THIS WEEK: CSP LOOKS TO SPOIL MSU HOMECOMING

The Golden Bears will play in back-to-back homecoming games, starting this Saturday when they head to Mankato, Minnesota to face #17 Minnesota State for the Mavericks' homecoming at Blakeslee Stadium, a typically raucous environment in the Key City.

It's the final NSIC North-South interdivisional contest of the 2021 season for each team.

CSP will then turn around and host homecoming the following weekend (Oct. 9) against Bemidji State in its first NSIC North Division football game.

CSP LED BY "COACH C" - ALL-TIME WINS LEADER AT CSP

In 2018, head coach **Shannon Currier** became the school's all-time wins leader, winning his 41st game 16-10 at SMSU in week 10 on November 3, 2018, surpassing **Mark Mauer** (40-39), who coached the program for seven seasons from 2004-10.

Currier, now in his 10th overall season at Concordia, carries a 48-44 career record, has a 29-15 home record and is 9-0 in home openers. He's been head coach across two different stints, 2000 to 2003 and 2016-present while also serving as head coach at Truman State for five seasons from 2004-08. He was 2003 NSIC Coach of the Year, leading the program to its first NSIC Championship and the program's first-ever postseason appearance at the 2003 Mineral Water Bowl.

2021 TEAM CAPTAINS

CSP head coach **Shannon Currier** features rotating team captains each week for the third year in a row in 2021. Captains are selected by the coaching staff based on performance on the field and as a leader in practice, meetings and day-to-day activities.

This week's game captains: freshman quarterback **Conner Cordts** (5x) and sophomore center **Sam Marshalek** (4x) on offense and defensive ends **Jake Richardson** and **Mark O'Reilly** each as first time selections this season on defense.

SMERCHKEK SELECTED FOR BILLY BROWN'S #26 IN 2021

Senior linebacker **Dalton Smerchek** changed jersey numbers from 32 to 26 to honor **Billy Brown, Jr.**, a linebacker who graduated from CSP in May of 2018. Billy passed away in 2018 shortly after graduating while working out near his home in the Twin Cities in June. Head coach **Shannon Currier** has opted to honor Brown by selecting a player who fits Billy's work ethic and commitment to the program to wear the number each season.

A native of Casco, Wisconsin, Smerchek has played in all 37 games over his career, recording 136 tackles, 11.5 tackles for loss, 3.0 sacks, six fumble recoveries and five forced fumbles. In 2021, the senior has compiled 19 tackles (13 solo) with 1.0 for loss and a forced fumble. He is a CoSIDA Academic All-America Second Team selection from 2020-21 and was an All-NSIC South Division honorable mention performer in 2019 when he made 60 tackles, 8.5 for loss, had three sacks, four fumble recoveries and three forced fumbles.

"It was an honor to wear Billy's number when the coaches asked me!" said Smerchek. "Billy was one of my main role models my freshman year, showing me how to take on college football and college in general. He strived to 'Be Great!' and brought others with him."

NOTES ABOUT THE MAVERICKS

Minnesota State holds a 117-14 (.893) record as Northern Sun (NSIC) members, now in its 13th year in the league with seven NSIC championships. The Mavericks have appeared in 12 NCAA playoff appearances, most recently in 2019, and are 14-12 in the NCAA playoffs.

MSU has won nine consecutive homecoming games and holds a 52-33-2 all-time record in 87 prior homecoming games. This will be the third time MSU has hosted CSP on homecoming, also defeating Concordia 30-10 in 2012 and 45-10 in 2016.

The Mavericks are second in the league offensively with 40.8 points per game and seventh in the league with 24.5 points allowed, and rank second in the league in both total offense (486.0) and defense (318.3). Their ground game leads the NSIC with 246.0 yards per game at a 5.1 per carry average and 14 touchdowns while allowing just 107.8 to opponents, sixth best. MSU also outgains through the air with 240.0 yards per game and a 6-5 TD-INT ratio while opponents have put up 210.5 yards per game and a 7-4 TD-INT ratio.

The league's sixth-ranked rusher is **Kaleb Sleezer** with 355 yards at 6.2 per carry while **Charles Coleman** adds 163 yards at a strong 11.6 per carry rate.

