THIS WEEK: CLOSING OUT THE NSIC NORTH

This Saturday, Concordia plays its final game in the four game crossover against the NSIC North Division and looking to square its record against the North, entering 1-2 so far.

Each team has produced a 3-1 record against its own division, but the Beavers are 2-1 against the South while CSP is 1-2 against the North. A win for Concordia would match last season's win total with three games to go.

Since rejoining the university in 2016, head coach Shannon Currier is 6-9 against the North overall and 4-3 against the North at Sea Foam Stadium.

CSP LED BY "COACH C" - ALL-TIME WINS LEADER AT CSP

Last year in his seventh as head coach at Concordia, Shannon Currier became the school's all-time wins leader, winning his 41st game 16-10 at SMSU in week 10 on November 3, 2018, surpassing Mark Mauer (40-39), who coached the program for seven seasons from 2004-10.

Currier, now in his eighth season, carries a 45-39 career record, has a 26-13 home record and is 8-0 in home openers. He's

been head coach across two different stints, 2000 to 2003 and 2016-present while also serving as head coach at Truman State for five seasons from 2004-08. He was 2003 NSIC Coach of the Year, leading the program to its first NSIC Championship.

This week's guests include redshirt freshman Matthew Montgomery and sophomore linebacker Gabe Nkumu.

For fans who miss the show or are outside of the radio station's Twin Cities reach, the entire show is accessible via the CSP Bears Podcast, available in Spotify, Apple Podcasts, Stitcher and Google Play Music. It will typically be uploaded late Friday night (after the initial air time) or Saturday morning prior to the game.

NOTES ABOUT THE BEAVERS

The Beavers enter the weekend as one of the top teams in the NSIC North as they 5-2 record matches UMD for the top spot in the division. It's been a bit of a wild ride for BSU as they opened the year with three commanding victories before falling at home to UMD in week four. BSU followed it up with a pair of dramatic comeback wins before Winona State handed them their second loss of the season last week.

Bemidji State has had three different players make starts at QB this season as **Emmett Enright** has been the man at the helm over the past six games. Enright has thrown for 847 yards and four TDs while completing 51.4% of his passes. The changes at QB haven't slowed down junior WR **Malik Williams** totaled double-digit catches for the second straight game, including 10 receptions in the first half last week. From 2015-19, BSU had a stretch of 49 games without a double-digit receiver before Williams' back-to-back games with 11 catches. He is currently on pace to break the BSU single-season record for average receptions per game at 7.6, which leads the NSIC. Williams' 37 receptions rank third in the conference.

Sophomore RB **Jalen Frye** ranks second in the NSIC with 110.3 rushing yards per game. He has 1,282 career rushing yards in 16 career games, 426 rushing yards shy of 10th most in BSU history. Frye ranks 20th in NCAA Division II with 662 rushing yards this season.

Senior DL **Alex Hoffman** led the "Gang Green" defense with 12 tackles last week, which was a career high. He also added career highs with 4.0 TFL, 2.0 sacks and one FF. Hoffman ranks 12th in the league with 7.5 TFL this season. Sophomore DB **Gunnar Feldhege** leads the defense and ranks 16th in the NSIC with 47 total tackles.

BSU continues to lead the nation in red zone defense at 56 percent despite giving up four red zone scores to WSU. The Beavers also rank within the top 10 nationally in 3rd down conversion defense (4th; 25%) and passes intercepted (6th; 12). Bemidji State has been efficient protecting the QB with only five sacks allowed to lead the NSIC and rank 13th nationally. On the flip side, the BSU DL has attacked opposing signal-callers with 21 team sacks to rank 19th nationally.

DOBBS HONORS FALLEN FRIEND WITH NUMBER CHANGE

Senior defensive end **Jackson Dobbs** changed jersey numbers from 98 to 26 to honor **Billy Brown, Jr.**, a linebacker who graduated from CSP in May, 2018. Billy passed away shortly after graduating while working out in the Twin Cities in June. The two were close friends, and head coach **Shannon Currier** has opted to honor Brown by selecting a player who fits Billy's work ethic and commitment to the program to wear the number each season.

Last year, it was **Brandon Russell** who switched from 23 to 26 to honor his late friend.

Dobbs has racked up 155 career tackles, 27.0 TFL and 16.0 sacks in 35 games. As a sixth year senior, Dobbs has had a strong season in #26, posting 7.0 TFLs, 3.5 sacks and 31 total tackles.

