#### THIS WEEK: CSP HEADS TO ND'S CAPITAL CITY

Concordia will make the first of two trips to North Dakota in the season's final three weeks, starting in the capital city, Bismarck to face the University of Mary.

Saturday's game will be Never Surrender Cancer Awareness at the MDU Resources Community Bowl with a 2 p.m. kickoff.

#### CSP LED BY "COACH C" - ALL-TIME WINS LEADER AT CSP

In 2018, head coach **Shannon Currier** became the school's all-time wins leader, winning his 41st game 16-10 at SMSU in week 10 on November 3, 2018, surpassing **Mark Mauer** (40-39), who coached the program for seven seasons from 2004-10.

Currier, now in his 10th overall season at Concordia, carries a 48-48 career record, has a 29-17 home record and is 9-0 in home openers. He's been head coach across two different stints, 2000 to 2003 and 2016-present while also serving as head coach at Truman State for five seasons from 2004-08. He was 2003 NSIC Coach of the Year, leading the program to its first NSIC Championship and the program's first-ever postseason appearance at the 2003 Mineral Water Bowl

#### **2021 TEAM CAPTAINS**

CSP head coach **Shannon Currier** features rotating team captains each week for the third year in a row in 2021. Captains are

selected by the coaching staff based on performance on the field and as a leader in practice, meetings and day-to-day activities.

This week's game captains: junior safety **Rhett Sheehan** (4x) and junior defensive end **Richard Ficociello** (2x) from the defense while sophomore center **Sam Marshalek** (7x) and junior guard **Matthew Montgomery** (2x) represent the offense. #### SMERCHEK SELECTED FOR BILLY BROWN'S #26 IN 2021

Senior linebacker **Dalton Smerchek** changed jersey numbers from 32 to 26 to honor **Billy Brown, Jr.**, a linebacker who graduated from CSP in May of 2018. Billy passed away in 2018 shortly after graduating while working out near his home in the Twin Cities in June. Head coach **Shannon Currier** has opted to honor Brown by selecting a player who fits Billy's work ethic and commitment to the program to wear the number each season.

A native of Casco, Wisconsin, Smerchek has played in all 41 games over his career, recording 158 tackles, 14.0 tackles for loss, 3.0 sacks, seven fumble recoveries and five forced fumbles. In 2021, the senior has compiled 41 tackles (24 solo) with 3.5 for loss, a forced fumble and fumble recovery.

He is a CoSIDA Academic All-America Second Team selection from 2020-21 and was an All-NSIC South Division honorable mention performer in 2019 when he made 60 tackles, 8.5 for loss, had three sacks, four fumble recoveries and three forced fumbles.

"It was an honor to wear Billy's number when the coaches asked me!" said Smerchek. "Billy was one of my main role models my freshman year, showing me how to take on college football and college in general. He strived to "Be Great!" and brought others with him."

#### **NOTES ABOUT THE MARAUDERS**

UMary enters play with a 2-6 overall record and 1-2 NSIC North mark and a 3-game losing streak to UMD (31-27), at Sioux Falls (34-14) and at home to MSU Moorhead (35-31). The Marauders have scored 27-plus points six times on the year but have also surrendered at least 23 points in every game, with opponents topping 30 in all but one game.

UMary's two wins were a 45-23 win in week 3 at SMSU and a 49-42 week 5 win at Northern State, with the Marauders looking to not only snap a 3-game overall losing streak, but a 3-game home losing streak with their last home win a 44-15 win over UM Crookston in week 11 of 2019 (11/16/19).

Once again, the Golden Bear secondary, ranked 2nd in the NSIC (205.9 pass yds/game) will face a top-flight NSIC passing offense as the Marauders lead the league & 2nd in DII with 338.2 passing yards per game, a 13.8 gap on second place BSU and 28.7 yard edge on 3rd place NSU - 2 of CSP's last 3 opponents.

UMary QB **Logan Nelson** has a 27-5 TD-INT ratio and 2,563 yards (320.4) and is 2nd in the NSIC in pass efficiency (157.9) and 1 TD shy of the league lead. The Marauders have passed for 300+ yards in 6-of-8 games with a high of 454 at Northern State, with Nelson throwing 6 TDs against the Wolves.

Danny Kittner leads all college football players (FBS, FCS, II, III) in catches (88) and is 2nd in receiving yards (1,153), TD catches (13) and all-purpose yards (1,584) while leading all DII receivers with his 88-1,153-13 line. He had a high of 13-235 with 3 TDs against Winona State, and had 3 TDs against UMD (13-133).

He's flanked by one of the other top WRs in the nation, **Luke Little**, who is tied for the DII lead with 13 TDs, ranks 7th in DII in yards (899) and 6th with 64 catches.

The Marauders don't ignore the run, with **David Small** ranking 5th NSIC with 639 rushing yards and averaging 5.1 per carry with 5 TDs.