JD Ekowa is the leading passer on the squad with 126.5 passing yards per game, completing 43.9 percent of his passes with two TDs and four INTs.

His top target is **Jalen Sample** with 15 catches for 338 yards and a score, ranking ninth in the NSIC in receiving yards.

Bedale Naba (3.5) and **Trent Carpenter** (3.0) lead the MSU in tackles for loss, while they each have 1.5 sacks along with **Jacob Dalton**.

In the secondary, **James Williams** leads the team with four pass breakups and **Ty'Shonan Brooks** has a pair of INTs including a 50-yard pick-6

SERIES HISTORY: MINNESOTA ST 12, CONCORDIA 2

The Golden Bears have dropped nine straight to the Mavericks dating back to 2010 in CSP's only win at Blakeslee Stadium in seven trips to the Key City.

The Mavericks have been nationally-ranked in nine of the last 11 meetings, ranked in the top-three in the country in five of those meetings and never lower than #15.

In 2010, with MSU ranked #11 in the D2Football.com Top-25, the Golden Bears escaped Blakeslee Stadium with a 28-26 win following a blocked 40-yard field goal by future NFL Draft pick and Super Bowl champion **Zach Moore** with 33 seconds to play in the fourth quarter. Moore also had a blocked PAT in the first half in a disruptive game for the sophomore.

Moore wasn't the only future multi-season NFL player to compete in the game, as future Minnesota Viking **Adam Thielen**, a sophomore, had six catches for 85 yards and a seven yard carry.

Since then, it's been all Mavericks, who have won every encounter by at least 20 points, and aside from CSP scoring 34 points in a 57-34 loss in 2011, MSU has held CSP to 13 points or less in every game and scored at least 27.

The teams have met every year since MSU joined the NSIC in 2008 and have two non-conference NCAA Division II tilts on their ledger, with CSP falling in the first meeting 45-20 in 2004 at MSU before beating the Mavericks in the return trip to Griffin Stadium in 2005 when MSU was a member of the now-defunct North Central Conference (NCC).

LAST MEETING, 2019: MINN ST 29, CONCORDIA 3

It was a battle of the last two unbeaten teams in the NSIC South Division in week three at Sea Foam Stadium two years ago, with MSU holding host Concordia to three points in a 29-3 decision.

The Mavericks entered play averaging 550 yards per game of total offense and 364 on the ground, with CSP limiting them to 386 yards overall and 220 rushing, both well below their season averages in the first two weeks.

But MSU's defense was better, holding CSP to 134 yards of total offense and eight first downs. Just a week after CSP had rushed for 300 yards at Upper Iowa in a road win, MSU held CSP to 14 rushing yards.

MSU also had a strong advantage in field position, with an average starting boost of 16 yards (38 yard line for MSU, 22 for CSP).

Linebacker **Jake Portz** topped 15 tackles for the second week in a row with 15 and had 40 through the first three games. Senior defensive end **Jackson Dobbs** had eight tackles including 2.0 TFL and a first quarter sack on third down on MSU's opening drive to hold the Mavericks to a 3-and-out to start the game.

Chris Garrett, a 2021 NFL Draft Pick following the missed COVID season, picked up a sack for his fourth of the season which extended an incredible pace that included 18.0 sacks and 20.5 TFLs in a nine game stretch dating back to the back half of the 2018 season.

Cornerback **Lorenzo Kendricks** added an interception in the second quarter for CSP but MSU won the turnover battle with three forced turnovers in the game.

MSU's defense was led by **Jack Leius** with seven tackles and 4.5 TFLs.

Offensively, **Maxon Hutton** completed 11-21 for 120 yards and a long of 35 while adding 15 yards on the ground with a long run of 19. He connected four times to **MJ Williams** for 52 yards including the 35 yarder while **Jabril Clewis** had 2-39 receiving.

MSU's offense was sparked by **Nate Gunn** with 14-103 rushing after sitting out the first quarter while three MSU QBs combined to completed 17-27 for 166 yards and a TD.

