THIS WEEK: CSP HITS THE ROAD FOR THE FIRST TIME

Concordia hits the road for the first time this season, taking on Upper Iowa for the Peacocks' home opener for a 6 p.m. Saturday night kickoff. CSP is coming off a 41-17 win over Sioux Falls on Thursday night while Upper Iowa was shutout in a 52-0 road loss to Augustana on Saturday.

The Golden Bears haven't won a road night game since a 17-14 win on September 14, 2013 at Bemidji State, looking to snap a nine game road night game losing streak. Since coach Shannon Currier has returned to the program in 2016, CSP is 0-3 in road night games, with all three decided by five points or less.

"COACH C" BECOMES CSP'S ALL-TIME WINS LEADER

Last year in his seventh year as head coach at Concordia, **Shannon Currier** became the school's all-time wins leader, winning his 41st game 16-10 at SMSU in week 10 on November 3, 2018, surpassing **Mark Mauer** (40-39), who coached the program for seven seasons from 2004-10.

Currier, now in his eighth season, carries a 42-36 career record, has a 25-12 home record and is 8-0 in home openers. He's been head coach across two different stints, 2000 to 2003 and 2016-present while also serving as head coach at Truman State for five seasons from 2004-08. *More on Coach Currier on page 3.*

It will typically be uploaded late Friday night (after the initial air time) or Saturday morning prior to the game.

community with local radio station WFNU (94.1 FM) starting a regular segment to air on Saturday mornings at 9:30 a.m. The first air time is set for September 21, but the station has started recording interviews for a podcast titled "Concordia-St. Paul Scoreboard" which is available on Spotify and Anchor. DOBBS HONORS FALLEN FRIEND WITH NUMBER CHANGE

Senior defensive end **Jackson Dobbs** changed jersey numbers from 98 to 26 to honor **Billy Brown, Jr.**, a linebacker who graduated from CSP in May, 2018. Billy passed away shortly after graduating while working out in the Twin Cities in June. The two were close friends, and head coach **Shannon Currier** has opted to honor Brown by selecting a player who fits Billy's work ethic and commitment to the program to wear the number each season.

Dobbs has racked up 129 career tackles, 20.5 TFL and 13.0 sacks in 29 games and is a sixth year senior.

NOTES ABOUT THE PEACOCKS

The Peacocks got off to a slow start to 2019, falling 52-0 at Augustana as the Vikings topped 400 yards (411) while keeping UIU under 200 (198). UIU allowed 294 through the air and 117 on the ground, while mustering 33 rushing yards and 165 passing.

The Vikings rolled up 24 first downs to Upper Iowa's 10, converting 8-of-12 on third down to UIU's 3-of-13 including a 1-of-6 fourth down rate.

The turning point came early, after Upper Iowa stopped Augustana to nine yards on its opening drive, the Peacocks fumbled the punt reception on their own 11-yard line, setting Augie up with a first and goal from the three, scoring on the next play.

Mitchel Siech led the Upper Iowa defense with nine tackles and 1.5 tackles for loss as the Peacocks had nine total tackles for loss in the defeat. **Laith Smith** and **Kyle Domin** each had 2.0 tackles for loss, as well.

Jake Schuman completed 13-of-26 for 165 yards but was intercepted twice and sacked three times, turning his 46 yards rushing yards gained into five net rushing yards.

Bralin Simon had the offensive highlight with a 63-yard reception while three others had at least three catches.

Jon Deprey led UIU with 26 rushing yards on three carries with a long of 20.

Upper Iowa was picked 11th overall and seventh in the south division in the NSIC Preseason Coaches Poll after finishing 3-8 overall and 1-6 in the south a year ago.

The Peacocks are two years removed from a stretch of play where UIU posted six wins in a season four times from 2013 to 2017.

Of Upper Iowa's eight losses last year, four came by seven points or less including three home losses.

The program brings back returning All-NSIC selections **Mitchel Siech** (LB) and **Alex Schneider** (OL) who were honorable mention selections last season.