**Tylen Small** leads the Marauder defense with 58, ranking 9th in the NSIC. **Jack Berry** is the only UMary player with multiple sacks (2.0) as the team has just 6.0 on the year, with Barry leading the team with 6.5 TFLs. The Marauders also have only caused 7 turnovers with **Isaiah Pittman** recording 2 INT and 5 PBU with 45 tackles to lead the group.

#### **SERIES HISTORY: CONCORDIA 4, UMARY 4**

Concordia and UMary enter the ninth meeting between the programs tied at four wins apiece with the away team dominating the all-time series which tilted in the visitor's direction each of the first five matchups before UMary finally defended its home turf with a 20-13 win in 2014 in Bismarck.

In head coach Shannon Currier's return to the program in 2016, Concordia picked up its first home win over UMary with a 17-0 shutout to open the season.

Currier is 2-0 against UMary, heading to Bismarck in 2018 for a 17-7 win, making six of the eight all-time meetings decided in the quest's favor.

Concordia is 3-1 in four all-time trips to North Dakota's capital city, where the winning team has never scored more than 22 points in a contest at a stadium that typically features strong wind. In fact, in the all-time series, the 30-point threshold has only been crossed twice, with UMary scoring 37 points in 2007 at Griffin Stadium in a 37-20 Marauder win, and they scored 32 points in a 32-26 win at Sea Foam Stadium in 2012.

Concordia's high score against UMary was the 26 points scored in defeat in 2012, and the winning team in the series has a 23.6 scoring average across the eight games.

#### LAST MEETING, 2018: CONCORDIA 17, UMARY 7

The Golden Bears spoiled the Marauders homecoming on a windy Saturday, breaking a scoreless tie at the halftime break with a 10-0 margin in the third quarter.

The Golden Bears' win on the road snapped a 13-game road losing streak and was CSP's first win at UMary since 2008, improving to 3-1 all-time on the road against the Marauders.

The Golden Bears rushed a school record 63 times in the win, breaking a 1992 record set against William Penn with 60 carries, the only two times 60 rushes has been topped in program history. CSP gained 206 yards on the ground while the defense held the Marauders to 61 rushing yards on 32 attempts.

The defense was the key in 2018's road win, as safety **Dez Bassett** broke the scoreless tie with a 77-yard INT returned for touchdown in the third quarter, while defensive end **Chris Garrett** had 3.0 sacks, giving him 8.0 on the year in six games.

In the fourth quarter with 2:11 to play and CSP clinging to a 10-7 lead and driving, quarterback **Dom McKinzy** took a keeper on a 4th-and-2 for a 26-yard TD run for a 17-7 lead. The dual-threat senior navigated the tricky conditions with 20 carries for 70 yards while completing 12-of-22 for 129 yards.

Concordia's only field goal of the game, a 24-yarder from **Jonas Schenderlein**, capped an impressive 14-play, 92-yard drive that drained 6:44 off the clock as CSP drove into the wind from its own 1-yard line in the third quarter.

UMary's lone touchdown came following a strip-sack returned 52 yards to the CSP 3-yard line, scoring on the ground on the next play, making it 10-7 with 10:43 to go.

Concordia's defense held from there, though, limiting the Marauders to just one yard on seven plays across two possessions the rest of the way, going 0-3 from the air with Garrett producing one of his three sacks on 3rd-and-10 with Bassett breaking up the 4th-down pass on the following play with 1:33 to go deep in Marauder territory.

In between, CSP used 4:16 of precious clock time, marching 85 yards on 10 plays to set up McKinzy's 4th-down TD rush.

Concordia had 12:39 to 2:21 in time of possession in the fourth quarter alone, and held the Marauders to eight plays for four yards. For the game, CSP had a 38:18 to 21:42 edge in clock time and 337 to 150 yards of total offense.

## LAST WEEK: NORTHERN STATE 38, CONCORDIA 17

The Golden Bears carried leads through the end of the first quarter (7-3) and halftime (17-10) but couldn't overcome Northern State's three third quarter touchdowns, falling 38-17 at Sea Foam Stadium in St. Paul.

Concordia held one of the top passers in the country, **Hunter Trautman**, to just 8-17 passing for 69 yards with a TD and an INT in the first half, despite entering play averaging over 300 yards per game with a 24-2 TD-INT ratio.

This was despite playing without senior cornerbacks **Preston Piltoff, Kyle Moses and Lorenzo Kendricks** as freshmen

McKinley Egland-Young and Kahlil Robinson locked down the corners with safeties Rhett Sheehan, Davaris Cheeks and Cyrus McClure playing solid coverage as well, with the front seven adding solid pressure.

Sheehan added his third interception of the year, picking Trautman off in the end zone to end a scoring threat after a second quarter 57-yard fake punt pass put the Wolves in the red zone.

Later in the quarter, CSP turned it over on downs in NSU territory, with Trautman completing a pass across the 50 yard line on the next play, but McClure's strip was recovered by Cheeks.

After CSP went ahead 17-10 late in the half, the Wolves broke a 74-yard kickoff return with under 30 seconds left, but **Shawn Aarhus** blocked the Wolves' field goal as time expired for a third pivotal play by the defense in the quarter.