Danny Laudet led CSP's special teams with a fourth quarter 44-yard field goal and had a 42.3 punting average on seven punts including a long of 63 yards.

LAST WEEK: SMSU 34, CONCORDIA 24

Starting with the ball, Concordia lost a fumble on the first offensive play of the game, setting up a short field and touchdown for SMSU which set the tone in a 34-24 loss at Sea Foam Stadium.

The Golden Bears would turn the ball over four times, including a fourth quarter 80-yard pick-6 following CSP's lone takeaway deep in SMSU territory. The pick-6 was decisive, as CSP was trailing 20-17 but looking to reclaim the lead following the SMSU fourth down lost fumble.

Concordia freshman quarterback **Conner Cordts** had another strong performance under center, completing 22-33 for 260 yards and three touchdowns and added 9-41 on the ground to top 300 yards of total offense.

He threw his first career interception, taking 111 pass attempts to start his career. He was 6-7 on third downs including four first down passes and a touchdown and had another third down completion set up a successful fourth and short conversion.

With Cordts under center and CSP producing its top rushing performance of the year with 159 yards on 34 attempts, the Golden Bears put together three drives of at least 12 plays and at least 83 yards and at least four minutes.

The highlight was a season-long 15 play, 91-yard drive taking 6:26 of clock in the first quarter, setting up a **Sam Henson** 24 yard field goal to put CSP on the scoreboard.

The run game featured five players with at least 13 yards and three players with at least 40 yards led by **Jaylin Richardson's** 10-44 and **Lajuan Preston's** 7-43.

Cordts targeted eight different receivers with seven of them recording at least two catches led by **Isaiah Koran** with nine catches for 78 yards on 13 targets, also adding a 13 yard run.

Jake Shepley had a big day with a 49-yard touchdown reception to tie the game at 10-10 in the second quarter, and had three catches on four targets for 66 yards with a pair of TDs.

Jahiem Arnold had the other TD catch for CSP, a late first half score to put CSP ahead 17-10 at the half. He finished with 3-45 and a long of 27 yards.

SMSU was led by **Jesse Sherwood's** 19-178 rushing and also forced a fumble on a kickoff. He had a 56-yard TD run, as well. The Mustangs had 241 yards on the ground on 47 carries.

CSP shut down the SMSU pass game to just one completion on seven attempts for -4 yards in the first half, and the Mustangs finished with just 70 passing yards on 5-12 attempts on the day, but that included a third quarter 53 yard TD connection from **Andrew Haidet** (5-6, 70 yards) to **Zeke Robinson** on his only catch of the day.

Parker Dahlman had another strong punting day, averaging 42.8 yards on four punts with a long of 47 and one inside the 20.

Defensively, **Rhett Sheehan**, **Dalton Smerchek** and **Andrew Egnarski** each had seven tackles with Sheehan adding a forced fumble. **Mark O'Reilly** added 1.5 tackles for loss up front.

FROM THE "GRIFF MYTH" TO "HOME SWEET FOAM"

Prior to head coach **Shannon Currier** returning to lead the Golden Bears, CSP had posted an 11-24 record at Sea Foam Stadium (2009 to 2015) and had never posted more than two home wins in a row with just two winning seasons since football returned to campus in 2009.

In Currier's first season back, the Bears won the 2016 home opener and did so again to start the 2017 season.

In 2017, CSP also nabbed a win in the home finale, a 37-20 win over SMSU that started a three game home winning streak including the first two games of 2018 for the first time in Sea Foam Stadium's history. It was also the first three game home winning streak since the 2005 NSIC Championship season, played down the street at St. Paul Central High School's Griffin Stadium.

In Currier's first term leading the Bears (2000-03), he posted an 18-2 home record at Griffin Stadium, starting the "Griff Myth," a 19-game home winning streak that began in 2002 and spanned four full seasons of perfect home football (2002, 2003, 2004, 2005).

Currier now holds a 29-15 career record in home games at Concordia, a perfect 9-0 mark in home openers, a 4-4 mark in home finales and led the team to a winning record at Sea Foam Stadium in 2018 for the third time since 2009.