SERIES HISTORY: CONCORDIA 9, UPPER IOWA 4

The Golden Bears hold a 9-4 all-time record heading into the 14th meeting between the programs dating back to Upper Iowa's entrance into the NSIC in 2006. Concordia is 2-3 in away games at Upper Iowa including three losses in a row in Fayette. CSP's last win at Upper Iowa was a 57-56 decision in overtime in 2009. Last year, CSP snapped a three game losing streak to Upper Iowa in the all-time series with a 34-7 in CSP's home opener at Sea Foam Stadium.

Head coach **Shannon Currier** holds a 1-2 record against Upper Iowa and is 0-1 on the road against the Peacocks. In Currier's first term in 2000-to-2003, Upper Iowa was not yet a Division II program or member of the NSIC.

LAST MEETING, 2018: CONCORDIA 34, UPPER IOWA 7

The Golden Bears rebounded from a stunning season opening loss in the final seconds at #20 Sioux Falls with a convincing 27-point win over Upper Iowa in the home opener.

The win was fueled by a 271-to-17 rushing yardage advantage but the team scored with multiple big plays in the first half to establish the lead: a 73-yard run by **Lajuan Preston** in the first quarter, a 17-yard blocked punt return by **Emanuel Jones** (block by **Grant Erickson**) and a 61-yard pass from **Dom McKinzy** to **MJ Williams** in a 17-point second quarter that also included a 43-yard field goal by **Jonas Schenderlein**.

The explosive first half led a 282-to-140 advantage in total offense including 157 passing yards with 100 coming in the second quarter.

CSP's 271 rushing yards included 28 attempts for 146 yards in the second half to grind out the clock for the win, fueling a 33:15 to 26:45 edge in time of possession in the contest.

Shaq Johnson led the ground effort with 22 carries for 110 yards and a pair of receptions for 26 yards including a 17-yard TD catch which set the record for most receiving TDs by a running back in the program's DII-era (1999-present).

Under center, McKinzy had 11 carries for 56 yards and a long of 32 while completing 12-of-21 for 184 yards and two TDs. He connected with Williams for six receptions and 93 yards with the TD while **Marcus Gustaveson** had two catches for 51 yards and a long of 36.

Concordia finished the game with 455 yards of total offense while holding UIU to 353. To get to 353, Upper Iowa passed for 336 yards but with CSP stifling the running game to 17 yards, it took the Peacocks 60 passing attempts to reach the 336 total.

Defensively, the CSP pass rush was a factor as **Chris Garrett** posted 1.5 sacks, three quarterback hurries and a forced fumble while **Jackson Dobbs** recovered the fumble and added 1.5 tackles for loss and a half sack from the opposite end.

CSP held UIU to 3-of-17 on third down and 0-for-3 on fourth.

LAST WEEK: CONCORDIA 41, SIOUX FALLS 17

As is customary, Concordia cruised to a 24-point home opening victory, improving head coach **Shannon Currier** to 8-0 in his CSP coaching career in home openers (4-0 at Sea Foam Stadium, 4-0 at Griffin Stadium 2000-03).

But the new wrinkle was the Golden Bears beating the Cougars, the first win against them since USF joined the NSIC in 2012 in the eighth meeting since, and snapping a 12-game losing streak to USF dating back to CSP winning the first meeting in 1971.

After falling behind early with USF scoring on the game's opening drive, junior **Dalton Smerchek** came up with a game-changing play to stop Sioux Falls' second scoring chance on its next possession, stripping quarterback **Caden Walters** at the one yard line with junior cornerback **Preston Piltoff** recovering for CSP.

Smerchek was a beast on defense, also recovering a fumble, making a second half goal line stand that prevented USF from trimming CSP's lead to one score, instead forcing a short field goal to preserve a 27-17 lead in the fourth quarter. He also had a pair of quarterback hurries, a pass breakup among his team leading nine tackles and 1.5 tackles for loss to earn NSIC Player of the Week honors.

The offense was steady early, putting together a pair of 68-yard drives that resulted in red zone field goals by **Danny Laudet** from 30 and 29 yards to bring CSP within a point, 7-6 early in the sec-

ond quarter. Laudet had 11 points in the game, also producing three kickoff touchbacks and a 37.4 average on five punts. His work helped CSP dominate the field position battle throughout.