In the third quarter, Trautman figured it out, completing five passes for 110 yards with two TD passes, while the Wolves added an INT-for-TD to pull ahead 31-17. NSU scored once more midway through the fourth to ice the game.

CSP quarterback **Abe Schwartz** registered career-highs of 22 completions on 37 attempts for 200 yards and added highs of 13 carries for 32 yards on the ground. He had one TD pass and was intercepted once in his second career start.

He found **Joey Farley** nine times in the short passing game for 39 yards, with Farley scoring from six yards out in the second quarter for a 14-3 lead. **Isaiah Koran** also had five catches in the game for 45 yards, while Schwartz hit on big passes to **Evan Peterson** (28 yards) and **Jahiem Arnold** (31 yards).

The run game produced its second 150-plus yard performance of the year, rushing 42 times for 156 yards led by **Brian Lankford-Johnson's** season-highs of 17 carries for 55 yards and a TD, while **Brandon Marenco** added 10-51 rushing.

Defensively, McClure led the team with nine tackles while fellow-defensive backs were all among the team leaders: Robinson (5), Sheehan (5) and Egland-Young (4). **Dalton Smerchek** chipped in five tackles and had a fumble recovery while **Andrew Egnarski** had four tackles including a sack.

The Wolves' Trautman finished below his season pace with 225 yards on 18-31 passing with three TDs and one INT, rushing for 31 yards on seven attempts. He found **Dewaylon Ingram** for two of his TD strikes, going for 6-87 on the day, but CSP shut down one of the league's top receivers as **Dakota Larson** had 2-33.

#### FROM THE "GRIFF MYTH" TO "HOME SWEET FOAM"

Prior to head coach **Shannon Currier** returning to lead the Golden Bears, CSP had posted an 11-24 record at Sea Foam Stadium (2009 to 2015) and had never posted more than two home wins in a row with just two winning seasons since football returned to campus in 2009.

In Currier's first season back, the Bears won the 2016 home opener and did so again to start the 2017 season.

In 2017, CSP also nabbed a win in the home finale, a 37-20 win over SMSU that started a three game home winning streak including the first two games of 2018 for the first time in Sea Foam Stadium's history. It was also the first three game home winning streak since the 2005 NSIC Championship season, played down the street at St. Paul Central High School's Griffin Stadium.

In Currier's first term leading the Bears (2000-03), he posted an 18-2 home record at Griffin Stadium, starting the "Griff Myth," a 19-game home winning streak that began in 2002 and spanned four full seasons of perfect home football (2002, 2003, 2004, 2005).

Currier now holds a 29-17 career record in home games at Concordia, a perfect 9-0 mark in home openers, a 4-4 mark in home finales and led the team to a winning record at Sea Foam Stadium in 2018 for the third time since 2009.

The Golden Bears are now 11-15 at Sea Foam Stadium under Currier since 2016 including winning seasons in 2018 (3-2) and 2019 (4-2), the only back-to-back winning seasons in Sea Foam Stadium's history.

#### **NEW TO THE NORTH**

The 2021 Golden Bears have shifted to the NSIC North Division after the elimination of football at St. Cloud State University and the University of Minnesota Crookston - both former members of the North Division.

The result of the 14-team NSIC is two 7-team divisions, where each program plays the other six teams once every year, rotating between home sites, while facing five of the seven teams from the opposite division.

Previously, CSP played seven games against the NSIC South Division, with that total cut down by two in 2021; and played the

NSIC North four times, with that total increased by two.

In 2021, Concordia will not face Wayne State for the first time since joining the league in 1999, or Augustana for the first time since 2004, including four non-conference games with the Vikings each year from 2004 to 2007 with Augie joining the NSIC in 2008.

The Golden Bears will now face every NSIC North team at home every other year, which means they will welcome MSU Moorhead to Sea Foam Stadium for just the third time when the Dragons visit St. Paul on November 6. Meanwhile, Minnesota Duluth won't come to St. Paul this year, and has only played at Sea Foam Stadium twice as well, in 2012 and 2016.

Under head coach **Shannon Currier**, the Golden Bears are 16-14 against the NSIC North Division teams across his career and 5-10 against NSIC North Division teams since rejoining the program in 2016, but still seeking their first division win as members of the NSIC North Division (0-3).

#### TURNOVERS MATTER

Since head coach **Shannon Currier** rejoined the program in 2016, Concordia has produced a 9-6 record when winning the turnover battle. Meanwhile, when losing the turnover battle, CSP is 2-22 and CSP is 5-8 when turnovers are even.

CSP hadn't committed an offensive turnover until week four this year, with the -3 against SMSU leading to a 34-24 loss as the Mustangs outscored CSP 14-0 in points off turnovers.

## **HEAD COACH SHANNON CURRIER | 10TH SEASON**



Originally the 8th head coach of CSP football in 2000, Shannon Currier returned to lead the program for his 2nd stint in December, 2015.

He became the program's all-time wins leader on November 3, 2018 with a 16-10 win at SMSU.

