THIS WEEK: CSP FACES TOP-25 OPPONENT ON THE ROAD

Concordia prepares for its first NSIC North Division road game, drawing its second AFCA Top-25 road game in the last three weeks at #18 Minnesota Duluth.

Two weeks ago, CSP went to #17 Minnesota State, and last week hosted Bemidji State in its first-ever NSIC North Division football game.

This week also marks Concordia's third-straight homecoming game, playing the Mavericks for MSU's homecoming game at Blakeslee Stadium in Mankato two weeks ago before hosting BSU last week at CSP's homecoming carnival at Sea Foam Stadium.

CSP LED BY "COACH C" - ALL-TIME WINS LEADER AT CSP

In 2018, head coach **Shannon Currier** became the school's all-time wins leader, winning his 41st game 16-10 at SMSU in week 10 on November 3, 2018, surpassing **Mark Mauer** (40-39), who coached the program for seven seasons from 2004-10.

Currier, now in his 10th overall season at Concordia, carries a 48-46 career record, has a 29-16 home record and is 9-0 in home openers. He's been head coach across two different stints, 2000 to 2003 and 2016-present while also serving as head coach at Truman State for five seasons from 2004-08. He was 2003 NSIC Coach of the Year, leading the program to its first NSIC Championship and the program's first-ever postseason appearance at the 2003 Mineral Water Bowl.

2021 TEAM CAPTAINS

CSP head coach **Shannon Currier** features rotating team captains each week for the third year in a row in 2021. Captains are selected by the coaching staff based on performance on the field and as a leader in practice, meetings and day-to-day activities.

This week's game captains are defensive players: senior cornerback **Preston Piltoff (5x)**, junior safety **Rhett Sheehan** (2x) from the secondary, junior linebacker **Foster Conzet** and junior nose tackle **Mel Jeudy**.

SMERCHEK SELECTED FOR BILLY BROWN'S #26 IN 2021

Senior linebacker **Dalton Smerchek** changed jersey numbers from 32 to 26 to honor **Billy Brown, Jr.**, a linebacker who graduated from CSP in May of 2018. Billy passed away in 2018 shortly after graduating while working out near his home in the Twin Cities in June. Head coach **Shannon Currier** has opted to honor Brown by selecting a player who fits Billy's work ethic and commitment to the program to wear the number each season.

A native of Casco, Wisconsin, Smerchek has played in all 39 games over his career, recording 146 tackles, 13.0 tackles for loss, 3.0 sacks, six fumble recoveries and five forced fumbles. In 2021, the senior has compiled 29 tackles (18 solo) with 2.5 for loss and a forced fumble.

He is a CoSIDA Academic All-America Second Team selection from 2020-21 and was an All-NSIC South Division honorable mention performer in 2019 when he made 60 tackles, 8.5 for loss, had three sacks. four fumble recoveries and three forced fumbles.

"It was an honor to wear Billy's number when the coaches asked mel" said Smerchek. "Billy was one of my main role models my freshman year, showing me how to take on college football and college in general. He strived to "Be Great!" and brought others with him."

Α NOTES ABOUT THE BULLDOGS

UMD has posted back-to-back wins in starts under center by redshirt freshman NDSU transfer quarter back Logan Graetz, who had 150 passing yards and 4 TD-0 INT last week in a win over road win at UMary In three total games, Graetz has 288 yards and 5 TD-0 INT while completing 23-43 passes.

He's not listed atop the UMD depth chart, though, as opening day starter John Larson heads the position. In four games, Larson has 952 yards and 9 TD-2 INT with 53.7 percent (58-108) passing. Garrett Olson has also played two games under center and is the listed backup with 9-12 passing for 114 yards and 2

Together, they have combined to pass for 1,372 yards, 16 TDs and 3 INTs with 2 rushing TDs.

Cazz Martin leads the ground game with 523 yards , fourth-best in the NSIC, and averages 6.4 per carry with 4 TDs along with 6-68 receiving. Cashmere Thomas brings an impressive 12.5 average to the backfield (13-163) with a long of 71, and UMD has rushed for 1,007 yards as a team.

The three QBs have found Armani Carmickle 29 times for 654 yards and 7 TDs. He's fourth in the league in receiving yards and his 22.6 per catch average is third among qualified league receivers.

While the offense has headline-grabbing individual stats, the team defense leads the NSIC with 2853 yards allowed per game, is second in run defense (84.3) and third against the pass (201.0) with a league-leading 23 sacks.

Brad Dati leads the team with and is 13th in the NSIC with 39 tackles and is fourth in the league with 11.0 TFLs, just a half behind teammate Nate Pearson's 11.5 while two others, Dan Monson (6.5) and Joe Kordus (6.0) are in teh league's top-15.