The Golden Bears are now 11-13 at Sea Foam Stadium under Cur-

HOME OPENER SUCCESS

Concordia head coach **Shannon Currier** has improved to 9-0 in his CSP career in home openers including 5-0 at Sea Foam Stadium in his second stint. Across the nine home opener wins between Sea Foam and Griffin Stadium, Currier's Bears have average a 30.1 to 9.0 margin of victory, a total of 271 to 81.

NEW TO THE NORTH

The 2021 Golden Bears have shifted to the NSIC North Division after the elimination of football at St. Cloud State University and the University of Minnesota Crookston - both former members of the North Division.

HEAD COACH SHANNON CURRIER | 10TH SEASON



Originally the 8th head coach of CSP football in 2000, Shannon Currier returned to lead the program for his 2nd stint in December, 2015.

He became the program's all-time wins leader on November 3, 2018 with a 16-10 win at SMSU.

In his first stint, he compiled a 32-12 (.727) record and brought the program its first NSIC Championship in 2003 when he was named NSIC Coach of the Year. The conference title also brought a berth in the Mineral Water Bowl, the first post-season game in school history.

He coached Concordia to four consecutive winning seasons and is the only coach in program history to achieve the feat - consecutive or cumulative.

THE GRIFF MYTH - PROTECTING HOME TURF

The team also established the longest home winning streak in school history under his guidance. Known to teams of the era as the "Griff Myth," Concordia tallied 19 consecutive home victories down the street at Griffin Stadium. The streak began in 2002 and stretched two years after Currier left through the 2005 season, finally falling at the beginning of 2006.

In Currier's first four years, his teams only lost two home games, producing a record of 18-2 after winning his first and last nine home games.

The result of the 14-team NSIC is two 7-team divisions, where each program plays the other six teams once every year, rotating between home sites, while facing five of the seven teams from the opposite division.

Previously, CSP played seven games against the NSIC South Division, with that total cut down by two in 2021; and played the NSIC North four times, with that total increased by two.

In 2021, Concordia will not face Wayne State for the first time since joining the league in 1999, or Augustana for the first time since 2004, including four non-conference games with the Vikings each year from 2004 to 2007 with Augie joining the NSIC in 2008.

The Golden Bears will now face every north team at home every other year, and welcome MSU Moorhead to Sea Foam Stadium for just the third time when the Dragons visit St. Paul on November 6. Meanwhile, Minnesota Duluth won't come to St. Paul this year, and have only played at Sea Foam Stadium twice, as well, in 2012 and 2016.

TURNOVERS MATTER

Since head coach **Shannon Currier** rejoined the program in 2016, Concordia has produced a 9-4 record when winning the turnover battle. Meanwhile, when losing the turnover battle under Currier since 2016, Concordia is 2-20 while CSP is 5-8 when turnovers are even.

CSP hadn't committed an offensive turnover until week 4, fum-

He opened his return to the program with a 17-0 shutout win over U-Mary in 2016, snapping a 6-game home losing streak and a former school record 8-game overall losing streak. His CSP teams are 9-0 all-time in home openers and he holds a career 29-15 home mark at Concordia between Griffin & Sea Foam Stadium.

CAREER AT TRUMAN

Following the program's 2003 NSIC title run, Currier accepted the head coach position at Truman State where he turned a losing program into a pair of 6-5 winning campaigns in his 3rd and 4th seasons.

His tenure was highlighted in his third year, leading the Bulldogs to a 6-3 record in a strong MIAA, finishing fourth in the league. He left the program following a 4-7 season in 2008 with a 20-35 overall record.

PRIOR TO REJOINING CONCORDIA'S SIDELINES

Following his departure from Truman, Currier spent seven years working outside of the coaching profession as a senior sales manager with iHigh.com working to build a digital platform for high school sports, reaching up to 1.5 million Minnesotans in his final year with the company.

NSIC BACKGROUND & ST. PAUL PRIVATE EDUCATION

He arrived at Concordia in 1999 as offensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator for former head coach and athletics director Dan O'Brien, now an assistant coach for the University of Minnesota.