In his first stint, he compiled a 32-12 (.727) record and brought the program its first NSIC Championship in 2003 when he was named NSIC Coach of the Year. The conference

title also brought a berth in the Mineral Water Bowl, the first postseason game in school history.

He coached Concordia to four consecutive winning seasons and is the only coach in program history to achieve the feat - consecutive or cumulative.

#### THE GRIFF MYTH - PROTECTING HOME TURF

The team also established the longest home winning streak in school history under his guidance. Known to teams of the era as the "Griff Myth," Concordia tallied 19 consecutive home victories down the street at Griffin Stadium. The streak began in 2002 and stretched two years after Currier left through the 2005 season, finally falling at the beginning of 2006.

In Currier's first four years, his teams only lost two home games, producing a record of 18-2 after winning his first and last nine home games.

He opened his return to the program with a 17-0 shutout win over U-Mary in 2016, snapping a 6-game home losing streak and a former school record 8-game overall losing streak. His CSP teams are 9-0 all-time in home openers and he holds a career 29-17 home mark at Concordia between Griffin & Sea Foam Stadium.

#### CAREER AT TRUMAN

Following the program's 2003 NSIC title run, Currier accepted the head coach position at Truman State where he turned a losing program into a pair of 6-5 winning campaigns in his 3rd and 4th seasons.

His tenure was highlighted in his third year, leading the Bull-dogs to a 6-3 record in a strong MIAA, finishing fourth in the league. He left the program following a 4-7 season in 2008 with a 20-35 overall record.

#### PRIOR TO REJOINING CONCORDIA'S SIDELINES

Following his departure from Truman, Currier spent seven years working outside of the coaching profession as a senior sales manager with iHigh.com working to build a digital platform for high school sports, reaching up to 1.5 million Minnesotans in his final year with the company.

#### **NSIC BACKGROUND & ST. PAUL PRIVATE EDUCATION**

He arrived at Concordia in 1999 as offensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator for former head coach and athletics director Dan O'Brien, now an assistant coach for the University of Minnesota.

Prior to joining Concordia, Currier spent two years each in similar roles at Southwest Minnesota State and Minnesota Crookston following his start in college coaching at Bemidji

Sophomore quarterback **Abe Schwartz**, now in his fourth year in the program, assumed the starting quarterback position in weeks 7 and 8. He had attempted just one pass prior to the 2021 season, but in his first start in week 7 at UMD, completed his first career TD pass on a 67-yard deep sideline route to **Mason Van Zeeland**, and added his second TD pass late in the game to **Brian Lankford-Johnson**. He finished the game taking all of the snaps under center, completing 12-22 for 154 yards, two TDs and one INT, adding 6-28 rushing with a long of 11.

In his second start, Schwartz bested all of his previous careerhighs set at UMD, by completing 22-37 for 200 yards and rushing 13 times for 32 yards, adding 1 TD and 1 INT against Northern State.

On the year, Schwartz is 41-73 (56.2%) for 398 yards with a 3-3 TD-INT ratio.

#### **QB SHUFFLE IN WEEK SIX**

In Concordia's 42-14 loss in week six, four different players completed a pass in the contest. Starter Conner Cordts (1-of-1) left the game following a running play in the first quarter, did not return and is no longer listed on the team's official two-deep. Sophomore backup Abe Schwartz (5-of-8) also left the game following a running play and did not return to the field, but was able to return and start week 7 at UMD. Third string freshman quarterback Bryce Sievers made his most extended appearance under center, finishing the rest of the game and leading the team in pass completions (9), attempts (16) and yards (83). The second completion of the day actually belonged to wide receiver Evan Peterson on a double-pass, finding Jake Shepley for a 40-yard TD strike.

#### FRESHMAN QB CONNER CORDTS

The Golden Bears entered 2021 with freshman **Conner Cordts** declared the starter, just the second freshman opening day starting quarterback for the program since moving to NCAA Division II in 1999, joining CSP Athletic Hall of Famer, two-time NSIC Champion and a former Harlon Hill candidate **James McNear** (2002-05).

Cordts is the seventh freshman to start a game at quarterback since CSP football has been a Division II program (1999) - all of them having used a redshirt season prior to making their debut.

He made his debut at Winona State, completing 25-of-40 for 130 yards while leading the team in rushing with 39 yards on 11 attempts. He did not commit any turnovers.

His breakout game was a week 2 win over Upper lowa, completing 20-of-27 for 249 yards and two touchdowns, once again playing turnover-free football under center.

Cordts topped the 300-yard mark for total offense in a game for the first time in week 4 against SMSU, passing for 260 yards and three TDs and rushing for 41 yards on nine attempts (301).

It took him until his fourth career game until committing his first turnover, an interception that snapped a streak of 111 consecutive passes without an INT to start his career.

Injured in week six, the rookie signal-caller committed only one turnover in 2021 and has a new streak of 28 passes without an INT. The team does not publicly release injury status updates or timelines for return.