Then the special teams became a force as freshman **Devin Flakes** blocked the first of two punts, the first midway through the second quarter which led to a **Maxon Hutton** to **Marcus Gustaveson** 20-yard touchdown two plays later.

Hutton again found the end zone through the air late in the quarter, a 33-yard touchdown to **MJ Williams** to cap a 90-yard scoring drive. The second quarter eruption continued and was appropriately capped by another blocked punt by Flakes, this time recovered by **Lorenzo Kendricks** for a touchdown.

Concordia's second quarter was a 24-0 edge and led to a 27-7 halftime lead.

Sioux Falls trimmed the lead to 27-17 in the third quarter, but Smerchek's goal line stand helped keep the Cougars from making it a 7-point game.

In the fourth, CSP added short rushing touchdowns by Hutton and **Lajuan Preston** to pull away.

While Concordia was out-gained 385-to-315 in total yards in the game, the major advantage was CSP's ability to dominate with field position. The Golden Bears had an average start at their own 43 while pinning USF back to their own 23, a 20-yard advantage across 13 possession for each side.

For Concordia, Lajuan Preston led the backfield with 13 carries for 80 yards and a touchdown with quarterback Hutton adding 67 yards on 14 attempts and a score. They each broke runs of 36 and 39 yards, respectively. Hutton completed 13-of-22 for 159 yards and two touchdowns through the air while administering a turnover-free offense.

Hutton connected with Williams five times for 61 yards and a TD, **Jabril Clewis** twice for 43 yards and a long of 37 and Gustaveson twice for 25 yards and a 20-yard score. The trio, all three seniors, combined for nine of Hutton's 13 completions for 129 of his 159 passing yards.

While Smerchek was busy making game-changing plays all over the field, the CSP defensive front rolled up five of the team's six total sacks led by **Chris Garrett** with 1.5. He, as well as **Richard Ficociello**, had five tackles and 1.5 tackles for loss with Ficociello adding a sack. Overall, the team had nine tackles for loss and had a pair of forced turnovers.

PRESEASON & RETURNING ALL-AMERICAN: CHRIS GARRETT

Junior defensive end **Chris Garrett** comes into 2019 as a D2Football.com Preseason All-America First Team selection. He got off to a strong start with 1.5 sacks and TFLs among his five total tackles in a 41-17 win over Sioux Falls.

He is coming off a year in which he was named All-America First Team by the AFCA and Associated Press, Second Team by D2C-CA and Third Team by Don Hansen's Football Gazette.

Last year, he led the country with 1.65 sacks per game and was fourth in the nation with 1.90 tackles for loss per game.

He set the school single season sacks record with 16.5 in just 10 games.

He finished his junior year on a torrid pace with 14.0 sacks, 16.0 tackles for loss and 36 total tackles in the last six games of the year.

In 18 career games, Garrett has amassed 102 tackles, 29.5 tackles for loss and 24.0 sacks.

FROM THE "GRIFF MYTH" TO "HOME SWEET FOAM"

Prior to head coach **Shannon Currier** returning to lead the Golden Bears, CSP had posted an 11-24 record at Sea Foam Stadium (2009 to 2015) and had never posted more than two home wins in a row with just two winning seasons since football returned to campus in 2009.

In Currier's first season back, the Bears won the 2016 home opener and did so again to start the 2017 season. Despite back-to-back two win campaigns with just three home wins, the Golden Bears ended 2017 on a high note with a win in the home finale over SMSU.

The 37-20 win in the 2017 finale over SMSU started a three game home winning streak into the first two games of 2018 for the first time in Sea Foam Stadium's history. It was also the first three game home winning streak since the 2005 NSIC Championship season, played down the street at St. Paul Central High School's Griffin Stadium.

In Currier's first term leading the Bears (2000-03), he posted an 18-2 home record at Griffin Stadium, starting the "Griff Myth," a 19-game home winning streak that began in 2002 and spanned four full seasons of perfect home football (2002, 2003, 2004, 2005).