Prior to joining Concordia, Currier spent two years each in similar roles at Southwest Minnesota State and Minnesota Crookston following his start in college coaching at Bemidji State as an offensive graduate assistant where earned his master's degree in physical education.

A native of Cosmos, Minnesota, Currier was a quarterback at Hamline University where he graduated with a degree in physical education in 1993.

FRESHMAN QB CONNER CORDTS

The Golden Bears entered 2021 with freshman **Conner Cordts** declared the starter, just the second freshman opening day starting quarterback for the program since moving to NCAA Division II in 1999, joining CSP Athletic Hall of Famer, two-time NSIC Champion and a former Harlon Hill candidate **James McNear** (2002-05).

Cordts is just the sixth freshman to start a game at quarterback since CSP football has been a Division II program - all of them having used a redshirt season prior to making their debut.

He made his debut at Winona State, completing 25-of-40 for 130 yards while leading the team in rushing with 39 yards on 11 attempts. He did not commit any turnovers.

His breakout game was a week 2 win over Upper Iowa, completing 20-of-27 for 249 yards and two touchdowns, once again playing turnover-free football under center.

Cordts topped the 300-yard mark for total offense in a game for the first time in week 4 against SMSU, passing for 260 yards and three TDs and rushing for 41 yards on nine attempts (301).

It took him until his fourth career game until committing his first turnover, an interception that snapped a streak of 111 consecutive passes without an INT to start his career.

PILTUFF PRESEASON NATIONALLY-RANKED CORNERBACK

Senior cornerback **Preston Piltoff** is on the national map, ranked as the #4 cornerback in the country by CFB Network entering the 2021 season. He led the league in pass breakups as a junior in 2019, also leading the team with two interceptions including one for a 92 yard touchdown - the longest INT in the NSIC in 2019.

In 2021, he is second on the team with 25 tackles (18 solo) with three pass breakups.

Piltuff is a junior college transfer, competing at Grossmont College in 2018 with 36 tackles, eight pass breakups and two interceptions after an All-Conference freshman year at Shasta College with 16 tackles and five pass breakups.

CONCORDIA ST CLOUD GOLDEN HUSKIES

At the conclusion of the 2019 football season, the administrations at St. Cloud State University and the University of Minnesota Crookston made the difficult decision to end their football programs.

Immediately, the CSP coaches put together a plan and worked with Concordia administration to provide an opportunity for student-athletes to continue to pursue their goals towards graduating from college while remaining members of an NSIC football program.

Coach Currier and his staff successfully recruited 11 members of the 2019 SCSU football team, and one from UMC.

Robby Carrillo, Luke Dunsmoor, Jake Edwards, Nathan Gimza, Taylor Hensley, Sarek Hoerth, Robert Kraklow, Dominic LaCombe, Luke Shepherd, Mason Van Zeeland and Nick Webley all joined Concordia from SCSU while Ryan Martin changed his golden from the Eagles to the Bears. They've been part of the campus community since the pandemic shortened spring 2020 semester and were with us through the 2020-21 academic year.

Of that group, all have challenged for a travel roster spot while **Robert Kraklow** (LT), **Nathan Gimza** (WR) and **Mason Van Zeeland** (WR) have earned starting roles.

Kraklow is a returning All-NSIC North Division Second Team offensive lineman, while Gimza was leading the team with 11 catches for 153 yards and a long of 65 - all team highs, before getting injured and missing week 4.

Van Zeeland leads the team with a 28.2 yard per catch average, ranking third on the team with 141 yards on just five catches including a touchdown. Van Zeeland's shortest reception is 11 yards, and his other four catches have been for at least 25 yards with a long of 42.

Shepherd had ascended to the top of the TE depth chart before falling victim to injury ahead of week 4.

THREE FRESHMEN CLASSES?

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic forcing the cancellation of NSIC football in 2021, and the eligibility waivers handed down by the NCAA, the Golden Bears have a large number of freshmen on the roster.

The roster includes 25 redshirt freshmen, players who did not compete in 2019 in their first year of college football whether it was at CSP or elsewhere.

The bigger number is 57 true freshmen, players who had their first season as college student-athletes in the 2020-21 academic year that didn't lose eligibility, as well as first year players new to Concordia in 2021-22.