Pearson also leads the NSIC with 6.0 sacks with Dati in seventh with 3.5 and Kordus (3.0) close behind.

SERIES HISTORY: UMD 10, CONCORDIA 3

After winning the first two meetings in Concordia's first two seasons of Division II football in 1999 and 2000, and then again in 2004, the Bulldogs have taken control of the series with seven consecutive wins and including the 2004 CSP win, are 10-1 against CSP since 2001.

The teams played every year between 1999 and 2005, had a three year gap when UMD left the NSIC for the now-defunct North Central Conference (NCC), and have played nearly every other year since UMD rejoined the NSIC in 2008.

Concordia holds a 1-6 record at Malosky Stadium in Duluth, dropping each of their last six road trips.

Head coach Shannon Currier holds a 1-5 record against UMD, winning in Duluth in 2000, 37-27.

LAST MEETING, 2018: UMD 32, CONCORDIA 3

Facing a brutal road schedule in 2018, the Golden Bears faced UMD with the Bulldogs sporting the #8 ranking in the country in week five, the third straight nationally-ranked road opponent.

Concordia fell 32-3 at Malosky Stadium despite running back Lajuan Preston's first career 100-yard rushing performance with 13 carries for 111 yards, averaging 8.5 per carry.

In the loss, wide receiver Marcus Gustaveson became Concordia's 11th all-time player to reach 100 career receptions, finishing with 2-30 receiving against the Bulldogs.

Concordia cornerback Marcus Haskins intercepted UMD in the red zone (15), returning it 21 yards late in the first half with CSP facing a 16-3 deficit. Haskins had an interception in each of CSP's first five games to start the 2018 season.

But UMD forced a turnover three plays later, and Dan Branger converted a 43-yard field goal for a 19-3 halftime lead.

An interception early in the third quarter for UMD gave the Bulldogs the ball at the 9-yard line, scoring on the next play for a 25-3 lead, capping a swing that had CSP with the ball trailing 16-3 late in the half and a potential to cut into the UMD margin.

Concordia rushed for 132 yards against UMD, averaging 4.4 per attempt, but passed for just 108 yards on 13-29 with two interceptions between Dom McKinzy and Maxon Hutton.

MJ Williams led CSP's receivers with three catches for 61 yards.

It was the first time all season Concordia lost the turnover margin, committing three in the game while Haskins' interception was the first time Concordia failed to get two takeaways in the first five weeks of the season.

Concordia's defense stopped UMD on a pair of 4th-and-short situations early in the game, with the second occurrence setting up Jonas Schenderlein for a 34-yard field goal to cut the margin to 8-3 early in the second quarter.

Although the defense issued 417 yards of total offense to the Bulldogs, the total was far lower than their 493.2 average per game entering the contest, and Concordia's output of 240 yards was higher than UMD's 204.2 allowed per game entering play.

UMD quarterback John Larson completed 20-32 for 238 yards with a TD and INT, and ran 15 times for 69 yards with a TD.

LAST WEEK: BEMIDJI STATE 42, CONCORDIA 14

Concordia's homecoming and first NSIC North Division contest were spoiled 42-14 by visiting Bemidji State last Saturday afternoon at Sea Foam Stadium.

Big plays were plentiful between the Golden Bears and Beavers, as six of the eight touchdowns scored in the game were from 40-plus yards. Concordia's two touchdowns were 1-play drives, a 40-yard double-pass from wide receiver Evan Peterson to Jake Shepley to open the scoring with 12:04 in the first quarter following junior safety Rhett Sheehan's second interception of the year, and a 71-yard dash up the middle by Lajuan Preston early in the third quarter, cutting into a 28-7 deficit to answer BSU's 75-yard TD on the previous play.

While a turnover led to CSP's first score of the game, and the early lead, BSU would win the turnover battle 3-2 and outscored CSP 14-7 off turnovers including a pivotal 96-yard pick-six by BSU midway through the fourth quarter to seal the 42-14 score.

Entering play, Concordia's pass defense ranked 18th in the country, limiting opponents to 148.8 yards per game through the air while BSU featured the seventh-ranked pass attack with 339 passing yards per game.

In the end, BSU's pass game won the day as **Brandon Alt** completed 18-31 for 354 yards and three TDs while backup QB Sam McGrath scored two rushing TDs from 6 and 1 yard for the game's only short TDs of the day.

Alt connected twice with Malik Williams for 75-yard touchdowns in the third quarter, bookending Preston's 71-yard TD run to suppress the big play momentum for CSP. Preston finished with 83 rushing yards on nine carries, averaging 9.2.

The Golden Bears also got hit by injuries as four different players completed passes under center with freshman **Bryce Sievers** completing 9-16 for 83 yards to lead the pass game.