Currier now holds a 25-12 career record in home games at Con-

HEAD COACH SHANNON CURRIER | 8TH SEASON



Originally the 8th head coach of CSP football in 2000, Shannon Currier returned to lead the program for his 2nd stint in December, 2015.

He became the program's all-time wins leader on November 3, 2018 with a 16-10 win at SMSU.

In his first stint, he compiled a 32-12 (.727) record and brought the program its first NSIC Championship in 2003 when he was named NSIC Coach of the Year. The conference title also brought a berth in the Mineral Water Bowl, the first post-season game in school history.

He coached Concordia to four consecutive winning seasons and is the only coach in program history to achieve the feat - consecutive or cumulative.

THE GRIFF MYTH - PROTECTING HOME TURF

The team also established the longest home winning streak in school history under his guidance. Known to teams of the era as the "Griff Myth," Concordia tallied 19 consecutive home victories down the street at Griffin Stadium. The streak began in 2002 and stretched two years after Currier left through the 2005 season, finally falling at the beginning of 2006.

In Currier's first four years, his teams only lost two home games, producing a record of 18-2 after winning his first and last nine home games.

He opened his return to the program with a 17-0 shutout win over U-Mary in 2016, snapping a 6-game home losing streak and a former school record 8-game overall losing streak. His CSP teams are 8-0 all-time in home openers and he holds a career 25-12 home mark at Concordia between Griffin & Sea Foam Stadium.

CAREER AT TRUMAN

Following the program's 2003 NSIC title run, Currier accepted the head coach position at Truman State where he turned a losing program into a pair of 6-5 winning campaigns in his 3rd and 4th seasons.

His tenure was highlighted in his third year, leading the Bulldogs to a 6-3 record in a strong MIAA, finishing fourth in the league. He left the program following a 4-7 season in 2008 with a 20-35 overall record.

PRIOR TO REJOINING CONCORDIA'S SIDELINES

Following his departure from Truman, Currier spent seven years working outside of the coaching profession as a senior sales manager with iHigh.com working to build a digital platform for high school sports, reaching up to 1.5 million Minnesotans in his final year with the company.

NSIC BACKGROUND & ST. PAUL PRIVATE EDUCATION

He arrived at Concordia in 1999 as offensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator for former head coach and athletics director Dan O'Brien, now an assistant coach for the University of Minnesota.

Prior to joining Concordia, Currier spent two years each in similar roles at Southwest Minnesota State and Minnesota Crookston following his start in college coaching at Bemidji State as an offensive graduate assistant where earned his master's degree in physical education.

A native of Cosmos, Minnesota, Currier was a quarterback at Hamline University where he graduated with a degree in physical education in 1993.

cordia, a perfect 8-0 mark in home openers, a 4-4 mark in home finales and led the team to a winning record at Sea Foam Stadium in 2018 for the third time since 2009.

HOME SWEET FOAM: HOW SWEET IS IT?

With a 3-2 home record in 2018, Concordia-St. Paul enjoyed a home field advantage a year ago. The run game topped 200 yards in four out of five home games and held opponents to 131 yards or less four times. Concordia averaged 5.1 yards per carry in home games while opponents mustered just 3.1 yards per rush.

Overall, CSP held a 403.2 to 364.2 average total offense margin and racked up 5.9 yards per play while limiting foes to 4.8 in 2018 home games.

The defense also racked up 6.8 TFL per game while the offensive line limited the damage to just 3.4 opponent TFLs per home contest. Further, the defense held a 17-to-11 margin in sacks leading to 104-to-57 difference in lost yardage. The defense also stifled opponents on fourth down to just 2-for-12 (16.7%).

HOME OPENER SUCCESS

Concordia head coach **Shannon Currier** has improved to 7-0 in his CSP career in home openers including 3-0 at Sea Foam Stadium in his second stint. Across the seven home opener wins between Sea Foam and Griffin Stadium, Currier's Bears have average a 29.4 to 8.3 margin of victory, a total of 206 to 58.