Second year freshmen who are making an early impact on the field include: offensive lineman **Jac Carver** has popped into the starting lineup at right tackle as of week 4, special teams linebacker **Brayden Hilgemann**, reserve linebacker **Caden Baarts**, starting safety **Cyrus McClure**, special teams safety **Anthony Ukofia**, special teams linebacker **Max Giannini**, kicker **Sam Henson**, special teams defensive back **Kahlil Robinson**, starting quarterback **Conner Cordts** and starting running back **Jaylin Richardson**.

True first year freshmen making an early impact on the roster include: wide receiver **Jahiem Arnold**, punter **Parker Dahlman** and defensive tackle **Brad Walker** while two other true freshmen have travelled but yet to make their debuts: running backs **Keron Franklin** and **TJ Holmes**.

SKILL POSITION TURNOVER

The Golden Bears entered 2021 looking to replace all but one passing attempt (**Abe Schwartz**), 88 percent of its rushing yards with its leader being **Lajuan Preston** (177) and over 90 percent of its receptions with its leader being **Kevin Ventura-Cortes** (11-76).

PRESTON BOOSTED BY DI TALENT IN BACKFIELD

Concordia's running game entered 2021 led by junior **Lajuan Preston**, the top returner from a strong and versatile rushing attack in 2019. "LP" has played in 29 career games with 1,058 rushing yards and a 5.6 career average. His breakout year was in 2018 when he averaged 6.5 per carry and rushed for 704 yards.

He was off to another strong start in 2019 with 177 yards in four games with two touchdowns and a 5.5 average before a season-ending injury.

He missed the 2021 opener with an injury but has returned to the backfield rotation and his top line of the year in week 4 with 7-43 and a long of 15 against the Mustangs.

He's aided by Purdue junior transfer **Brian Lankford-Johnson** and Northern Iowa freshman transfer **Jaylin Richardson**.

Lankford-Johnson played in 12 games including a start in 2016 as a freshman for the Boilermakers, earning Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors with 18 carries for 127 yards and a touchdown against Illinois and finished the year second on the team with 314 yards on the ground and 6.5 per carry, adding the team's longest run (48) and 11 catches for 90 yards. He played in six games as a sophomore with 22-86 rushing before deciding to transfer to CSP for the spring 2020 term.

Richardson was a highly recruited RB from the Kansas City area, initially committing to Kansas before signing with Northern Iowa where he was an early enrollee in spring 2020. He made his debut in the 2021 COVID shortened spring season for the Panthers, and retained his full eligibility for his first year with CSP.

So far in 2021, Richardson leads the backfield with 36 carries for 132 rushing yards and has added 10-76 receiving. He had team-highs of 7-69 receiving in his debut at Winona State.

Lankford-Johnson is third on the team with 27 carries.

Ethan Falaniko, a transfer from South Dakota who came to CSP for the 2019 season, was a factor in the backfield rotation before an injury has forced him to be inactive so far in 2021. He had six carries in five games in 2019 and was poised for a bigger role in 2021.

GROUND CONTROL LEADS TO VICTORIES

Since 2016 when **Shannon Currier** returned to CSP's sidelines, Concordia has rushed for 200-plus yards 11 times, pro-

OFFENSIVE LINE NOTES

While the Golden Bears replaced four starting offensive linemen, the unit brings back plenty of experience led by transfer tackle **Robert Kraklow**, an All-NSIC North Division Second Team performer at St. Cloud State and former Division I player at Northern Illinois.

The top returner is guard **Matthew Montgomery**, a regular starter at center in 2019, while new center **Sam Marshalek** had stepped into a starting guard role late in 2019 before the two players flipped positions in 2021.

At the other tackle opposite Kraklow, freshman **Jac Carver**, a second year player, has ascended to the top of the depth chart while the other guard spot has been occupied by **Brody Card**, a redshirt freshman in his third year.

The Golden Bears also roll out a sixth offensive linemen multiple times per game, with backup tackle **Jake Edwards** frequently utilized in that capacity.