SERIES HISTORY: BEMIDJI STATE 9, CONCORDIA 7

After falling 54-7 in the first meeting between the programs in CSP's first year of Division II football in 1999, head coach **Shannon Currier** led the Golden Bears to four straight wins over the Beavers from 2000-03 and CSP held a 5-2 series advantage through 2005.

The series flipped in BSU's favor after that as the Beavers have won seven of the past nine.

At home, Concordia is 5-2 in the all-time series between Griffin and Sea Foam Stadiums but just 1-2 at Sea Foam Stadium as the Beavers make their fourth trip to CSP's new digs since 2009.

Head coach **Shannon Currier** holds a 4-1 career record against BSU, going 4-0 between 2000 and 2003 before losing 54-17 in the last meeting between the teams in 2017 in Bemidji.

LAST MEETING, 2017: BEMIDJI STATE 54, CONCORDIA 17

Concordia was unable to overcome a 5-2 turnover margin as BSU forced three turnovers with CSP in the red zone, and Bemidji State added four plays of 56-plus yards to put CSP away.

Bemidji State built a 40-0 lead by halftime including long touchdowns of 76 (pass) and 68 (rush) yards and a 72-yard interception return for touchdown just before halftime.

Michael Washington led BSU with five carries for 138 yards and touchdown runs of 68 and 56 yards. BSU QB **Jordan Hein** completed 16-of-30 for 242 yards and four TDs, adding 5-30 rushing.

Concordia snapped the shutout in the third quarter when **Maxon Hutton** connected with **Gabe Steed** for a 19 yard TD. The score was a two play scoring drive following a muffed BSU punt recovered by the Golden Bears.

Elias Arlington added a 91-yard kickoff return for a touchdown in the third quarter, and **Jonas Schenderlein** drilled a 50-yard field goal in the fourth quarter. Arlington led the team with 154 all-purpose yards including 112 on kickoff returns and 42 more yards on three receptions.

Hutton completed 12-of-35 for 164 yards and **Trevor Tillet** added 7-of-15 passing for 62 yards. They connected with eight different receivers in the game.

Jake Tanner led the receiving corps with six catches for 44 yards while **DeCeon Schumann** had a team-high 55 receiving yards on two catches.

Darnell Rolle led the ground game with 11 carries for 37 yards while three others had between 15 and 20 yards.

On the defensive side, **Brian Szutkowski** and **Mitch Zillman** each had seven tackles to lead the team.

LAST WEEK: MINOT STATE 38, CONCORDIA 31

Just a week after an estimated two feet of snow fell in parts of north and western North Dakota, Minot State hosted Concordia

on a sunny, warm and windy fall afternoon. The wind didn't impact the offenses, as the teams combined for 961 yards of total offense and 69 points - the highest scoring game of CSP's season.

In the final tally, Minot State's 505 yards of total offense and 308 rushing yards carried the day, despite CSP quarterback **Maxon Hutton** producing career-highs in pass completions (22), attempts (39) and yards (257) while adding 45 more on the ground and two passing touchdowns.

Minot State QB **Ben Bolinske** couldn't be contained on the other side, rushing 10 times for 136 yards and three TDs while completing 14-of-18 for 197 yards and another TD.

For Concordia, senior **Jabril Clewis** was on the receiving end of both TDs from Hutton, his first two as a Golden Bear. He finished with six catches for 78 yards. Senior **MJ Williams** added team-highs of seven catches for 91 yards, as well.

On the ground, freshman **Darios Crawley-Reid** continues to shine in his first year, rushing eight times for 73 yards including a 24-yard TD run, his fifth overall touchdown of the season. Sophomore **Shaq Johnson** added 17-70 rushing and backup QB/starting WR **Jared Olsgaard** had an 11 yard TD run while adding 2-33 receiving.

Defensively, CSP's linebackers had a busy day led by sophomore **Gabe Nkumu** who produced the second-most tackles in team history with 19 while sophomore **Jake Portz** added 10. Junior linebacker **Dalton Smerchek** was third on the team with seven tackles giving the starting trio 36 combined total tackles.

PRESEASON & RETURNING ALL-AMERICAN: CHRIS GARRETT

Junior defensive end **Chris Garrett** comes into 2019 as a D2Football.com Preseason All-America First Team selection. He got off to a strong start with at least 1.5 TFL in the first four games and at least 1.0 sacks in the first three games. Now into the second half of the season, he's had at least five tackles in six games and has compiled 13.5 TFL, 9.0 sacks and four FF.

Through seven games, he is third in the country in sacks (1.29/game) after leading the nation last year. He is also leading the nation with 0.57 forced fumbles per game (4 total), and is eighth nationally in tackles for loss (1.9/game), leading the NSIC. Rare for a pass rushing defensive end, Garrett is 23rd in the NSIC in tackles (6.1/game), as well.