TOUGH HOME SLATE IN 2019

After playing a tough road schedule a year ago, the flipped opponents in the South Division lead to a rough home slate in 2019. Concordia's six home opponents combined for a 45-21 overall record in 2018, and only one of them (SMSU) had a losing season (4-7). The Golden Bears host, in order, Sioux Falls (7-4), Minnesota State (11-0), MSU Moorhead (8-3), Bemidji State (7-4), SMSU (4-7) and Winona State (8-3) in 2019.

CSP's last win over a nationally-ranked team was a 27-24 win vs #24 Wayne State in 2011 at Sea Foam Stadium and the last win over a nationally-ranked team on the road was a 28-26 win at #11 Minnesota State in CSP's 2010 Mineral Water Bowl campaign. CSP has now lost 17 straight games to ranked teams.

The Bears snapped a 13-game road losing streak in week seven in 2018 with a 17-7 win at UMary and a 12-game NSIC South road losing streak in week 10 at SMSU in 2018 for a second straight road win.

TURNOVERS MATTER

As CSP's program has grown under head coach **Shannon Currier**, the team's steady veteran offensive line has provided more protection for its quarterbacks, leading to more consistent ball control. Defensively, a talented and deep defensive line has helped create pressure in opposing backfields, leading to more forced fumbles and hurried passes leading to interceptions down field under third year defensive coordinator **Craig Stern**.

Since Currier has rejoined the program in 2016, Concordia has produced a 5-3 record when winning the turnover battle including three straight wins. A look at the 2019 game-by-game results:

DEVIN FLAKES BLOCK PARTY

Freshman defensive back **Devin Flakes** is off to an exceptional

start to his college career, blocking a pair of punts while seeing regular action on special teams in his debut as a true freshman. The blocked punts came in a 24-0 second quarter for CSP in a season-opening 41-17 win over Sioux Falls. The first, recovered by junior defensive back **Preston Piltoff**, set up a two play scoring drive while the second was recovered by junior defensive back **Lorenzo Kendricks** for a touchdown at the end of the quarter for a 27-7 halftime lead over the Cougars.

The special teams is led by third year special teams coordinator **Jake Munkwitz**, with the Golden Bears blocking 10 kicks and punts since 2017.

DEEP & EXPERIENCED ON THE LINE OF SCRIMMAGE

The 2019 Golden Bears' strength is up front, returning all but one combined starter between the offensive and defensive lines. While four year starting tackle Terrell Taylor graduated from the offensive line, the Golden Bears actually return five blockers with starting experience, along with all four starting defensive linemen. (*Games started listed below*)

On defense, the four starters: **Kelly Pierce** (28), **Jackson Dobbs** (26), **Dylan Wood** (21) and **Chris Garrett** (13) have played a majority of snaps together over the past three years.

On offense, **Rich Kelly** (31), **Ethan Aune** (21), **Tanner Haechten** (12), **Cris Wasylciw** (9) and **Matthew Montgomery** (3) have provided the Golden Bears with the muscle up front. Montgomery earned the starting center role in 2018 as a redshirt freshman before his season ended with injury early on, but is now in his third year in the program while Wasylciw was a transfer with prior experience.

SENIORS FLANK GARRETT ON D-LINE

While junior **Chris Garrett** garners the attention that comes with All-America and Preseason All-America honors, he's joined by three tenacious seniors who are accomplished in their own right: **Dylan Wood** and **Kelly Pierce** on the interior and Jackson Dobbs on the opposite end.

The statistical leader of the trio, Dobbs has compiled 129 career tackles, 20.5 tackles for loss and 13.0 sacks across 29 games.

In 28 games, Pierce has 98 tackles, 16.5 for loss and 9.5 sacks while Wood has played in the most games (34) with 103 tackles, 16.5 for loss and 11.5 sacks.

Dobbs is off to a strong start to 2019 with five tackles and a half sack and half TFL while Wood and Pierce each made two tackles.

The depth on the defensive line is notable with seniors **TJ Di-allo** and **Cole Marmor** and sophomores **Richard Ficociello** and **Shawn Aarhus**. Ficociello had a big season opener with five tackles, 1.5 TFL and a sack, Aarhus added a sack and Diallo packed a punch in the middle with three tackles.

