THIS WEEK: CSP CLOSING 2021 AT MINOT STATE

Concordia-St. Paul heads to Minot State in the final contest of the 2021 season, with the Golden Bears and Beavers each seeking their first NSIC North Division victory at Herb Parker Stadium.

Winter has come to the Magic City, located near the Canadian border, with expected high temperature of 36 degrees, a low of 26 and an inch of snow expected along with a 15 mile per hour WNW wind.

CSP LED BY "COACH C" - ALL-TIME WINS LEADER AT CSP

In 2018, head coach **Shannon Currier** became the school's all-time wins leader, winning his 41st game 16-10 at SMSU in week 10 on November 3, 2018, surpassing **Mark Mauer** (40-39), who coached the program for seven seasons from 2004-10.

Currier, now in his 10th overall season at Concordia, carries a 48-50 career record, has a 29-18 home record and is 9-0 in home openers. He's been head coach across two different stints, 2000 to 2003 and 2016-present while also serving as head coach at Truman State for five seasons from 2004-08. He was 2003 NSIC Coach of the Year, leading the program to its first NSIC Championship and the program's first-ever postseason appearance at the 2003 Mineral Water Bowl.

2021 TEAM CAPTAINS

CSP head coach **Shannon Currier** features rotating team captains each week for the third year in a row in 2021. Captains are selected by the coaching staff based on performance on the field and as a leader in practice, meetings and day-to-day activities.

This week's game captains are all from the defensive side of the ball: junior safety/linebacker **Rhett Sheehan** (6x), senior linebacker **Dalton Smerchek** (5x) junior defensive end **Richard Ficociello** (3x) and junior defensive tackle **Shawn Aarhus**. *A full listing of the team captains is available on page 5.*

SMERCHEK SELECTED FOR BILLY BROWN'S #26 IN 2021

Senior linebacker **Dalton Smerchek** changed jersey numbers from 32 to 26 to honor **Billy Brown, Jr.**, a linebacker who graduated from CSP in May of 2018. Billy passed away in 2018 shortly after graduating while working out near his home in the Twin Cities in June. Head coach **Shannon Currier** has opted to honor Brown by selecting a player who fits Billy's work ethic and commitment to the program to wear the number each season.

A native of Casco, Wisconsin, Smerchek has played in all 42 games over his career, recording 160 tackles, 14.0 tackles for loss, 3.0 sacks, seven fumble recoveries and five forced fumbles. In 2021, the senior has compiled 43 tackles (25 solo) with 3.5 for loss, a forced fumble and fumble recovery.

He is a CoSIDA Academic All-America Second Team selection from 2020-21 and was an All-NSIC South Division honorable mention performer in 2019 when he made 60 tackles, 8.5 for loss, had three sacks, four fumble recoveries and three forced fumbles.

"It was an honor to wear Billy's number when the coaches asked me!" said Smerchek. "Billy was one of my main role models my freshman year, showing me how to take on college football and college in general. He strived to 'Be Great!' and brought others with him."

NOTES ABOUT THE BEAVERS

The Beavers enter play seeking their first NSIC North Division victory and are coming off back-to-back losses at home to Minnesota Duluth (21-34) two weeks ago and at UMary (31-49) last week.

After starting the year allowing 48-plus points in the first five games and facing margins of 38-plus in each of the first four games, the Beavers have evened out some of the losses as the season has progressed, falling 49-35 at Bemidji State, 29-17 to MSU Moorhead, 36-35 at Northern State in weeks 5, 6 and 7 before a 17-14 week 8 win at home against Upper Iowa and haven't lost by more than 18 since week 4.

The Beavers are led by the league's second-leading rusher, **Ali Mohamed** with 1,034 yards, just two shy of the league lead and 13th-most in NCAA Division II. He averages 4.8 per carry and has nine total TDs.

Despite Mohamed's 103.4 rushing yards per game, the Beavers check in at ninth in the NSIC with 118.2 rushing yards per game and are allowing 226.1 to opponents with 31 rushing TDs against - both 14th in the NSIC.

Minot State also allows 449.7 per game in total offense, last in the league while gaining 339.6 yards per game to rank 10th.

Three different QBs have guided the Minot offense at times this year led by **Dawson Macleary** with 1,697 yards and an 8-16 TD-INT ratio. **Ben Bolinske** adds 271 yards, a TD and 2 INTs and **Marshaun Campbell** has completed 13-18 (.722) for 183 yards, a TD and 2 INTs.

As a team, Minot has passed for 2,214 yards, 11 TDs and 20 INTs. **Peyton Lamoureux** leads the team with 36 catches for 669 yards, an 18.6 average and 5 TDs while **Nathan Young** (39-458) and **Jaxon Lundeen** (32-297) have posted solid seasons.

Kyle VanBerkom leads the defense with 68 tackles while **Logan Krueger** has a team-best 8.0 TFLs and 4.0 sacks.