The top target was Mason Van Zeeland with 5-73 and a long of 33 while Shepley had 2-43 and the 40-yard score.

Sheehan led CSP's defense with 10 tackles, 1.0 for loss, a pass breakup and the interception with a 44-yard return. Defensive tackle **Mel Jeudy** had six tackles and 3.0 TFL up front and **Foster** Conzet added nine tackles.

FROM THE "GRIFF MYTH" TO "HOME SWEET FOAM"

Prior to head coach Shannon Currier returning to lead the Golden Bears, CSP had posted an 11-24 record at Sea Foam Stadium (2009 to 2015) and had never posted more than two home wins in a row with just two winning seasons since football returned to campus in 2009.

In Currier's first season back, the Bears won the 2016 home opener and did so again to start the 2017 season.

In 2017, CSP also nabbed a win in the home finale, a 37-20 win over SMSU that started a three game home winning streak including the first two games of 2018 for the first time in Sea Foam Stadium's history. It was also the first three game home winning streak since the 2005 NSIC Championship season, played down the street at St. Paul Central High School's Griffin Stadium.

In Currier's first term leading the Bears (2000-03), he posted an 18-2 home record at Griffin Stadium, starting the "Griff Myth," a 19game home winning streak that began in 2002 and spanned four full seasons of perfect home football (2002, 2003, 2004, 2005).

Currier now holds a 29-16 career record in home games at Concordia, a perfect 9-0 mark in home openers, a 4-4 mark in home finales and led the team to a winning record at Sea Foam Stadium in 2018 for the third time since 2009.

The Golden Bears are now 11-14 at Sea Foam Stadium under Currier since 2016 including winning seasons in 2018 (3-2) and 2019 (4-2) with a 1-2 start at home in 2021 for an 8-6 home record across the past three seasons.

HOME OPENER SUCCESS

Concordia head coach Shannon Currier has improved to 9-0 in his CSP career in home openers including 5-0 at Sea Foam Stadium in his second stint. Across the nine home opener wins between Sea Foam and Griffin Stadium, Currier's Bears have average a 30.1 to 9.0 margin of victory, a total of 271 to 81.

Played overtime:2019, vs Bemidji State (W, 24-23 - 1 OT) each program plays the other six teams once every year, rotating between home sites, while facing five of the seven teams from the opposite division.

Previously, CSP played seven games against the NSIC South Division, with that total cut down by two in 2021; and played the NSIC North four times, with that total increased by two.

In 2021, Concordia will not face Wayne State for the first time since joining the league in 1999, or Augustana for the first time since 2004, including four non-conference games with the Vikings each year from 2004 to 2007 with Augie joining the NSIC

The Golden Bears will now face every north team at home every other year, and welcome MSU Moorhead to Sea Foam Stadium for just the third time when the Dragons visit St. Paul on November 6. Meanwhile, Minnesota Duluth won't come to St. Paul this year, and has only played at Sea Foam Stadium twice as well, in 2012 and 2016

Under head coach **Shannon Currier**, the Golden Bears are 16-12 against the NSIC North Division teams across his career and 5-8 against NSIC North Division teams since rejoining the program in 2016.

TURNOVERS MATTER

Since head coach Shannon Currier rejoined the program in 2016, Concordia has produced a 9-5 record when winning the turnover battle. Meanwhile, when losing the turnover battle, CSP is 2-21 and CSP is 5-8 when turnovers are even.

CSP hadn't committed an offensive turnover until week four this year, fumbling on the first offensive play in a 34-24 loss to SMSU at Sea Foam Stadium.

QB SHUFFLE IN WEEK SIX

In Concordia's 42-14 loss in week six, four different players completed a pass in the contest. Starter Conner Cordts (1-1) left the game following a running play in the first quarter, did not return and is no longer listed on the team's official two-deep. Sophomore backup Abe Schwartz (5-8) also left the game following a running play and did not return to the field, but is still listed as the second QB on the two-deep for week 7 at UMD. Third string freshman quarterback Bryce Sievers made his most ex-

HEAD COACH SHANNON CURRIER | 10TH SEASON



Originally the 8th head coach of CSP football in 2000, Shannon Currier returned to lead the program for his 2nd stint in December, 2015.

He became the program's all-time wins leader on November 3, 2018 with a 16-10 win at SMSU.

In his first stint, he compiled a 32-12 (.727) record and brought the program its first NSIC Championship in 2003 when he was named NSIC Coach of the Year. The conference

title also brought a berth in the Mineral Water Bowl, the first postseason game in school history.

He coached Concordia to four consecutive winning seasons and is the only coach in program history to achieve the feat consecutive or cumulative.