He is coming off a year in which he was named All-America First Team by the AFCA and Associated Press, Second Team by D2-CA and Third Team by Don Hansen's Football Gazette.

Last year, he led the country with 1.65 sacks per game and was fourth in the nation with 1.90 tackles for loss per game.

He set the CSP single season sacks record with 16.5 in just 10 games in 2018, and set the single game TFL record in week six in 2019 with 6.5 against MSU Moorhead, adding 5 sacks, second most in CSP history to earn D2Football.com National Defensive Player of the Week for the second time in his career.

After finishing his sophomore year on a torrid pace with 14.0 sacks, 16.0 tackles for loss and 36 total tackles in the last six games, Garrett's streak has carried over into 2019, giving him 23.0 sacks, 29.5 TFL and 79 total tackles in a 13 game stretch.

FROM THE "GRIFF MYTH" TO "HOME SWEET FOAM"

Prior to head coach **Shannon Currier** returning to lead the Golden Bears, CSP had posted an 11-24 record at Sea Foam Stadium (2009 to 2015) and had never posted more than two home wins in a row with just two winning seasons since football returned to campus in 2009.

In Currier's first season back, the Bears won the 2016 home opener and did so again to start the 2017 season.

In 2017, CSP also nabbed a win in the home finale, a 37-20 win over SMSU that started a three game home winning streak including the first two games of 2018 for the first time in Sea Foam Stadium's history. It was also the first three game home winning streak since the 2005 NSIC Championship season, played down

the street at St. Paul Central High School's Griffin Stadium.

In Currier's first term leading the Bears (2000-03), he posted an 18-2 home record at Griffin Stadium, starting the "Griff Myth," a 19-game home winning streak that began in 2002 and spanned four full seasons of perfect home football (2002, 2003, 2004, 2005).

Currier now holds a 26-13 career record in home games at Concordia, a perfect 8-0 mark in home openers, a 4-4 mark in home finales and led the team to a winning record at Sea Foam Stadium in 2018 for the third time since 2009.

HOME SWEET FOAM: HOW SWEET IS IT?

With a 3-2 home record in 2018, Concordia-St. Paul enjoyed a home field advantage a year ago. The run game topped 200 yards in four out of five home games and held opponents to 131 yards or less four times. Concordia averaged 5.1 yards per carry in home games while opponents mustered just 3.1 yards per rush.

Overall, CSP held a 403.2 to 364.2 average total offense margin and racked up 5.9 yards per play while limiting foes to 4.8 in 2018 home games.

The defense also racked up 6.8 TFL per game while the offensive line limited the damage to just 3.4 opponent TFLs per home contest. Further, the defense held a 17-to-11 margin in sacks leading to 104-to-57 difference in lost yardage. The defense also stifled opponents on fourth down to just 2-for-12 (16.7%).

In the 2019 home opening win over Sioux Falls (41-17), Concor-

HEAD COACH SHANNON CURRIER | 8TH SEASON



Originally the 8th head coach of CSP football in 2000, Shannon Currier returned to lead the program for his 2nd stint in December, 2015.

He became the program's all-time wins leader on November 3, 2018 with a 16-10 win at SMSU.

In his first stint, he compiled a 32-12 (.727) record and brought the program its first NSIC Championship in 2003 when he was named NSIC Coach of the Year. The conference title also brought a berth in the Mineral Water Bowl, the first post-season game in school history.

He coached Concordia to four consecutive winning seasons and is the only coach in program history to achieve the feat - consecutive or cumulative.

THE GRIFF MYTH - PROTECTING HOME TURF

The team also established the longest home winning streak in school history under his guidance. Known to teams of the era as the "Griff Myth," Concordia tallied 19 consecutive home victories down the street at Griffin Stadium. The streak began in 2002 and stretched two years after Currier left through the 2005 season, finally falling at the beginning of 2006.

In Currier's first four years, his teams only lost two home games, producing a record of 18-2 after winning his first and last nine home games.

CAREER AT TRUMAN

Following the program's 2003 NSIC title run, Currier accepted the head coach position at Truman State where he turned a losing program into a pair of 6-5 winning campaigns in his 3rd and 4th seasons.

His tenure was highlighted in his third year, leading the Bulldogs to a 6-3 record in a strong MIAA, finishing fourth in the league. He left the program following a 4-7 season in 2008 with a 20-35 overall record.