The defensive line combined for five total sacks as the Golden Bears had six sacks in the contest.

SHAQ & LP LEAD A DEEP GROUND GAME

The running back group is led by sophomore Shaq Johnson and junior Lajuan Preston. Preston became an All-NSIC South Division honorable mention rusher a year ago when Johnson's season ended in week four against Wayne State.

Prior to the season ending injury for Johnson, he was on a torrid pace with over 100 combined rushing/receiving yards per game (367 rushing, 49 receiving) and five total touchdowns in four games. He had 22 carries for 110 yards and 2-26 receiving with a TD against Upper Iowa and two touchdowns in the season opener at Sioux Falls.

Preston picked up where Johnson left off, gashing Minnesota Duluth, Northern State and Minnesota Crookston for 100-plus rushing yards in a four game stretch including 21-141 against Northern. He finished the year averaging 6.5 per carry with 704 rushing yards.

In game one, Preston earned the workload with Johnson out due to team rules. In the role, Preston averaged 6.2 yards on 13 carries for 80 yards and a touchdown with a long of 36.

It was senior **Cole Kirchoff** who drew the start, though, producing 21 combined yards on eight touches with 6-12 rushing and 2-9 receiving. Kirchoff joined the football roster in 2019 after a four year run with the baseball team where he was a starting outfielder with three homers, three triples, 17 stolen bases and was third on the team with 20 RBIs.

Aiding the ground game is athletic quarterback **Maxon Hutton** with 14 for 67 and a touchdown against USF. In his career, Hutton

has 582 rushing yards and three touchdowns.

The backfield has three players with 100-yard rushing games: Preston (3), Johnson (2) and Hutton (1).

HUTTON UNDER CENTER

Senior quarterback **Maxon Hutton** has ascended to the starting quarterback role after starting multiple games each of the past two seasons. The dual-threat quarterback has compiled 2,227 yards of total offense and 15 total touchdowns in his career.

In the season opener, Hutton completed 13-of-22 (.591) for 159 yards and two touchdowns while adding 67 rushing yards on 14 carries and a touchdown. The senior also showed the poise necessary to lead a turnover-free offense.

Since Coach Currier has returned in 2016, the Golden Bears have produced a 5-3 record when winning the turnover battle. During that same time, CSP is 5-21 when losing or splitting turnovers.

Backing him is senior **Jared Olsgaard**, a transfer from Alabama A&M by way of Minnesota State Community & Technical College. In addition to being the backup QB, Olsgaard has the unique distinction of a dual-role as the top option at punt returner where he had an 11-yard return against Sioux Falls in the opener.

Depth at the position is provided by junior transfer **Johnny Saavedra** and redshirt freshmen **Darion Manning** and **Abe Schwartz**. Schwartz has earned a role on the roster as a special teams contributor, making two tackles in the opener.

THREE DEEP WITH SENIORS

Senior quarterback **Maxon Hutton** has three senior wide receiver targets with complimentary skillsets: fourth year starter **Marcus Gustaveson**, second year junior college transfer **MJ Williams** and graduate Division I transfer **Jabril Clewis**.

In week one, Hutton completed nine of his 13 passes to the trio for 129 of his 159 passing yards and all three had a catch for 20 or more yards and two of them had touchdowns.

Williams led the group with 5-61 with a 33 yard touchdown, Clewis was 2-43 with a long of 37 and Gustaveson was 2-25 with a 20-yard score.

GUSTAVESON CLIMBING THE RECEIVING CHARTS

Fourth year starting wide receiver **Marcus Gustaveson** has established himself as one of CSP's top receivers in recent years. He has four career 100-yard performances and is climbing the CSP career receiving charts.

He's tied for ninth in career touchdown catches (17), 10th in receptions (112) and 11th in receiving yards (1,681). He opened the year with two catches for 25 yards and a 20-yard TD in a 41-17 win over Sioux Falls.

