary when the Marauders rushed for one yard on 29 attempts. It's just the third time since week three of 2015 that CSP has held an opponent under 100 rushing yards, the previous two both coming against Minot State, holding the Beavers to 64 yards each in 2015 week three and 2017 week one. The last time CSP has held an NSIC South Division opponent under 100 yards rushing was a 37-34 overtime win over Upper Iowa in week eight of 2014 when the Peacocks rushed 27 times for 33 yards.

The Golden Bears reached the 200 yard mark again in a week four home win over Wayne State, their third straight 200-yard rushing performance at home - all victories - including the 252 yard effort in the 2017 finale win over SMSU.

MEET THE STARTING QUARTERBACK: DOM MCKINZY

Senior graduate transfer **Dom McKinzy** (full name Dimonic Roden-McKinzy) outlasted incumbent junior **Maxon Hutton** (7 starts in 2017) and junior Alabama A&M transfer **Jared Olsgaard** in a solid three way competition in fall camp.

Just past the halfway point, McKinzy has passed for 1,063 yards on the season and is coming off a season-high 262 yards in week six against Northern State, matching his season-high with 19 completions (19-31), also going 19-32 against #20 Sioux Falls in week one (236 yds, 3 TDs).

McKinzy, a Kansas City, Kansas native, started his career at the University of Minnesota where he redshirted before transferring to Hutchinson Community College (Kan.). From there, he went to Northeastern State (Okla.) in the MIAA where he was an All-MIAA honorable mention quarterback. In parts of two seasons, McKinzy passed for over 3,600 yards in 15 games with four 300-yard performances. In two meetings against Pittsburg State, McKinzy passed for 311 yards and two touchdowns and no interceptions in 2016 and 323 yards and three touchdowns and no interceptions in 2017.

Hutton topped 1,000 yards and had six touchdowns in 2017, adding 234 rushing and another score while playing in and starting seven games before his season ended in week nine with an injury. He has seen action under center in each of the last three games and is now 6-of-13 for 62 yards passing and has 13 rushing attempts for 22 yards with a long of 17.

Olsgaard earned his way to the Division I ranks by putting together an NJCAA All-Region XIII season at Minnesota State CTC (Fergus Falls), earning MCAC Player of the Year honors with 2,463 yards in eight games (307.9/game) with 24 touchdowns.

FLORIDA NATIVES LEAD THE BACKFIELD

Sophomore running back **Lajuan Preston** has been thriving with increased workload out of the CSP backfield, producing back-to-back 100-yard efforts in his first career games as the go-to running back in the offense. The Fort Myers, Florida native, along with junior **Darnell Rolle** (Miami) and sophomore **Shaq Johnson** (St. Petersburg) have provided the Golden Bears with a steady presence from the Sunshine State the past two years, with redshirt freshman transfer from Akron **Jeremiah Johnson** (Pierce-Johnson) also coming from Miami joining the squad this year.

Rolle led the 2017 team with 627 yards at 4.9 per carry along with 75 receiving yards and three total touchdowns but has missed all six games due to injury in 2018. Johnson earned the starting running back spot entering the 2018 season and was off to a big start with 367 yards rushing and 49 receiving with five total touchdowns in just four games before being lost for the season due to injury.

Last year, Johnson and Preston served as complimentary backs to Rolle and combined for 373 yards with a 4.8 average with Johnson breaking loose for a 17 carry, 175 yard and two TD outburst in the season finale against SMSU, also throwing a 63-yard TD pass.

Preston is known for his breakaway speed as evidenced by his 73-yard touchdown in week two against Upper Iowa this year, his first career score. But as the team's feature back the last two weeks with Rolle and Johnson sidelined, Preston has also been a steady source of positive yardage as he has not been tackled for a loss by UMD or Northern State while producing back-to-back 100 yard rushing performances (13-111 at UMD & 21-141 vs NSU).

The back-to-back 100 yard rushing games is the first time since **Tre Sparks** achieved the feat in the 2014 season when he had three straight to end the season (247, 206, 131) to win the program's only league rushing title (1,254) since joining the Northern Sun in 1999 on a team that finished 5-6 overall and 4-3 in the South Division with a four game winning streak to end the season.

Preston is now climbing the league leaderboards, ranking 10th in total rushing yards (388) and fourth in yards per carry (7.2).

He's joined in the backfield by senior Northwest Missouri State transfer **Emanuel Jones** who had a breakout game against Northern State with 10 carries for 74 yards and a 36-yard touchdown run, junior Wyoming transfer **Garrett Gardner** ("Goo") with 15 carries for 58 yards and Pierce-Johnson from Akron who scored his first CSP touchdown against NSU and has six carries for 10 yards. Further, the deep backfield is bolstered by fullback **Andre Eubanks**, a junior transfer from Mississippi Valley State and although he hasn't received a carry he has been a strong blocking back.

HASKINS OFF TO STRONG START AT THE CORNER

After starting his college football career with an interception in five straight games, redshirt freshman cornerback **Marcus Haskins** had the streak come to a close in week six against Northern State. But the rookie corner still broke up two passes and continues to lead the country with 18 passes defended (5 INT, 13 PBU) and leads the league across the three categories while ranking second in the country in interceptions. He is also fifth on the team with 27 total tackles and tied for the team lead with 21 solo tackles.