PRIOR TO REJOINING CONCORDIA'S SIDELINES

Following his departure from Truman, Currier spent seven years working outside of the coaching profession as a senior sales manager with iHigh.com working to build a digital platform for high school sports, reaching up to 1.5 million Minnesotans in his final year with the company.

NSIC BACKGROUND & ST. PAUL PRIVATE EDUCATION

He arrived at Concordia in 1999 as offensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator for former head coach and athletics director Dan O'Brien, now an assistant coach for the University of Minnesota.

Prior to joining Concordia, Currier spent two years each in similar roles at Southwest Minnesota State and Minnesota Crookston following his start in college coaching at Bemidji State as an offensive graduate assistant where he earned his master's degree in physical education.

A native of Cosmos, Minnesota, Currier was a quarterback at Hamline University where he graduated with a degree in physical education in 1993.

dia won the turnover margin 2-0, registered six sacks and held the Cougars to 0-of-3 on fourth down and 4-of-13 on third down.

HOME SWEET FOAM: HOW SWEET IS IT? (cont'd)

After a 29-3 loss to Minnesota State in week three, Concordia rebounded with a 24-17 home win over MSU Moorhead, holding the Dragons to school records -97 rushing yards and 22 tackles for loss while tying the NCAA Division II single game sacks record with 14.

HOME OPENER SUCCESS

Concordia head coach **Shannon Currier** has improved to 8-0 in his CSP career in home openers including 4-0 at Sea Foam Stadium in his second stint. Across the eight home opener wins between Sea Foam and Griffin Stadium, Currier's Bears have average a 30.9 to 9.4 margin of victory, a total of 247 to 75.

TOUGH HOME SLATE IN 2019 & OTHER SCHEDULE NOTES

After playing a tough road schedule a year ago, the flipped opponents in the South Division leads to a rough home slate in 2019. Concordia's six home opponents in 2019 combined for a 45-21 overall record last year, and only one of them (SMSU) had a losing season (4-7). The Golden Bears host, in order, Sioux Falls (7-4), Minnesota State (11-0), MSU Moorhead (8-3), Bemidji State (7-4), SMSU (4-7) and Winona State (8-3) in 2019.

Those opponents have combined for a 28-14 record in 2019 with four of the six producing at least a 5-2 record.

CSP's last win over a nationally-ranked team was a 27-24 win vs #24 Wayne State in 2011 at Sea Foam Stadium and the last win over a nationally-ranked team on the road was a 28-26 win at #11 Minnesota State in CSP's 2010 Mineral Water Bowl campaign. CSP has now lost 18 straight games to ranked teams.

The Bears snapped a 13-game road losing streak in week seven in 2018 with a 17-7 win at UMary, snapped a 12-game NSIC South road losing streak in week 10 at SMSU in 2018 and in 2019 the program snapped a 10 game road night game losing streak with a 28-23 win over Upper Iowa in a streak that dated back to 2013.

TURNOVERS MATTER

As CSP's program has grown under head coach **Shannon Currier**, the team's steady veteran offensive line has provided more protection for its quarterbacks, leading to more consistent ball control. Defensively, a talented and deep defensive line has helped create pressure in opposing backfields, with more forced fumbles and hurried passes leading to interceptions down field under third year defensive coordinator **Craig Stern**.

Since Currier has rejoined the program in 2016, Concordia has produced a 6-3 record when winning the turnover battle including four straight wins. In week two at Upper Iowa, the Golden Bears lost the turnover battle (2-0) but came away with a 28-23 win, just the second time they've done so in 18 games since 2016 when losing turnover margin. When turnovers are even, CSP is 5-7 since 2016.

DEEP & EXPERIENCED ON THE LINE OF SCRIMMAGE

The 2019 Golden Bears' strength is up front, returning all but one combined starter between the offensive and defensive lines. While four year starting tackle **Terrell Taylor** graduated from the 2018 offensive line, the Golden Bears actually return five blockers with starting experience, along with all four start-

ing defensive linemen. (*Games started listed below*)

On defense, the four starters: **Kelly Pierce** (32), **Jackson Dobbs** (32), **Dylan Wood** (26) and **Chris Garrett** (18) have played a majority of snaps together over the past three years. Senior **TJ Diallo** worked his way into the interior defensive line starting lineup three times while sophomore **Shawn Aarhus** got the start in week three against MSU.

On offense, **Rich Kelly** (37), **Ethan Aune** (27), **Tanner Haechten** (14), **Cris Wasylciw** (15) and **Matthew Montgomery** (9) have provided the Golden Bears with the muscle up front.