## PILTOFF PRESEASON NATIONALLY-RANKED CORNERBACK

Senior cornerback **Preston Piltoff** is on the national map, ranked as the #4 cornerback in the country by CFB Network entering the 2021 season. He led the league in pass breakups as a junior in 2019, also leading the team with two interceptions including one for a 92 yard touchdown - the longest INT in the NSIC in 2019.

In 2021, he is fifth on the team with 31 tackles along with 23 solo stops and a team-high seven pass breakups. His seven PBUs rank third in the Northern Sun, just one shy of the coleague leaders. He had a season-high three pass breakups in week 7 at UMD.

He was unable to play in week 8 against Northern State, but is included on the team's travel roster for week 9 at UMary.

Piltoff is a junior college transfer, competing at Grossmont College in 2018 with 36 tackles, eight pass breakups and two interceptions after an All-Conference freshman year at Shasta College with 16 tackles and five pass breakups.

Coach Currier and his staff successfully recruited 11 members of the 2019 SCSU football team, and one from UMC.

Robby Carrillo, Luke Dunsmoor, Jake Edwards, Nathan Gimza, Taylon Hensley, Sarek Hoerth, Robert Kraklow, Dominic LaCombe, Luke Shepherd, Mason Van Zeeland and Nick Webley all joined Concordia from SCSU while Ryan Martin changed his golden from the Eagles to the Bears. They've been part of the campus community since the pandemic shortened spring 2020 semester and were with us through the 2020-21 academic year.

Of that group, all have challenged for a travel roster spot while **Robert Kraklow** (LT), **Taylon Hensley (RG)**, **Luke Shepherd (TE)**, **Nathan Gimza** (WR) and **Mason Van Zeeland** (WR) have earned at least one start.

Kraklow is a returning All-NSIC North Division Second Team offensive lineman and has started every game in 2021

While Gimza was leading the team in catches (11), yards (153) and long (65) before an injury has held him out after three games, Van Zeeland has stepped forward to lead the team with a 22.8 yard per catch average and receiving yards (296) with a pair of touchdowns. Six of Van Zeeland's 13 catches have been for at least 25 yards including his season-long of 67 yards for a TD in week 7 against UMD.

Shepherd had ascended to the top of the TE depth chart before falling victim to injury ahead of week 4 and has not returned while Hensley made his first start at right quard in week 7.

#### **DIVISION I TRANSFERS**

The Golden Bears have infused the roster with nine players who have experience as members of NCAA Division I programs on the roster. Of the nine, seven have earned starts this season:

#### THREE FRESHMEN CLASSES?!

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic forcing the cancellation of NSIC football in 2021, and the eligibility waivers handed down by the NCAA, the Golden Bears have a large number of freshmen on the roster.

The roster includes 25 redshirt freshmen, players who did not compete in 2019 in their first year of college football whether it was at CSP or elsewhere.

Key contributors from the redshirt-freshmen group include starting wide receiver **Mason Van Zeeland** (13-296, 2 TD), starting guard **Brody Card** (7 GS), while **Elliott Wolfe** and **Taylon Hensley** each picked up starts in week 6 & 7, respectively. Joining Van Zeeland on the outside, **Evan Peterson** has played all eight games with 7-72 receiving and a 40-yard TD pass.

Defensively, in the secondary both cornerback **McKinley Egland-Young** (4 GS) and safety **Davaris Cheeks** (3 GS) have cracked the starting lineup. Up front, **Isaac Reed** had received early playing time before an injury has kept him from rejoining the lineup.

Overall, a number of others from the 2019 redshirt freshmen group have earned playing time and spots on the travel roster, as well.

The bigger number is 57 true freshmen, players who had their first season as college student-athletes in the 2020-21 academic year that didn't lose eligibility, as well as first year players new to Concordia in 2021-22.

Second year freshmen (COVID-freshmen) who have made an impact on the field include: starting right tackle **Jac Carver** who ascended into the starting role in week 4 and earned three starts before missing week 7 due to injury, starting linebacker **Caden Baarts** who has started every

game since week 5, starting safety **Cyrus McClure** (3 GS) who has been in and out of the lineup due to injury, special teams safety **Anthony Ukofia**, special teams linebackers **Brayden Hilgemann**, **Max Giannini**, **Karson Vigeland** and **El-Osiris Jeudy**, kicker **Sam Henson**, special teams defensive back **Kahlil Robinson** who picked up his first start in week 8 at corner, starting quarterback **Conner Cordts**, backup quarterback **Bryce Sievers**, starting running back **Jaylin Richardson**, and reserver running back **Brandon Marenco**. Tight ends **Riley Heller** and **Jack Dodd** also earned playing time across the last four weeks.

True first year freshmen making an early impact on the roster include: wide receiver **Jahiem Arnold**, punter **Parker Dahlman** and defensive tackle **Brad Walker**.

#### SKILL POSITION TURNOVER

The Golden Bears entered 2021 looking to replace all but one passing attempt (Abe Schwartz), 88 percent of its rushing yards with its leading returner being Lajuan Preston (177) and over 90 percent of its receptions with its leader being Kevin Ventura-Cortes (11-76).