THE GRIFF MYTH - PROTECTING HOME TURF

The team also established the longest home winning streak in school history under his guidance. Known to teams of the era as the "Griff Myth," Concordia tallied 19 consecutive home victories down the street at Griffin Stadium. The streak began in 2002 and stretched two years after Currier left through the 2005 season, finally falling at the beginning of 2006.

In Currier's first four years, his teams only lost two home games, producing a record of 18-2 after winning his first and last nine home games

He opened his return to the program with a 17-0 shutout win over U-Mary in 2016, snapping a 6-game home losing streak and a former school record 8-game overall losing streak. His CSP teams are 9-0 all-time in home openers and he holds a career 29-16 home mark at Concordia between Griffin & Sea Foam Stadium.

CAREER AT TRUMAN

Following the program's 2003 NSIC title run, Currier accepted the head coach position at Truman State where he turned a losing program into a pair of 6-5 winning campaigns in his 3rd and 4th seasons.

His tenure was highlighted in his third year, leading the Bulldogs to a 6-3 record in a strong MIAA, finishing fourth in the league. He left the program following a 4-7 season in 2008 with a 20-35 overall record.

PRIOR TO REJOINING CONCORDIA'S SIDELINES

Following his departure from Truman, Currier spent seven years working outside of the coaching profession as a senior sales manager with iHigh.com working to build a digital platform for high school sports, reaching up to 1.5 million Minnesotans in his final year with the company.

tended appearance under center, finishing the rest of the game and leading the team in pass completions (9), attempts (16) and yards (83). He is listed atop the QB two-deep for week 7, and if he gets the start under center, would be the eighth different freshman to start a game at QB since CSP moved to the NCAA Division II ranks in 1999, and would be the first time the team has started two freshman QBs in the same season.

FRESHMAN OB CONNER CORDTS

The Golden Bears entered 2021 with freshman **Conner Cordts** declared the starter, just the second freshman opening day starting quarterback for the program since moving to NCAA Division II in 1999, joining CSP Athletic Hall of Famer, two-time NSIC Champion and a former Harlon Hill candidate **James McNear** (2002-05).

Cordts is the seventh freshman to start a game at quarterback since CSP football has been a Division II program (1999) - all of them having used a redshirt season prior to making their debut.

He made his debut at Winona State, completing 25-of-40 for 130 yards while leading the team in rushing with 39 yards on 11 attempts. He did not commit any turnovers.

His breakout game was a week 2 win over Upper lowa, completing 20-of-27 for 249 yards and two touchdowns, once again playing turnover-free football under center.

Cordts topped the 300-yard mark for total offense in a game for the first time in week 4 against SMSU, passing for 260 yards and three TDs and rushing for 41 yards on nine attempts (301).

It took him until his fourth career game until committing his first turnover, an interception that snapped a streak of 111 consecutive passes without an INT to start his career.

Injured in week six, the rookie signal-caller committed only one turnover in 2021 and has a new streak of 28 passes without an INT.

A point of emphasis for the Golden Bears is a more efficient passing game. Even a slight improvement in completion percentage and a decrease in interceptions can lead to a significant boost in wins.

Since **Shannon Currier** has returned to the program in 2016, when the Golden Bears complete at least 54 percent of passes, the team is a .500 squad with a 10-10 record.

PILTOFF PRESEASON NATIONALLY-RANKED CORNERBACK

Senior cornerback **Preston Piltoff** is on the national map, ranked as the #4 cornerback in the country by CFB Network entering the 2021 season. He led the league in pass breakups as a junior in 2019, also leading the team with two interceptions including one for a 92 yard touchdown - the longest INT in the NSIC in 2019.

In 2021, he is third on the team with 30 tackles along with 22 solo stops and a team-high four pass breakups.

Piltoff is a junior college transfer, competing at Grossmont College in 2018 with 36 tackles, eight pass breakups and two interceptions after an All-Conference freshman year at Shasta College with 16 tackles and five pass breakups.

CONCORDIA ST CLOUD GOLDEN HUSKIES

At the conclusion of the 2019 football season, the administrations at St. Cloud State University and the University of Minnesota Crookston made the difficult decision to end their football programs.

Immediately, the CSP coaches put together a plan and worked with Concordia administration to provide an opportunity for student-athletes to continue to pursue their goals towards graduating from college while remaining members of an NSIC football program.

Coach Currier and his staff successfully recruited 11 members of the 2019 SCSU football team, and one from UMC.

Robby Carrillo, Luke Dunsmoor, Jake Edwards, Nathan Gimza, Taylon Hensley, Sarek Hoerth, Robert Kraklow, Dominic La-Combe, Luke Shepherd, Mason Van Zeeland and Nick Webley all joined Concordia from SCSU while Ryan Martin changed his golden from the Eagles to the Bears. They've been part of the campus community since the pandemic shortened spring 2020 semester and were with us through the 2020-21 academic year.