Montgomery earned the starting center role in 2018 as a red-shirt freshman before his season ended with injury early on, but is now in his third year in the program while Wasylciw was a transfer with prior experience.

In week four, it was redshirt freshman **Sam Marshalek** making his first career start in Haechten's spot due to injury while sophomore **Tyson Kauffman** earned the start the past two weeks against MSUM and Minot State. Beginning in week five, junior college transfer **Dejon Hart** cycled into the backup rotation at guard as the Bears have used a team effort to fill Haechten's void since week four.

SENIORS FLANK GARRETT ON D-LINE

While junior **Chris Garrett** garners the attention that comes with All-America and Preseason All-America honors, he's joined by four tenacious seniors who are accomplished in their own right: **Dylan Wood**, **TJ Diallo** and **Kelly Pierce** on the interior and **Jackson Dobbs** on the opposite end.

The statistical leader of that group, Dobbs has compiled 155 career tackles, 27.0 tackles for loss and 16.0 sacks across 35 games.

In 34 games, Pierce has 119 tackles, 20.0 for loss and 12.0 sacks while Wood has played in the most games (40) with 128 tackles, 20.0 for loss and 11.5 sacks. Diallo, a second year transfer, has started three times this year on the interior and has made 31 tackles (1.0 TFL) in 18 career games.

So far in 2019, Pierce has 23 tackles, 3.5 TFL and 2.5 sacks, Dobbs with 31 tackles, 7.0 TFL and 3.5 sacks while Wood has 27 tackles, 2.5 TFL.

The depth on the defensive line is notable as six other defensive linemen have recorded at least a half sack with backups led by sophomore ends **Shawn Aarhus** and **Mark O'Reilly** with three sacks each while senior end **Cole Marmor** and sophomore end **Richard Ficociello** each have a sack.

The defensive line combined for 13 of an NCAA DII record-tying 14 sacks in a 24-17 week six win over MSU Moorhead, and five of the team's six sacks in the season opening 41-17 win over Sioux Falls. On the year, the defensive line has racked up 24 of the team's 27 sacks.

SHAQ & LP: FLORIDA DUO COVERS FOR EACH OTHER

The running back group is led by sophomore **Shaq Johnson** and junior **Lajuan Preston**, both Florida natives. Preston became an All-NSIC South Division honorable mention rusher a year ago when Johnson's season ended in week four against Wayne State, while Preston was lost for the season this year in week four at Wayne State.

Prior to his season ending injury last year in 2018, Johnson was on a torrid pace with over 100 combined rushing/receiving yards per game (367 rushing, 49 receiving) and five total TDs in four games.

Preston picked up where Johnson left off after Shaq's injury, gashing Minnesota Duluth, Northern State and Minnesota Crookston for 100-plus rushing yards in a four game stretch including a high of 21-141 against Northern State. He finished the year averaging 6.5 per carry with 704 rushing yards.

Although Preston suffered a season-ending injury in week four at Wayne State this season - the exact timetable and opponent as Johnson a year ago, 'LP' turned in a strong first four games with 177 yards at 5.5 per carry and a pair of TDs.

In the week four win at Wayne State, Preston surpassed 1,000 career rushing yards with 1,013 on 173 carries, averaging 5.9 per carry.

Johnson made his 2019 debut in week two, reaching 100-plus yards for the third time in his career with 12 carries for 118 yards, adding a 36 yard catch and 25 yard kickoff return for 179 all-purpose yards on 14 touches in a win at Upper Iowa. He also found the end zone for his ninth career touchdown (10 total with one passing

A versatile back, Johnson is second on the team (and leader of the RBs) with 253 rushing yards and is third on the team in both receptions (16) and receiving yards (130). He leads the team with 408 all-purpose yards despite missing two games.

Adding to CSP's ground threat is athletic quarterback **Maxon Hutton**. The senior, who had his second career 100-yard rushing game with 120 yards and a 76-yard TD run in week four at Wayne State, leads the team in rushing with 324 yards and a pair of scores.

All three have multiple 100-yard performances in their careers: Preston (3), Johnson (3) and Hutton (2).

CRAWLEY-REID LEADS NEWCOMERS IN BACKFIELD

Darios Crawley-Reid made his career debut in week two at Upper Iowa, and the true freshman got off to a strong start with 7-45 rushing and a touchdown and a 15 yard catch. Crawley-Reid is the younger brother of **Chris Garrett**.

He's been a consistent presence in the backfield ever since, with 225 rushing yards, a team-high 6.4 average and a team-leading five total TDs (four rushing). He's also fourth on the team in receptions (11) and receiving yards (102) and adds a receiving TD.