#### PRESTON BOOSTED BY DI TALENT IN BACKFIELD

Concordia's running game entered 2021 led by junior Lajuan Preston, the top returner from a strong and versatile rushing attack in 2019. "LP" has played in 31 career games with 1,123 rushing yards and a 5.7 career average. His breakout year was in 2018 when he averaged 6.5 per carry and rushed for 704 yards.

He was off to another strong start in 2019 with 177 yards in four games with two touchdowns and a 5.5 average before a season-ending injury.

He had his biggest outing of 2021 in week 6 against Bemidji State, breaking a 71-yard TD run early in the third quarter amid a 9-83 rushing day. He was the team's second leading rusher with 110 yards and leads the team in average among players with at least 20 carries. He's missed the last two games with injury and is not among the travel party in week 9.

He's aided by Purdue junior transfer **Brian Lankford-Johnson** and Northern Iowa freshman transfer **Jaylin Richardson**.

Lankford-Johnson played in 12 games including a start in 2016 as a freshman for the Boilermakers, earning Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors with 18 carries for 127 yards and a touchdown against Illinois and finished the year second on the team with 314 yards on the ground and 6.5 per carry, adding the team's longest run (48) and 11 catches for 90 yards. He played in six games as a sophomore with 22-86 rushing before deciding to transfer to CSP for the spring 2020 term.

Richardson was a highly recruited RB from the Kansas City area, initially committing to Kansas before signing with Northern lowa where he was an early enrollee in spring

2020. He made his debut in the 2021 COVID shortened spring season for the Panthers, and retained his full eligibility for his first year with CSP.

In 2021, Richardson leads the CSP backfield with 74 carries for 234 rushing yards with two TDs and has added 15-85 receiving. He had team-highs of 7-69 receiving in his debut at Winona State.

Lankford-Johnson is second on the team with 151 rushing yards including a long run of 27 at Minnesota State. He had his top performance of the year in week 8 with 17 carries for 55 yards and a TD.

New to the scene, second year freshman running back **Brandon Marenco** made his debut in week 5 at Minnesota State with eight carries for 67 yards and the team's longest run of the year, a 36-yard TD against the Mavericks. After missing multiple games due to injury, Marenco returned with a 10-carry, 51-yard game in week 8 against Northern State but injury will force him to miss week 9. In parts of just three games, Marenco is third on the team in rushing with 117 yards and would lead the team in average (6.2) with just one more carry to qualify (min. 20).

All four of the team's top rushers, Richardson (234), Lankford-Johnson (151), Marenco (117) and Preston (110) will not make the trip in week 9 to UMary.

#### **GROUND CONTROL LEADS TO VICTORIES**

Since 2016 when **Shannon Currier** returned to CSP's sidelines, Concordia has rushed for 200-plus yards 11 times, producing an 8-3 record.

By contrast, when Concordia holds opponents under 100 yards, the Golden Bears are also 8-3.

Just five times since 2016 have the Golden Bears rushed for 200-plus and held an opponent to under 100 yards in the same game - with CSP producing a 4-1 record in those contests, most recently a 2019 week 10 win over SMSU.

#### **OFFENSIVE LINE NOTES**

While the Golden Bears replaced four starting offensive linemen, the unit brings back plenty of experience led by transfer tackle **Robert Kraklow**, an All-NSIC North Division Second Team performer at St. Cloud State and former Division I player at Northern Illinois.

The top returner is guard Matthew Montgomery, a regular

starter at center in 2019, while new center **Sam Mar-shalek** had stepped into a starting guard role late in 2019. The two players flipped positions on the line for 2021.

At the other tackle opposite Kraklow, freshman **Jac Carver**, a second year player, ascended to the top of the depth chart and started weeks 4, 5 and 6 before missing week 7 due to injury while the other guard spot has been primarily occupied by **Brody Card**, a redshirt freshman in his third year with six starts in the first seven weeks.

Marshalek and Kraklow have each started every game of the season, while Card and Montgomery have started all but one game each at the guard spots.

The Golden Bears also roll out a sixth offensive lineman multiple times per game, with backup tackle **Jake Edwards** frequently utilized in that capacity. Edwards has started the last two games at right tackle.

Earning first career starts in weeks six and seven hae been **Elliott Wolfe** and **Taylon Hensley**, respectively.

On the year, nine different offensive linemen have earned starts up front, with three others also earning game reps.

#### **BROTHERLY LOVE**

The 2021 Concordia-St. Paul roster features four sets of brothers: Jake and Jaylin Richardson, Mel and El-Osiris Jeudy, Robby and Austin Carrillo, and Justin and Connor Higgins.

The **Richardsons**, from Kansas City, are newcomers to the program in 2021 as Division I transfers.

Jake, a senior, transferred to CSP from South Dakota where he played 25 games across three seasons for the Coyotes, securing 16 tackles, 5.0 for loss and 5.0 sacks along with two forced fumbles and a fumble recovery. At CSP, he's picked up a pair of sacks, 4.0 tackles for loss and 10 tackles on the year. He's also added a forced fumble and fumble recovery.