Of that group, all have challenged for a travel roster spot while **Robert Kraklow** (LT), **Luke Shepherd (TE), Nathan Gimza** (WR) and **Mason Van Zeeland** (WR) have earned starting roles.

Kraklow is a returning All-NSIC North Division Second Team offensive lineman, while Gimza was leading the team in catches (11), yards (153) and long (65) before an injury has held him out after three games.

Van Zeeland leads the team with a 21.4 yard per catch average, leading the team with 214 yards on 10 catches including a touchdown. Half of Van Zeeland's 10 catches have been for at least 25 yards with a long of 42.

Shepherd had ascended to the top of the TE depth chart before falling victim to injury ahead of week 4 and has not returned.

The roster includes 25 redshirt freshmen, players who did not compete in 2019 in their first year of college football whether it was at CSP or elsewhere.

Key contributors from the redshirt-freshmen group include starting wide receiver **Mason Van Zeeland** (10-214, 1 TD), starting guard **Brody Card** (5 GS), while **Elliott Wolfe** picked up a start and is projected to start again in week 7. Joining Van Zeeland on the outside, **Evan Peterson** has played all six games with 3-20 receiving and a 40-yard TD pass.

Defensively, in the secondary both cornerback McKinley Egland-Young (2 GS) and safety Davaris Cheeks have cracked the starting lineup. Up front, Isaac Reed had received early playing time before an injury has kept him from rejoining the lineup.

Overall, a number of others from the 2019 redshirt freshmen group have earned playing time and spots on the travel roster, as well.

The bigger number is 57 true freshmen, players who had their first season as college student-athletes in the 2020-21 academic year that didn't lose eligibility, as well as first year players new to Concordia in 2021-22.

Second year freshmen (COVID-freshmen) who have made an impact on the field include: starting right tackle Jac Carver who ascended into the starting role in week 4, starting linebacker Caden Baarts who earned his first career start in week 5, starting safety Cyrus McClure who has been in and out of the lineup due to injury, special teams safety Anthony Ukofia, special teams linebackers Brayden Hilgemann, Max Giannini, Karson Vigeland and El-Osiris Jeudy, kicker Sam Henson, special teams defensive back Kahlil Robinson, starting quarterback Corner Cordts, backup quarterback Bryce Sievers, starting running back Jaylin Richardson, and reserve running back Brandon Marenco. Tight ends Riley Heller and Jack Dodd also earned playing time the past two weeks.

True first year freshmen making an early impact on the roster include: wide receiver Jahiem Arnold, punter Parker Dahlman and defensive tackle Brad Walker while two other true freshmen have travelled but yet to make their debuts: running backs Keron Franklin and TJ Holmes.

SKILL POSITION TURNOVER

The Golden Bears entered 2021 looking to replace all but one passing attempt (**Abe Schwartz**), 88 percent of its rushing yards with its leading returner being **Lajuan Preston** (177) and over 90 percent of its receptions with its leader being **Kevin Ventura-Cortes** (11-76).

PRESTON BOOSTED BY DI TALENT IN BACKFIELD

Concordia's running game entered 2021 led by junior **Lajuan Preston**, the top returner from a strong and versatile rushing attack in 2019. "LP" has played in 31 career games with 1,1,23 rushing yards and a 5.7 career average. His breakout year was in 2018 when he averaged 6.5 per carry and rushed for 704 yards.

He was off to another strong start in 2019 with 177 yards in four games with two touchdowns and a 5.5 average before a season-ending injury.

He had his biggest outing in week 6 against Bemidji State, breaking a 71-yard TD run early in the third quarter amid a 9-83 rushing day. He's the team's second leading rusher with 110 yards and leads the team in average among players with at least 20 carries.

He's aided by Purdue junior transfer **Brian Lankford-Johnson** and Northern Iowa freshman transfer **Jaylin Richardson**.

Lankford-Johnson played in 12 games including a start in 2016 as a freshman for the Boilermakers, earning Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors with 18 carries for 127 yards and a touchdown against Illinois and finished the year second on the team with 314 yards on the ground and 6.5 per carry, adding the team's longest run (48) and 11 catches for 90 yards. He played in six games as a sophomore with 22-86 rushing before deciding to transfer to CSP for the spring 2020 term

Richardson was a highly recruited RB from the Kansas City area, initially committing to Kansas before signing with Northern lowa where he was an early enrollee in spring 2020. He made his debut in the 2021 COVID shortened

spring season for the Panthers, and retained his full eligibility for his first year with CSP.