Division I transfer **Ethan Falaniko** from South Dakota also factors in the ground game. Falaniko is a physical back capable of blocking or providing a bruising presence with the ball, rushing for 14 yards on six attempts while seeing action in all but one game on the year.

It was senior **Cole Kirchoff** who drew the backfield start in week one, producing 21 combined yards on eight touches with 6-12 rushing and 2-9 receiving. He also found the end zone for the first time in week two at UIU.

Kirchoff joined the football roster in 2019 after a four year run with the baseball team where he was a starting outfielder with three homers, three triples, 17 stolen bases and was third on the team with 20 RBIs.

HUTTON UNDER CENTER

Senior quarterback **Maxon Hutton** has ascended to the starting quarterback role after serving as the backup as a sophomore and junior while making spot starts. The dual-threat QB topped 3,000 career yards of total offense in week five at SCSU. He now has 3,446 yards of total offense and 20 total TDs in his career (16 pass, 4 rush).

In 2019, Hutton has ascended to one of the more efficient and versatile QBs in the NSIC. He ranks fourth in completion percentage (.580) and fourth in pass efficiency (117.0). He's also committed just five turnovers on the year and engineers an offense that has committed just nine turnovers in seven games, ranking 33rd in the country and best in the NSIC.

He's hit new career-highs for a season in both passing (1,121) on 102-176 and rushing (324).

In the season opener, Hutton completed 13-of-22 (.591) for 159 yards and two touchdowns while adding 67 rushing yards on 14 carries and a touchdown. The senior also showed the poise necessary to lead a turnover-free offense.

In a week four win at WSC, he was named NSIC Offensive Player of the Week as he produced league-highs for the week in total offense (292) and rushing yards (120) while playing turnover-free football on the road and completing 66.7 percent (16-24) of his passes. The 16 completions would become a new career-high, temporarily. He also had a 76-yard TD run to put CSP ahead in the third quarter.

Backing him up is senior **Jared Olsgaard**, a transfer from Alabama A&M by way of Minnesota State Community & Technical College. In addition to being the backup QB, Olsgaard opened the year as the team's punt returner, averaging 8.5 (4-34) and has now ascended to a starting role at wide receiver. He's also been taking snaps under center in recent weeks, including an 11-yard keeper TD run last week at Minot State.

Olsgaard has recorded 11-90 receiving and 7-34 rushing, adding 4-34 on punt returns and his first two pass attempts.

Depth at the position is provided by junior transfer **Johnny Saavedra** and redshirt freshmen **Darion Manning** and

Abe Schwartz. Schwartz has earned a role on the roster as a special teams contributor, and is tied for the team lead in special teams tackles (5) with a team-high (4) on punts.

THREE DEEP WITH SENIOR WIDE RECEIVERS

Senior quarterback **Maxon Hutton** has three senior wide receiver targets with complimentary skillsets: fourth year starter **Marcus Gustaveson**, second year junior college transfer **MJ Williams** and graduate Division I transfer **Jabril Clewis**. In seven games, the trio has combined for nearly 60 percent of the team's receiving yards and five of its six TD catches.

Clewis leads the team with 306 yards and is second in both catches (20) and average (15.3). Williams is the team leader in catches (21) and second in yards (266). Gustaveson has battled through injuries, producing the team's best average (15.8) on 6-95 receiving and is tied with Clewis with 2 TDs.

GUSTAVESON CLIMBING THE RECEIVING CHARTS

Fourth year starting wide receiver **Marcus Gustaveson** has established himself as one of CSP's top receivers in recent years. He has four career 100-yard performances and is climbing the CSP career receiving charts.

He's tied for eighth in career touchdown catches (18), 10th in receptions (116) and 10th in receiving yards (1,751). He's hauled in a pair of TDs in 2019, both in victories, and leads the team with 15.8 per catch (6-95).

SOPHOMORE SAFETIES

Sophomore safety **Dez Bassett** entered 2019 as the team's starting strong safety (rover) and was the second leading tackler a year ago as a redshirt freshman with 65. Now in the second half of 2019, Bassett is fifth on the team with 36 tackles with a season-high of eight in week five at SCSU.

Bassett's redshirt freshman 2018 season also included seven pass breakups and a 77-yard interception return for touchdown in a win at UMary in addition to the 65 total tackles.

Joining Bassett at the safety position are fellow sophomores

Rhett Sheehan and **Parker Powers** at free safety.