Jaylin, a freshman, transferred to CSP from Northern lowa where he competed during UNI's shortened spring season in 2021 and was not charged a season of eligibility due to the COVID-19 pandemic. He made his college football debut against #5 South Dakota State, recording a tackle. He's been a key part of CSP's backfield in 2021, leading the backfield with 74-234 rushing and a pair of TD runs along with 15-85 receiving while contributing 112 combined kick/punt return yards for a team-leading 431 all-purpose yards.

The Richardsons have both been hit by injuries recently and are not part of the week 9 travel roster.

The **Jeudys** are from Miami, Florida with Mel joining the program as a transfer prior to the 2020 spring term and El-Osiris being a freshman during the 2020-21 academic very

Mel, a junior nose tackle, played three games at Alderson Broaddus University, a Division II program in 2019 after spending his first two years of college football at Division I Eastern Kentucky, including a redshirt season. The junior has played all eight games for CSP including seven starts up front. His six tackles and 3.0 TFLs in week 6 doubled his season tackles total and pushed him to 4.0 TFLs on the year. He now has 13 total tackles and 4.0 TFLs.

**El-Osiris**, a freshman linebacker, has appeared in six games, primarily as a special teams contributor.

The **Carrillos** are offensive linemen from Case High School in Racine, Wisconsin with **Robby** joining the program prior to the 2020 spring term as a transfer from St. Cloud State with four years of eligibility remaining after redshirting with the Huskies in the final season of SCSU's program. He made his CSP debut in week 5 at MSU and has played four weeks in a row. **Austin** is a true first year freshman.

The **Higgins** are defensive acks from Rochester, Minnesota and the only set of brothers from this group to both join CSP as freshmen. Graduates of John Marshall High School, the duo are each preparing to make their college football debuts.

earned CoSIDA Academic All-America Second Team honors for the 2020-21 academic year, that was held without a season: **Shawn Aarhus** and **Dalton Smerchek**.

Smerchek, a senior linebacker, is a returning 2019 All-NSIC South Division honorable mention performer when he had 60 tackles, 7.5 tackles for loss, 3.0 sacks, led the NSIC with four fumble recoveries and ranked second in the league with three forced fumbles.

He has played in 41 career games with 158 tackles, 14.0 TFL, 3.0 sacks, seven fumble recoveries and five forced fumbles.

Through eight games, he is fourth on the defense with 41 tackles, 3.5 TFLs and handles long/short snapping duties as a special teams standout. He has made seven tackles in a game this season four different times.

Aarhus is a junior defensive tackle who has played in 30 career games while stepping into a starting role in 2021. He has 63 total tackles, 7.5 TFL, 5.5 sacks and three fumble recoveries in his career. In 2021, he is tied for the team lead among CSP defensive linemen with 26 tackles and added a blocked field goal to his season register in week 8 against Northern State.

#### **EXPERIENCED LINEBACKERS GROUP**

All three of Concordia's starting linebackers from 2019's 6-5 squad returned for 2021: senior whip **Dalton Smerchek**, junior mike **Jake Portz** and junior sam **Gabe Nkumu**.

Smerchek and Portz earned All-NSIC South Division honorable mention honors in 2019 as Smerchek led the league in fumble recoveries and added 8.5 TFL with 60 tackles while Portz was second in the league with 105 tackles and had an 18 tackle performance, third most in a game in school history. Nkumu, meanwhile, topped Portz's 18 tackles with 19, an NSIC single-game high for 2019 as he finished second on the team with 73 tackles.

In 2021, Smerchek has produced four games with seven tackles and added 3.5 TFLs, ranking fourth on the defense with 41 total tackles.

Nkumu was fifth on the defense with 18 tackles including 3.0 TFL through four weeks but has been injured since, and Portz has contributed 26 tackles, tied for sixth on the team, while making at least three tackles in six straight games (weeks 2 to 7).

The unit was bolstered with the emergence of **Andrew Egnarski**, who has ascended to the starting MLB spot. He had his breakout effort in week 2 against Upper lowa with a teamigh 11 tackles, 3.5 TFL, 3.5 sacks, a forced fumble and recovery, earning NSIC Defensive Player of the Week honors.

His 3.5-sack performance is an NSIC single game high while the 3.5 TFL are tied for fourth-most in a game in the NSIC this year.

On the year, Egnarski is sixth in the league with 4.5 sacks, 23rd with 45 tackles and 24th with 5.5 TFLs. He also has an interception and a fumble recovery.

Adding depth at the position is **Foster Conzet** at the whip, and a tribute to the quality and the depth at the linebacker position, Conzet is second on the team and ranks 24th in the NSIC with 43 total tackles.

With an injury to Nkumu prior to week 5, freshman **Caden Baarts** stepped in with his first career start in week 5, making a season-high five tackles which led the team for the game at MSU. He has 21 tackles and a pair of pass breakups on the year.