In 2021, Richardson leads the CSP backfield with 56 carries for 194 rushing yards with two TDs and has added 14-77 receiving. He had team-highs of 7-69 receiving in his debut at Winona State.

Lankford-Johnson is third on the team with 89 rushing yards including a long run of 27 at Minnesota State.

New to the scene, second year freshman running back **Brandon Marenco** made his debut in week 5 at Minnesota State with eight carries for 67 yards and the team's longest run of the year, a 36-yard TD against the Mavericks.

GROUND CONTROL LEADS TO VICTORIES

Since 2016 when **Shannon Currier** returned to CSP's sidelines, Concordia has rushed for 200-plus yards 11 times, producing an 8-3 record.

By contrast, when Concordia holds opponents under 100 yards, the Golden Bears are also 8-3.

Just five times since 2016 have the Golden Bears rushed for 200-plus and held an opponent to under 100 yards in the same game - with CSP producing a 4-1 record in those contests, most recently a 2019 week 10 win over SMSU.

OFFENSIVE LINE NOTES

While the Golden Bears replaced four starting offensive linemen, the unit brings back plenty of experience led by transfer tackle **Robert Kraklow**, an All-NSIC North Division Second Team performer at St. Cloud State and former Division I player at Northern Illinois.

The top returner is guard **Matthew Montgomery**, a regular starter at center in 2019, while new center **Sam Marshalek** had stepped into a starting guard role late in 2019. The two players flipped positions on the line for 2021.

At the other tackle opposite Kraklow, freshman **Jac Carver**, a second year player, ascended to the top of the depth chart and started weeks 4, 5 and 6 while the other guard spot has been occupied by **Brody Card**, a redshirt freshman in his third year with starts in the first five games.

The Golden Bears also roll out a sixth offensive lineman multiple times per game, with backup tackle **Jake Edwards** frequently utilized in that capacity. Edwards is atop the depth

chart at right tackle in week 7.

Earning his first start in week 6 was **Elliott Wolfe** at guard, expected to draw another start against UMD with Card returning to the starting lineup.

BROTHERLY LOVE

The 2021 Concordia-St. Paul roster features four sets of brothers: Jake and Jaylin Richardson, Mel and El-Osiris Jeudy, Robby and Austin Carrillo, and Justin and Connor Higgins.

The **Richardsons**, from Kansas City, are newcomers to the program in 2021 as Division I transfers.

Jake, a senior, transferred to CSP from South Dakota where he played 25 games across three seasons for the Coyotes, securing 16 tackles, 5.0 for loss and 5.0 sacks along with two forced fumbles and a fumble recovery. At CSP, he's picked up a pair of sacks, 4.0 tackles for loss and 10 tackles on the year. He's also added a forced fumble and fumble recovery.

Jaylin, a freshman, transferred to CSP from Northern lowa where he competed during UNI's shortened spring season in 2021 and was not charged a season of eligibility due to the COVID-19 pandemic. He made his college football debut against #5 South Dakota State, recording a tackle. He's been a key part of CSP's backfield in 2021, leading the backfield with 46-194 rushing and a pair of TD runs along with 14-77 receiving while contributing 112 combined kick/punt return yards for a team-leading 383 all-purpose yards.

The **Jeudys** are from Miami, Florida with Mel joining the program as a transfer prior to the 2020 spring term and El-Osiris being a freshman during the 2020-21 academic year.

Mel, a junior nose tackle, played three games at Alderson Broaddus University, a Division II program in 2019 after spending his first two years of college football at Division I Eastern Kentucky, including a redshirt season. The junior has played all six games for CSP including five starts up front. His six tackles and 3.0 TFLs in week 6 doubled his season tackles total and pushed him to 4.0 TFLs on the year.

El-Osiris, a freshman linebacker, has also appeared in all fivegames, primarily as a special teams contributor.

The **Carrillos** are offensive linemen from Case High School in Racine, Wisconsin with **Robby** joining the program prior to the 2020 spring term as a transfer from St. Cloud State with four years of eligibility remaining after redshirting with the Huskies in the final season of SCSU's program. He made his CSP debut in week 5 at MSU. **Austin** is a true first year freshman

The **Higgins** are defensive acks from Rochester, Minnesota and the only set of brothers from this group to both join CSP as freshmen. Graduates of John Marshall High School, the duo are each preparing to make their college football debuts.

ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS ON DEFENSE

The Golden Bears have a pair of defensive starters who earned CoSIDA Academic All-America Second Team honors for the 2020-21 academic year, that was held without a season: **Shawn Aarhus** and **Dalton Smerchek**.

Smerchek, a senior linebacker, is a returning 2019 All-NSIC South Division honorable mention performer when he had 60 tackles, 7.5 tackles for loss, 3.0 sacks, led the NSIC with four fumble recoveries and ranked second in the league with three forced fumbles.