Sheehan has started 16 of 18 career games with 57 career tackles, producing 20 stops in seven games in 2019, adding a pair of pass breakups..

Powers has 33 career tackles, five pass breakups and an interception across 18 games. He has a pair of three tackle performances against Sioux Falls and MSU among his nine tackles in 2019.

LINEBACKERS PUTTING UP BIG NUMBERS IN 2019

A key benefit of having an experienced, physical defensive line is the ability for the linebackers to be free to make plays.

In 2019, Concordia's linebackers opened the year with back-to-back NSIC Defensive Player of the Week honors.

Sophomore MLB **Jake Portz** has emerged as one of the nation's elite tacklers in 2019. His 9.9 per game average ranks 24th in the country and leads the Northern Sun. The team's leading tackler in 2018 as a redshirt freshman with 77, he's rapidly approaching that total with 69 through seven games.

Portz produced 18 tackles in a 28-23 road win at Upper Iowa to earn NSIC Defensive Player of the Week honors and followed that up with 15 tackles against #3 Minnesota State.

The 18 tackle performance is now the third most tackles in a game in school history, and the third most in an NSIC game this season.

While Portz has been among the national leaders throughout the season, it was junior WLB **Dalton Smerchek** who had the impact performance in week one to earn NSIC Player of the Week honors.

In a 41-17 win over Sioux Falls, Smerchek made nine tackles, 1.5 for loss, forced a fumble at the goal line, recovered a muffed punt, had a pass breakup and pair of hurries. One of his tackles was a TFL at the goal line, forcing a field goal two plays later and one of his hurries came on fourth down in the second half as he continued to make impact plays of all kinds.

Initially a long snapper and key special teams contributor, Smerchek has turned into one of the top players on the defense in his junior season. In 29 career games, he's recorded 97 tackles, 7.0 for loss, four fumble recoveries and three forced fumbles.

Smerchek is fourth on the team with 40 tackles, adding 5.0 TFL, 2.0 sacks, 2 FF and 2 FR in seven games in 2019.

The unit is complimented by SLB **Gabe Nkumu** who topped Portz's 18 tackle performance with a 19-tackle game in week seven at Minot State, second most in the NSIC this year and second-most in school history. He is second on the defense with 44 tackles, adding two pass breakups.



Nkumu rejoined the program after a year away when he played nine games as a freshman in 2017 with six tackles, 2.5 for loss, 1.5 sacks and a forced fumble.

CORNERS PRODUCE IN NEW ROLES

The Golden Bears have a pair of new starters at corner, junior transfer **Preston Piltoff** and junior **Lorenzo Kendrick** in his third year in the program. Kendrick was one of the team's co-captains in week one, making three tackles and falling on a blocked punt for a touchdown in a 41-17 win over Sioux Falls. He's played in 29 career games with 61 tackles and five pass breakups in his career.

Kendricks secured his first career INT in week three against Minnesota State.

Piltoff had four tackles (three solo) in his debut with CSP, also adding a fumble recovery at the goal line and recovering a blocked punt in a busy first half in a 41-17 win over Sioux Falls. Through seven weeks, Piltoff has registered 24 tackles with at least three in six of seven games. He leads the team with five pass breakups.

LAUDET ASSUMES KICKING AND PUNTING DUTIES

Replacing one of the top kickers in the country is not an easy task, but the Golden Bears turned to an internal option with **Danny Laudet** who is in his third year in the program and has familiarity with the graduated **Jonas Schenderlein**.

Further, Schenderlein has remained in the program as a graduate assistant, working with Laudet and the other specialists.

Laudet responded well to the additional duties immediately, converting 2-of-2 field goals (30, 29), all five PATs for 11 points, three of eight kickoffs for touchbacks in his debut at kicker in the 41-17 win over USF.

Through seven weeks, Laudet is one of the nation's best at both jobs, ranking sixth in the country field goals per game (1.71), 10th in DII and third in the NSIC in FG pct (.857) and is the nation's 32nd-ranked punter (40.7).

He's also cashed in all 16 of his PATs and has hammered 15 touchbacks on 37 kickoffs.

His early season performance was punctuated with an NCAA Division II long 82-yard punt from the back of his own end zone in a week four win at Wayne State.

He earned NSIC Special Teams Player of the Week honors for his week four performance, hitting the longest FG in the league for the week (second longest of 2019 in the NSIC) from 49 yards, bashing 5-of-6 kickoffs for touchbacks, averaging an NSIC season-best 51.0 yards on four punts and the nation's season long of 82 yards.