In week two, Haskins produced an NCAA DII single-game season high of seven passes defended with six breakups and an INT, a mark that is still tied for the national lead through six weeks.

His week four performance in CSP's 29-7 win over WSC featured a pair of turnovers, forcing a fumble and picking off his fourth interception while tying for the team-high of four tackles (three solo) and breaking up a pair of passes. It was his coverage on the league-leading wide receiver **Nate Rogers**, who averaged 129.3 yards per game, that stole the show, though, holding him to 40 yards on 5 catches.

Opposite Haskins at the other corner, junior **Dion Wallisch** returned to the starting lineup in week six after playing sparingly in week five. He missed three games (2-to-4) due to injury. Wallisch made five tackles (four solo) in the season opener at #20 Sioux Falls and made three solo tackles with his first pass breakup in week six against Northern State.

Wallisch is coming off an All-NSIC South honorable mention season when he had 13 pass breakups, two interceptions, two forced fumbles and a recovery while ranking third on the team with 58 tackles in 2017. He also consistently held opposing top receivers to slow statistical performances.

Wallisch is a transfer from Minnesota Crookston where he was

fourth on the team with 56 tackles including 4.5 for loss as a redshirt freshman in 2015. He missed the 2016 season at UMC due to medical reasons and joined CSP the following spring semester.

In Wallisch's absence, sophomores **Lorenzo Kendrick** and **Desmond Hudnall** shared starts and assignments. Kendrick has 13 tackles and two pass breakups while Hudnall has four tackles and a pass breakup.

SCHENDERLEIN NABS MITCHELL AWARD PRESEASON HONOR

The Golden Bears return one of the top kickers in the country in **Jonas Schenderlein** who was named to the Fred Mitchell Award Preseason Kickoff Watch List after being a national finalist for the honor last year.

to put CSP ahead 21-20 with under eight minutes to play. He also had a long of 38 in the game.

In six games, Gustaveson leads the team with a 20.3 per catch average (5th NSIC) and is second on the team in catches (17) and yards (341) with two TDs.

In his three seasons, he's amassed 1,561 yards on 101 catches with 16 touchdowns.

Last year, he led the Golden Bears in receptions (43), yards (656), yards per catch (15.3) and touchdowns (9) and increased his production in all four areas as a sophomore.

WILLIAMS MAKING AN IMPACT

Junior college transfer **MJ Williams** has been tough to stop since going without a reception in the season opener at #20 Sioux Falls, producing at least four catches and 58 yards in each of the five games since.

He broke out for his first career 100-yard game in week six against Northern State with season-highs of 7-115.

He now leads the team with 28 catches (10th NSIC) for 406 yards (8th NSIC) and is tied for the team lead with three TD catches.

Prior to Concordia, Williams was a 2016 All-California Community College Athletic Association (CCCCAA) and All-Golden Coast Conference performer, leading the league with 960 yards while ranking second in catches (56) and TDs (11).

OFFENSIVE LINE GROWS IN STRENGTH, CONTINUITY

When head coach **Shannon Currier** was hired in December, 2015 he inherited four returning offensive linemen. Over the previous two seasons, the Golden Bears provided the young offensive line a chance to compete and play early in their careers, gaining valuable experience despite the tough physical challenge.

Now the team features more depth, experience, strength & physicality and most importantly, more continuity. The depth has allowed the team to be flexible up front and outlast injuries so far in 2018.

Three starters returned up front on opening day: senior left tackle **Terrell Taylor**, junior left guard **Rich Kelly** and junior right guard **Ethan Aune**. They were joined by redshirt freshman center **Matthew Montgomery** and sophomore right tackle **Cris Wasylciw**. The team has also started redshirt freshman **Tyson Kauffman** at right guard and senior **Samuel Kessler** at center this year. Sophomore Tanner Haechten has also started the last two weeks after missing the first four due to injury.

Look for the Bears to employ six offensive linemen in various situations as the team has started six up front in half of the games this year.

RUSSELL WEARS #26 TO HONOR LATE FRIEND BILLY BROWN, JR.

Senior safety **Brandon Russell** changed jersey numbers from 23 to 26 to honor **Billy Brown, Jr.**, a linebacker who graduated from CSP in May. Billy passed away while working out in the Twin Cities in June. The two were close friends, and head coach **Shannon Currier** has opted to honor Brown by selecting a player who fits Billy's work ethic and commitment to the program to wear the number each season.

Russell has racked up 97 career tackles. As a sophomore in 2016, Russell had his top season with 48 tackles including 5.0 for loss.

NEWCOMERS IMPACTING SAFETY POSITION

Redshirt freshmen **Rhett Sheehan**, **Parker Powers** and **Dez Bassett** have all played significant roles in the secondary at the safety position.

Bassett, a Mankato native, made his first career start at #2 MSU in his hometown. He's had at least six tackles in four of CSP's six games and is coming off a new high of eight tackles in week six against Northern State.