He has played in 39 career games with 146 tackles, 13.0 TFL, 3.0 sacks, six fumble recoveries and five forced fumbles.

He led CSP with seven tackles and 1.0 TFL in the season opener at WSU and forced a fumble in week 2's win over Upper Iowa. Through six games, he is fifth on the defense with 29 tackles, 2.5 TFLs and handles long/short snapping duties as a special teams standout.

Aarhus is a junior defensive tackle who has played in 28 career games while stepping into a starting role in 2021. He has 59 total tackles, 7.5 TFL, 5.5 sacks and three fumble recoveries in his career. In 2021, he leads all CSP defensive linemen with 22 tackles.

EXPERIENCED LINEBACKERS GROUP

All three of Concordia's starting linebackers from 2019's 6-5 squad returned for 2021: senior whip **Dalton Smerchek**, junior mike **Jake Portz** and junior sam **Gabe Nkumu**.

Smerchek and Portz earned All-NSIC South Division honorable mention honors in 2019 as Smerchek led the league in fumble recoveries and added 8.5 TFL with 60 tackles while Portz was second in the league with 105 tackles and had an 18 tackle performance, third most in a game in school history. Nkumu, meanwhile, topped Portz's 18 tackles with 19, an NSIC single-game high for 2019 as he finished second on the team with 73 tackles.

In 2021, Smerchek led the team in tackles in week 1 with seven including 1.0 TFL at Winona State and added a forced fumble in week 2 against Upper lowa.

Nkumu was fifth on the defense with 18 tackles including 3.0 TFL through four weeks before missing the last two games due to injury, and Portz has contributed 20 tackles.

The unit was bolstered with the emergence of **Andrew Egnarski**, who has ascended to the starting MLB spot. He had his breakout effort in week 2 against Upper lowa with a team-high 11 tackles, 3.5 TFL, 3.5 sacks, a forced fumble and recovery, earning NSIC Defensive Player of the Week honors.

His 3.5-sack performance is an NSIC single game high while the 3.5 TFL are tied for fourth-most in a game in the NSIC this year.

On the year, Egnarski is seventh in the league with 3.5 sacks. He leads the team with 4.5 TFLs and is second on the team with 33 total tackles.

Adding depth at the position is **Foster Conzet** at the whip, and a tribute to the quality and the depth at the linebacker position, Conzet is leads the team and ranks 18th in the NSIC with 37 total tackles.

With an injury to Nkumu prior to week 5, freshman **Caden Baarts** made his first career start, making a season-high five tackles, a team high for the game, and has 15 tackles on the year.

TRENDING TOPIC: SACKS / WINS CORRELATION

In the 50 games since head coach **Shannon Currier** has been back with the program since 2016, the CSP defense has produced 4-plus sacks 13 times and had more sacks than the opponent 19 times.

In the 4-plus sack games, Concordia has a 10-3 record and has won six of its last seven games when sacking the quarterback four or more times including week 2's five sack performance against Upper Iowa.

When producing more sacks than the opponent which factors line play on both sides, Concordia is 12-8 since 2016.

DEFENSIVE LINE SEES MAJOR TURNOVER

The 2021 Golden Bears were supposed to feature the return of two-time All-American and two-time NSIC sack champion **Chris Garrett**, the NCAA DII career record holder with 15 forced fumbles and CSP career sack record holder.

But Garrett was drafted following the cancelled COVID season in the seventh round by the Los Angeles Rams, making the 53 man roster this fall

He made his NFL debut in week 3 as the Rams beat defending Super Bowl champion Tampa Bay 34-24. In the win, Garrett played four defensive snaps (5%) and six on special teams (20%).

Leaving the program after 2019 with Garrett were the other three outgoing senior starting linemen, as well as three key rotation reserves.

In 2021, the Golden Bears have filled the defensive line with three players who played key roles in 2019: ends **Richard Ficociello** and **Mark O'Reilly** and tackle **Shawn Aarhus** while impact transfers **Mel Jeudy** joined Aarhus in the middle and **Jake Richardson** joined the defensive end rotation.

Aarhus has played in 28 career games with 59 tackles, 7.5 TFL and 5.5 sacks, Ficociello has played in 21 career games with 43 tackles, 7.5 TFL and 2.0 sacks and O'Reilly has secured 24 tackles, 8.5 TFL and 4.0 sacks across 17 career

games.

In 2021, Aarhus leads the line with 22 total tackles followed by Ficociello with 20 tackles. Richardson leads the defensive line with 4.0 TFL and 2.0 sacks while Jeudy has matched him with 4.0 TFL. Ficociello has 3.5 TFL and 1.0 sack. O'Reilly and Aarhus each have 2.0 TFL, as well.