In week five, he was arguably even better, making a 4th quarter game-tying and go-ahead field goal and adding another go-ahead field goal in overtime at SCSU. He also delivered a 53-yard punt with a -2 return (55 net) late in the fourth quarter.

It was part of a 5-field goal performance, the first in the NSIC since 2010, a school record and the only recorded 5-for-5 field goal performance in league history dating back to when stats are displayed (1998-present). He is one of just four players with 5 FGM in a game in the country this season.

His 40.70 season average has been contending with the single season CSP punt average record (41.32) all year, and his career average of 39.32 puts him ahead of the career (39.32) punting average record.

DEVIN FLAKES WEEK 1 BLOCK PARTY LEADS SPECIAL TEAMS

Freshman defensive back **Devin Flakes** got off to an exceptional start to his college career, blocking a pair of punts while seeing regular action on special teams in his debut as a true freshman. The blocked punts came in a 24-0 second quarter for CSP in a season-opening 41-17 win over Sioux Falls. The first, recovered by junior defensive back **Preston Piltoff**, set up a two play scoring drive while the second was recovered by junior defensive back **Lorenzo Kendrick** for a touchdown at the end of the quarter for a 27-7 halftime lead over the Cougars.

The special teams is led by third year special teams coordinator **Jake Munkwitz**, with the Golden Bears blocking 10 kicks and punts since 2017 in 26 games.

In addition to an increased ability to block kicks or disrupt an opponents kicking game with pressure, special teams standouts include sophomore **Hunter Thompson** with a team-high five tackles on kickoff returns and redshirt freshman **Abe Schwartz** with a team-high four tackles on punt coverage. Both players lead the team with five total special teams tackles while junior **Lorenzo Kendrick** and sophomore Gabe Nkumu each have four.

TRENDING TOPICS: QB PERCENTAGE

A point of emphasis for the Golden Bears entering 2019 is a more efficient passing game. Even a slight improvement in completion percentage and a decrease in interceptions can lead to a significant boost in wins.

Since **Shannon Currier** has returned to the program in 2016, when the Golden Bears complete at least 54 percent of passes, the team is an above .500 squad with an 8-7 record.

TRENDING TOPIC: SACKS / WINS CORRELATION

In the 40 games since head coach **Shannon Currier** has been back with the program since 2016, the CSP defense

has produced 4-plus sacks 11 times and had more sacks than the opponent 15 times.

In the 4-plus sack games, Concordia has an 8-3 record and has won five of its last six games when sacking the quarterback four or more times.

When producing more sacks than the opponent which factors line play on both sides, Concordia is 10-6 but has won five of the last six including three times in 2019: 6-to-2 against USF in week one, 2-to-1 at Upper Iowa in week two and most recently 14-to-1 in week six against MSUM.

FOUR DIFFERENT PLAYERS WITH RUSHING TDS

In Concordia's 28-23 win at Upper Iowa in week two, the Golden Bears had four different players reach the end zone on the ground, in order: **Cole Kirchoff**, **Shaq Johnson**, **Darios Crawley-Reid** and **Lajuan Preston**.

The last time Concordia had four different players score rushing touchdowns in the same game was a 73-13 win over Minnesota Crookston on October 7, 2005 when **Aaron Cawthorn** scored four rushing touchdowns while **James McNear**, **Brian Holmes** and **John Robinson** each had one.

On the year, four ball carriers have reached paydirt at least twice for Concordia in the run game: **Darios Crawley-Reid** (4), **Shaq Johnson** (2), **Lajuan Preston** (2) and **Maxon Hut-ton** (2) while **Cole Kirchoff** and **Jared Olsgaard** give the

team six different players who've scored on the ground.

GROUND CONTROL LEADS TO VICTORIES

Since 2016 when **Shannon Currier** returned to CSP's sidelines, Concordia has rushed for 200-plus yards 10 times, producing a 7-3 record including a week two 28-23 win at Upper Iowa with a 300-yard team effort.

By contrast, when Concordia holds opponents under 100 yards, a much tougher feat, the Golden Bears are 6-1. Five of those six sub-100 opponent rushing games came last year with CSP producing a 4-1 record, only falling 24-20 in the season finale at Winona State.

This year, CSP's defense set a program record for fewest rushing yards allowed in a game by stifling (and sacking) MSU Moorhead for a loss of -97 rushing yards in a week six win.

Just four times since 2016 have the Golden Bears rushed for 200-plus and held an opponent to under 100 yards in the same game - all coming in 2018 with Concordia beating Upper Iowa (34-7), UMary (17-7) and Minnesota Crookston (21-13) while losing at Winona State (20-24).