BROTHERLY LOVE

The 2021 Concordia-St. Paul roster features four sets of brothers: **Jake and Jaylin Richardson**, **Mel and El-Osiris Jeudy**, **Robby and Austin Carrillo**, and **Justin and Connor Higgins**.

The **Richardsons**, from Kansas City, are newcomers to the program in 2021 as Division I transfers.

Jake, a senior, transferred to CSP from South Dakota where he played 25 games across three seasons for the Coyotes, securing 16 tackles, 5.0 for loss and 5.0 sacks along with two forced fumbles and a fumble recovery. At CSP, he picked up his first sack in week 2 against Upper Iowa and has registered five tackles on the year.

Jaylin, a freshman, transferred to CSP from Northern Iowa where he competed during UNI's shortened spring season in 2021 and was not charged a season of eligibility due to

the COVID-19 pandemic. He made his college football debut against #5 South Dakota State, recording a tackle. He's been a key part of CSP's backfield in 2021, leading the backfield with 36-132 rushing and a pair of touchdown runs along with 10-76 receiving while contributing 109 combined kick/punt return yards for a team-leading 317 all-purpose yards.

The **Jeudys** are from Miami, Florida with Mel joining the program as a transfer prior to the 2020 spring term and El-Osiris being a freshman during the 2020-21 academic year.

Mel, a junior nose tackle, played three games at Alderson Broaddus University, a Division II program in 2019 after spending his first two years of college football at Division I Eastern Kentucky, including a redshirt season. The junior has played all four games for CSP including three starts up front and has made six tackles with 1.0 TFL.

El-Osiris, a freshman linebacker, has also appeared in all four games, primarily as a special teams contributor.

The **Carrillos** are offensive linemen from Case High School in Racine, Wisconsin with **Robby** joining the program prior to the 2020 spring term as a transfer from St. Cloud State with four years of eligibility remaining after redshirting with the Huskies in the final season of SCSU's program. **Austin** is a true first year freshman.

The **Higgins** are defensive acks from Rochester, Minnesota and the only set of brothers from this group to both join CSP as freshmen. Graduates of John Marshall High School, the duo are each preparing to make their college football debuts.

ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS ON DEFENSE

The Golden Bears have a pair of defensive starters who earned CoSIDA Academic All-America Second Team honors for the 2020-21 academic year, that was held without a season in the NSIC: **Shawn Aarhus** and **Dalton Smerchek**.

Smerchek, a senior linebacker, is a returning 2019 All-NSIC South Division honorable mention performer when he had 60 tackles, 7.5 tackles for loss, 3.0 sacks, led the NSIC with four fumble recoveries and ranked second in the league with three forced fumbles.

He has played in 37 career games with 136 tackles, 11.5 TFL, 3.0 sacks, six fumble recoveries and five forced fumbles.

He led CSP with seven tackles and 1.0 TFL in the season opener at WSU and forced a fumble in week 2's win over Upper Iowa. Through four games, he is fourth on the defense with 19 tackles and handles long/short snapping duties.

Aarhus is a junior defensive tackle who has played in 26 career games while stepping into a starting role in 2021. He has 53 total tackles, 7.0 TFL, 5.5 sacks and three fumble recoveries in his career. In 2021, he's registered 16 tackles with a half sack.

EXPERIENCED LINEBACKERS GROUP

All three of Concordia's starting linebackers from 2019's 6-5 squad return for 2021: senior whip **Dalton Smerchek**, junior mike **Jake Portz** and junior sam **Gabe Nkumu**.

Smerchek and Portz earned All-NSIC South Division honorable mention honors as Smerchek led the league in fumble recoveries and added 8.5 TFL with 60 tackles while Portz was second in the league with 105 tackles and had an 18 tackle performance, third most in a game in school history. Nkumu, meanwhile, topped Portz's 18 tackles with 19, an NSIC single-game high for the year as he finished second on the team with 73 tackles.

In 2021, Smerchek led the team in tackles in week 1 with seven including 1.0 TFL at Winona State and added a forced fumble in week 2 against Upper Iowa.

Nkumu is fifth on the defense with 18 tackles including 3.0 TFL through four weeks and Portz has contributed 13 tackles.