The unit also features SCSU transfer **Luke Dunsmoor** and returners **Keegan Larson** and **Carter Hislop** with freshman **Brad Walker** cracking the rotation in his first year in the program.

Dunsmoor has come on strong as a reserve as of late, making 15 tackles with 1.5 TFL on the year, with 13 of those tackles coming during a three game stretch against USF, SMSU and MSU.

ROOKIE KICKING GAME

Concordia-St. Paul has featured some of the top kickers and punters in the Northern Sun as well as nationally over the past decade, and in 2021 the kicking and punting jobs will be handled by a pair of talented freshmen: second year kicker **Sam Henson** and first year punter **Parker Dahlman**.

Henson had a standout debut, converting his only two field goal attempts from 38 and 48 yards, before adding 3-3 PAT and 1-2 FG in a week 2 win over Upper Iowa. His 48 yard field goal is the second longest in the Northern Sun

this year. Overall, Henson is 5-7 on field goal attempts with his only misses coming from 40 and 52 yards and he leads the team in scoring with 26 points including 11-11 on PATs while adding four kickoff touchbacks in his rookie season.

Dahlman has been busy so far, as well and is second in the league with a 42.1 season punting average on a league-high 41 punts. His nine punts of 50-plus yards is tied for second in the league and he's pinned seven punts pinned inside the 20, just three shy of the league leader.

His 77 yard punt at Sioux Falls is the second longest in the league so far and he holds two of the top five single game punting averages on the year, 50.2 (at USF) is ranked third and 47.3 (at UIU) is ranked fifth.

His first six game pace is on track to set the CSP single season and career punting average records. (see full punting records on page 11)

SHEPLEY VERSUS SHEPLEY

Junior wide receiver **Jake Shepley** will have a chance to play on the same field as his younger brother this Saturday as UMD sophomore defensive back **Marcus Shepley** is a defensive back for the Bulldogs.

Jake is in his fifth year at Concordia-St. Paul, but used a redshirt in 2019 and was not able to compete in 2020 due to COVID-19. In his career at CSP, he's played in 21 games with 14 catches for 236 yards and five TDs.

He also served as the team's primary punter for part of the 2018 season, punting 31 times for a 39.3 average with nine inside the 20, eight punts of 50-plus yards, four fair catches and a long of 66 yards.

Marcus is in his third year as a Bulldog, redshirting in 2019 before the cancelled 2020 season. He had his top defensive performance in week 6 at UMary with four total tackles.

Like his older brother, Marcus also has handled some punting responsibility as a college player, serving as the team's punter in the first two weeks with 10 punts for a 39.0 average, a long of 52 among two punts of 50-plus yards with five inside the 20 and a pair of fair catches.

The two brothers, playing opposite sides of the ball, have a chance to go head-to-head this Saturday.

They have two other older brothers, with Brett Shepley playing football at Augustana University in the NSIC from 2015-19 where he played 41 games, recording 86 catches for 1,239 ayrds and 11 total TDs including a career-best 2018 junior year with 46-674 and six TDs.

Tucker Shepley was a college basketball player, suiting up for Northwestern-St. Paul where he made his debut in 2017-18 for an Eagles team that went 11-5 in the UMAC.

They are the sons of Tom and Deb Shepley of Burnsville, Minnesota.

KORAN & CONZET FACE FORMER TEAM

A pair of Golden Bears have strong seasons, juniors **Isaiah Koran** and **Foster Conzet**, both came to Concordia-St. Paul from UMD and are both originally from the Twin Cities metro area and they both spent the 2016 season at UMD as redshirts.

The 2016 Bulldogs went 10-1 to finish second overall in the NSIC and won the NSIC North with a 7-0 record. UMD qualified for the NCAA Division II Playoffs, with the 13th-ranked Bulldogs falling 59-26 at #9 Emporia State in the first round of the super regional.

Koran is a North St. Paul High School graduate and joined Concordia's roster for 2019, playing in 10 games as a versatile special teams and offensive player, leading the team's kick returning efforts with 10-212 (21.2).

In 2021, Koran is second on the team with 252 all-purpose yards and leads the team with 19 receptions for the second-most yards (185). His top game was a 9-catch, 78-yard performance against SMSU, finishing with 149 all-purpose yards in the game.

Conzet, a Wayzata High School graduate, came to Concordia for the 2018 season and was a two-time Scout Team Player of the Week in his first year before earning a reserve and special teams role in 2019, picking up 31 tackles in 11 games.

In 2021, Conzet leads the Golden Bears with 37 tackles including a career-high nine tackles in two games, first at Sioux Falls with eight solos and again last week against Bemidji State. He's made at least three tackles in every game this season and ranks 17th in the Northern Sun.