#### SHEEHAN LEADS THE SAFETIES

Junior **Rhett Sheehan**, in his fifth year in the program, has put together a strong campaign in the secondary, tied for second on the team and 24th in the NSIC with 43 total tackles. His three interceptions, all in CSP's four home games, are fifth in the Northern Sun, and he has racked up 85 return yards in the process while adding four pass breakups to tie for the team lead with seven passes defended.

He's had at least four tackles in six straight games including a career-high of 10 against Bemidji State in week 6, adding an INT in the game.

In his career, Sheehan has secured 123 tackles across 30 games, and his 43 tackles in 2021 match his 2019 season total. He has 11 career passes defended.

#### TRENDING TOPIC: SACKS / WINS CORRELATION

In the 52 games since head coach **Shannon Currier** has been back with the program since 2016, the CSP defense has produced 4-plus sacks 13 times and had more sacks than the opponent 20 times.

In the 4-plus sack games, Concordia has a 10-3 record and has won six of its last seven games when sacking the quarterback four or more times including week 2's five sack performance against Upper Iowa.

When producing more sacks than the opponent which factors line play on both sides. Concordia is 12-9 since 2016.

#### **DEFENSIVE LINE SEES MAJOR TURNOVER**

The 2021 Golden Bears were supposed to feature the return of two-time All-American and two-time NSIC sack champion **Chris Garrett**, the NCAA DII career record holder with 15 forced fumbles and CSP career sack record holder.

But Garrett was drafted following the cancelled COVID season in the seventh round by the Los Angeles Rams, making the 53 man roster this fall.

He made his NFL debut in week 3 as the Rams beat defending Super Bowl champion Tampa Bay 34-24. In the win, Garrett played four defensive snaps (5%) and six on special teams (20%)

Leaving the program after 2019 with Garrett were the other three outgoing senior starting linemen, as well as three key rotation reserves.

In 2021, the Golden Bears have filled the defensive line with three players who played key roles in 2019: ends **Richard Ficociello** and **Mark O'Reilly** and tackle **Shawn Aarhus** while impact transfers **Mel Jeudy** joined Aarhus in the middle and **Jake Richardson** joined the defensive end rotation.

Aarhus has played in 30 career games with 63 tackles, 7.5 TFL and 5.5 sacks, Ficociello has played in 23 career games with 49 tackles, 10.5 TFL and 5.0 sacks and O'Reilly has secured 26 tackles, 9.0 TFL and 4.5 sacks across 19 career games.

In 2021, Ficociello has been the top performer, tied for the team lead with Aarhus with 26 total tackles while producing a team-high 6.5 TFLs and second-best 4.0 sacks. Despite missing three games, Richardson has added 4.0 TFL and 2.0 sacks with one FF and one FR from the end. Jeudy has matched Richardson's 4.0 TFL from the interior.

The unit also features SCSU transfer **Luke Dunsmoor**, UMC transfer **Ryan Martin** and returner **Keegan Larson** with first year freshman **Brad Walker** cracking the rotation.

Dunsmoor has come on strong as a reserve, making 17 tackles with 1.5 TFL on the year, with 13 of those tackles coming during a three game stretch against USF, SMSU and MSU. Walker has also started to come into his own, making his frist career sack in week 7 at UMD with a season-high three total tackles against the Bulldogs.

Larson has matched Walker's eight tackles and 2.0 TFLs on the year, as well.

#### **ROOKIE KICKING GAME**

Concordia-St. Paul has featured some of the top kickers and punters in the Northern Sun as well as nationally over the past decade, and in 2021 the kicking and punting jobs will be handled by a pair of talented freshmen: second year kicker **Sam Henson** and first year punter **Parker Dahlman**.

Henson was recently named to the Fred Mitchell Award Watch List for September, become the fourth consecutive CSP kicker to be recognized by the national award which is presented to the top placekicker in small college football (FCS, DII, DIII, NAIA, NJCAA). He's one of 10 named to the list and one of three from NCAA Division II and the only one from the Northern Sun.

Henson had a standout debut, converting his only two field goal attempts from 38 and 48 yards, before adding 3-3 PAT and 1-2 FG in a week 2 win over Upper Iowa.

His 48 yard field goal is the third longest in the Northern Sun this year, he ranks fourth with a 75% FG percentage and sixth with six field goals made.

Overall, Henson is 6-8 on field goal attempts with his only misses coming from 40 and 52 yards and he leads the team in scoring with 32 points including 14-14 on PATs while adding seven kickoff touchbacks in his rookie season.

Dahlman has been busy so far, as well and is fourth in the league with a 40.9 season punting average on a league-high 52 punts. His 10 punts of 50-plus yards leads the league, and his 10 punts inside the 20 is just one shy of the NSIC lead, as well.

His 77 yard punt at Sioux Falls is the third longest in the league so far and he holds the fifth-ranked single game punting average on the year, 50.2 (at USF).

His first seven game average (40.9) puts him within striking distance of CSP single season (41.3) and career (39.3) punting average records.

#### THE SHORT & THE LONG OF IT - DRIVE SUMMARY