The unit was bolstered with the emergence of **Andrew Egnarski**, who has ascended to the starting MLB spot. He had his breakout effort in week 2 against Upper Iowa with a team-high 11 tackles, 3.5 TFL, 3.5 sacks, a forced fumble and recovery, earning NSIC Defensive Player of the Week honors.

His 3.5 sacks performance is an NSIC single game high while the 3.5 TFL are tied for third-most in a game in the NSIC this year.

On the year, Egnarski is ninth in the league with 4.5 TFL and his 3.5 sacks is second in the league. He leads the team and is 15th in the NSIC with 27 tackles.

Adding depth at the position is **Foster Konzett** at the whip, and a tribute to the quality and the depth at the linebacker position, Konzett ranks third on the team and 20th in the NSIC with 20 total tackles.

TRENDING TOPIC: SACKS / WINS CORRELATION

In the 48 games since head coach **Shannon Currier** has been back with the program since 2016, the CSP defense has produced 4-plus sacks 13 times and had more sacks than the opponent 19 times.

In the 4-plus sack games, Concordia has a 10-3 record and has won six of its last seven games when sacking the quarterback four or more times including week 2's five sack performance against Upper Iowa.

When producing more sacks than the opponent which factors line play on both sides, Concordia is 12-8 since 2016.

DEFENSIVE LINE SEES MAJOR TURNOVER

The 2021 Golden Bears were supposed to feature the return of two-time All-American and two-time NSIC sack champion **Chris Garrett**, the NCAA DII career record holder with 15 forced fumbles and CSP career sack record holder.

But Garrett was drafted following the cancelled COVID season in the seventh round by the Los Angeles Rams, making the 53 man roster this fall.

Going with Garrett were the other three outgoing senior starting linemen, as well as three key rotation reserves.

In 2021, the Golden Bears have filled the defensive line with three players who played key roles in 2019: ends **Richard Ficociello** and **Mark O'Reilly** and tackle **Shawn Aarhus** while impact transfers **Mel Jeudy** joined Aarhus in the middle and **Jake Richardson** joined the defensive end rotation.

Aarhus has played in 26 career games with 53 tackles, 7.0 TFL and 5.5 sacks, Ficociello has played in 19 career games with 38 tackles and 6.0 TFL and 2.0 sacks and O'Reilly has secured 21 tackles, 8.5 TFL and 4.0 sacks across 15 career games.

In 2021, Aarhus leads the line with 16 total tackles followed by Ficociello with 15 tackles, 2.0 TFL and 1.0 sack. O'Reilly adds 2.0 TFLs and nine tackles while Richardson adds 1.0 sack on five total tackles.

The unit also features SCSU transfer **Luke Dunsmoor** and returners **Keegan Larson** and **Carter Hislop** with freshman **Brad Walker** making his debut on the interior in week 3 at

Dunsmoor has come on strong as a reserve as of late, making 10 tackles with 1.0 TFL on the year, with nine of those tackles coming in the last two games.

ROOKIE KICKING GAME

Concordia-St. Paul has featured some of the top kickers and punters in the Northern Sun as well as nationally over the past decade, and in 2021 the kicking and punting jobs will be handled by a pair of talented freshmen: second year kicker **Sam Henson** and first year punter **Parker Dahlman**.

Henson had a standout debut, converting his only two field goal attempts from 38 and 48 yards, before adding 3-3 PAT and 1-2 FG in a week 2 win over Upper Iowa. His 48 yard field goal is the second longest in the Northern Sun this year. Overall, Henson is 4-6 on field goal attempts with his only misses coming from 40 and 52 yards and he leads the team in scoring with 20 points while adding four kickoff touchbacks in his rookie season.

Dahlman has been busy so far, as well and is second in the league with a 44.3 season punting average on 23 punts. His six punts of 50-plus yards is also second in the league and he's fourth in the league with five punts pinned inside the 20.

His 77 yard punt at Sioux Falls is the second longest in the

league so far and he holds two of the top five single game punting averages on the year, 50.2 (at USF) is ranked third and 47.3 (at UIU) is ranked fifth.

His first four game pace is on track to set the CSP single season and career punting average records.