BASSETT AT SAFETY & RETURN GAME

Sophomore safety **Dez Bassett** enters 2019 as the team's starting strong safety (rover) and primary kickoff returner. In the opener, he averaged 24.5 yards on a pair of kick returns with a long of 31 with junior **Lajuan Preston** adding a 23 yard return. Bassett has a career 21.4 average and long of 55 on 13 returns.

He had three tackles in the 2019 opener, and was second on the team a year ago with 65 tackles after breaking into the starting lineup in week three. his redshirt freshman year included seven pass breakups and a 77-yard interception return for touchdown in a win at UMary.

Joining Bassett at the safety position are fellow sophomores **Rhett Sheehan** and **Parker Powers** at free safety. Sheehan started all 11 games last year and the 2019 opener, making three tackles to give him 40 on his career. Powers has 27 career tackles, four pass breakups and an interception and also had three tackles in the opener.

SMERCHEK LEADS LINEBACKERS IN WEEK ONE

While sophomore **Jake Portz**, the mike linebacker, was the team leader with 77 tackles a year ago, it was junior WLB **Dalton Smerchek** who had the impact performance in week one to earn NSIC Player of the Week honors.

Smerchek made nine tackles, 1.5 for loss, forced a fumble at the goal line, recovered a muffed punt, had a pass breakup and pair of hurries. One of his tackles was a TFL at the goal line, forcing a field goal two plays later and one of his hurries came on fourth down in the second half.

Portz picked up where he left off a year ago when he started all 11 games and averaged seven tackles per contest. He had seven tackles once again against Sioux Falls.

The unit is flanked by SLB **Gabe Nkumu** who added three tackles. Nkumu rejoined the program after a year away when he played nine games as a freshman in 2017 with six tackles, 2.5 for loss, 1.5 sacks and a forced fumble.

CORNERS PRODUCE IN NEW ROLES

The Golden Bears have a pair of new starters at corner, junior transfer **Preston Piltoff** and junior **Lorenzo Kendricks** in his third year in the program. Kendricks was one of the team's co-captains in week one, making three tackles and falling on a blocked punt for a touchdown. He's played in 23 career games with 43 tackles and four pass breakups in his career.

Piltoff had four tackles (three solo) in his debut with CSP, also adding a fumble recovery at the goal line and securing a blocked punt in a busy first half.

The secondary helped hold Sioux Falls to under 50-percent (16-of-33) passing for 217 yards.

LAUDET ASSUMES KICKING AND PUNTING DUTIES

Replacing one of the top kickers in the country is not an easy task, but the Golden Bears turned to an internal option with Danny Laudet who is in his third year in the program and has familiarity with the graduated Schenderlein.

Further, Schenderlein has remained in the program as a graduate assistant, working with the kicking game.

Laudet has responded to the additional duties, converting 2-of-2 field goals (30, 29), all five PATs, three of eight kickoffs for touchbacks in the kicking department.

As a punter, Laudet continued to deliver on his reputation for high, long hang time punts that confound opponents. He averaged 37.4 yards on five punts, forced three fair

catches and pinned one inside the 20. One of his punts was muffed, and recovered by the Golden Bears, as well.

He carries a 37.9 career average on 25 punts with a long of 60.

TRENDING TOPICS: QB PERCENTAGE

A point of emphasis for the Golden Bears entering 2019 is a more efficient passing game. Even a slight improvement in completion percentage and a decrease in interceptions can lead to a significant boost in wins.

Since Currier has returned to the program in 2016, when the Golden Bears complete at least 54 percent of passes, the team is an above .500 squad with a 6-5 record including wins in three of the last four when doing so.

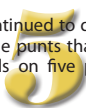

In the 34 games since head coach **Shannon Currier** has been back with the program since 2016, the CSP defense has produced 4-plus sacks 10 times and had more sacks than the opponent 14 times.

In the 4-plus sack games, Concordia has a 7-3 record and has won four of its last five games when sacking the quarterback four or more times including the 2019 season opener with six sacks.

When producing more sacks than the opponent which factors line play on both sides, Concordia is 8-6 but has won three of the last four including the 2019 opener when CSP had a 6-2 advantage in sacks against Sioux Falls.