Sheehan has started all six games at the free safety spot and is seventh on the team with 22 tackles, adding a pair of pass breakups and a half tackle for loss. He had a high of six tackles in week three at MSU and has had at least three tackles in five of the team's six games this year.

Powers made his first career interception on a play deep down the sideline in his debut in the season opener at #20 USF, a one-handed highlight reel catch. He had four solo tackles against Wayne State in week four, has a pair of pass breakups and eight of his nine tackles on the year have been solo stops.

GARRETT A FORCE UP FRONT ON DEFENSE

Sophomore **Chris Garrett** secured season-highs of 2.5 sacks and tackles for loss in week six against Northern State. Through six weeks, Garrett, who missed a game, is now ranked third in the NSIC with 1.0 sacks per game as he's reached the QB five times in five games played.

He leads CSP's defensive line with 24 tackles and 5.5 tackles for loss and adds four quarterback hurries.

As a freshman in 2017, Garrett was a menace in the seven games he suited up in with 9.0 TFL and 6.0 sacks with five forced fumbles, three pass breakups and five quarterback hurries while averaging over six tackles per game (44 total).

He earned NSIC Defensive Player of the Week honors late in the year at Augustana where he had 3 FF, 3 sacks and 3 TFL with nine total tackles - all career-highs.

In 12 career games, Garrett has 11.0 sacks, 14.5 TFL, six forced fumbles, nine quarterback hurries and 68 total tackles.



JUNIORS BRING MAJOR EXPERIENCE TO D-LINE

Joining Garrett up front are three juniors who have all been three year starters in the program: **Jackson Dobbs** on the other end with **Kelly Pierce** and **Dylan Wood** in the middle.

Providing depth as a breakout player is redshirt freshman **Shawn Aarhus** with 2.5 TFL, 1.0 sack, a pair of fumble recoveries and a forced fumble.

Six different linemen have recorded at least 1.0 sack and seven have at least 1.0 TFL.

Pierce ranks second on the team with 4.0 TFL and 3.0 sacks and is tied with Dobbs for the team lead with five quarterback hurries while Dobbs is third on the team with 3.0 TFL and 2.0 sacks.

In 23 career games, Dobbs has 95 tackles, 12.5 TFL, 6.5 sacks, 3 fumble recoveries and a pair of forced fumbles.

Wood has produced 2.0 TFL and 1.0 sacks among his 16 tackles on the year. He has played all 27 games over his career with 90 tackles and 14.5 tackles for loss with 9.5 sacks. He broke out in 2017 as a sophomore with 51 tackles, 8.5 tackles for loss and 5.0 sacks.

Pierce, meanwhile, played the first five games of the 2017 season before missing the rest of the year with an injury after playing all 11 games of 2016 as a freshman. In 22 career games, he's registered 75 tackles, 12.5 tackles for loss and 7.0 sacks.

CSP'S STARTING LB'S LEAD TEAM IN TACKLES

Through six weeks, redshirt freshman linebacker **Jake Portz** leads the team and is 31st in the NSIC with 36 tackles. The starting LBs, with sophomores **Andy Aune** (34) and **Blake Evans** (30) and joining Portz, are 1-2-4 on the team with 100 total tackles as a unit.

Portz is second on the team with 3.0 TFL while Aune and Evans each have 1.5 TFL. Aune picked up his first sack at CSP in week five at #8 UMD while Portz had his first career sack in his debut at #20 USF.

Evans finished his rookie season on a tear in 2017, leading the team and ranking seventh in the NSIC with 97 tackles while Portz spent the year gaining strength and experience in the program as a redshirt and Aune was a redshirt freshman at the University of South Dakota where he was one of 18 redshirt freshmen to see action for the Coyotes, competing in four games.

SHEPLEY OFF TO STRONG START AS PUNTER

It was quite the debut for sophomore **Jake Shepley** at the punter position in week one. He averaged 47.3 yards on six punts with three eclipsing the 50-yard mark including a long of 66 which was pinned at the four yard line as CSP went toe-to-toe with #20 Sioux Falls on the road.

The 47.3 yard average in the opener was the fourth-best single game average in CSP history.

He doubled-down on the performance by averaging 46.0 yards on four punts with a long of 52 and two inside the 20 against Upper Iowa in week two.

Through six weeks, Shepley ranks fifth in the league with a 39.5 average which puts him on pace for one of the top punting average seasons in school history and just shy of former All-NSIC punter **Sam Maedke's** school record pace set last year (41.3) which led the conference in 2017.

Shepley is also a wide receiver, seeing action in four games with two catches as a true freshman in 2017 and continuing to get looks on offense this year in the dual role.

KEYON WALTERS FACTORS INTO RETURN GAME

Sophomore **Keyon Walters** has quietly put together a strong start to the 2018 season and his 8.8 punt return average is ranked fifth in the Northern Sun.

He's also emerged as a consistent threat in the pass game, third on the team with 14 catches going for 113 yards. He is sixth on the team in all-purpose yards with 205.

Walters had his breakout game on offense in week six against Northern State with career-highs in catches (5) and yards (52) with his first career touchdown catch and new career long reception (24).