Roma'n Grissett has three INTs and five PBUs while **Knynlen Miller-Levi** has defended 11 passes with nine PBUs and a pair of INTs.

Justin Cash leads the NSIC with a 42.9 punt average on 50 punts with 12 inside the 20 and 10 of 50-plus.

SERIES HISTORY: CONCORDIA 6, MINOT STATE 2

The Golden Bears have won six of the eight all-time meetings, with Minot State capturing a win the last time these two teams met in 2019 in Minot, North Dakota (38-31) to snap CSP's five game winning streak.

The teams have split their four meetings played at Herb Parker Stadium including the most recent meeting in 2019.

Under head coach **Shannon Currier**, Concordia is 1-1 against Minot State, winning 24-0 at home in 2017 before the 2019 road loss.

LAST MEETING, 2019: MINOT STATE 38, CONCORDIA 31

The Golden Bears put up a season-high 27 first downs, rolling for 197 rushing yards and 262 passing yards in a balanced day of 459 yards of total offense, but couldn't keep pace with Minot State who had 502 yards of total offense on an unseasonably warm and breezy North Dakota afternoon.

Just a week after CSP had tied the NCAA DII record for most sacks in a game in a win over MSU Moorhead, and a week after Minot State had nearly two feet of snow fall on its home field, it was Minot State who carried the day.

The Beavers' **Ben Bolinske** rushed for 141 yards on 10 carries and completed 14-of-18 for 194 yards, combining for four TDs (3 rush, 1 pass). He wasn't intercepted, sacked or even tackled for a loss on the day.

Concordia linebacker **Gabe Nkumu** had a big day, posting the second-most tackles in a game in school history with 19 including 1.0 TFL.

Golden Bear senior quarterback **Maxon Hutton** had a big day, setting career-highs with 22 completions, 39 attempts and 262 yards passing, adding two TD passes while rushing 13-41 to surpass 300 yards of total offense (303).

He connected with passing TDs twice to **Jabril Clewis** who had 6-77 receiving while fellow senior WR **MJ Williams** had 7-91 receiving with a long of 45 to set up a first quarter FG.

In the backfield, **Shaq Johnson** had 16-69 rushing while **Darios Crawley-Reid** added 76 yards on just eight carries, a 9.5 average and a 24-yard TD run to give CSP a 10-7 lead early in the second quarter.

Trailing 21-10 late in the second quarter, the Golden Bears forced a fumble with **Chris Garrett** recovering in the end zone in a goal line stand, and opened the second half with two long TD drives (14-75, 5:49 & 13-75, 5:48).

Unfortunately, Minot State scored in between CSP's two long drives, and still led 28-24 at the end of three quarters.

In the fourth quarter, CSP kept Minot State out of the end zone in a red zone situation, forcing a short 19-yard field goal to stay within a score (31-24) with 10:03 to play.

But the offense was stopped for a rare 3-and-out and Bolinske answered with a 40-yard rushing score on the next play to push the margin to 38-24 with 7:43 to go.

Although Minot State had excellent field position on its next three possessions (CSP 40 via punt, MINOT 49 via punt, CSP 22 via INT and CSP 43 via inside recovery), the defense held strong in blanking the Beavers the rest of the way.

Offensively, CSP was efficient, moving 78 yards on 8-plays with Hutton capping the drive with a 19-yard TD to Clewis with 1:51 to go.

But the Golden Bears' last possession meant CSP had to go 91 yards in 10 seconds, with the comeback bid falling short.

LAST WEEK: MSU MOORHEAD 24, CONCORDIA 3

The Golden Bears hosted senior day last Saturday, a warm and sunny November afternoon to honor the 19 departing seniors along with third year student assistant coach **Alain Yang**.

But CSP couldn't produce a victory, falling 24-3 to MSU Moorhead. The Golden Bear defense had its hands full again, facing the fifth-ranked passing offense in the league after previously facing the top three passing attacks in the previous four games.

MSU Moorhead entered averaging 274.8 yards per game through the air, and early on the Golden Bear defense delivered.

Concordia held the Dragons to 42 yards on 18 plays in the first quarter including just 36 passing yards, while stopping MSUM to 1-of-5 on third downs along with a fourth stop in at the CSP 17 yard line in the red zone with a pass breakup near the sideline by freshman corner **Kahlil Robinson**.

Concordia, using its third string QB **Bryce Sievers** and mixing in converted safety **Hunter Thompson** as a change-of-pass QB along with converted linebacker **Chandler Dahlquist** at running back, clung to a scoreless tie at the quarter break, the fifth time this season CSP was tied or leading at the end of the first.

In the second quarter, MSUM converted a 4th-and-1 and a 3rd-and-2 to keep a drive alive en route to a short rushing score to break the tie. Three plays later, an INT in CSP territory set-up a 26-yard pass TD on the next play for a sudden 14-0 MSUM advantage just over three and a half minutes into the second quarter.

The defense continued to respond, picking up a 3-and-out and stopped the Dragons the following two possessions to keep the 14-point deficit intact entering halftime.

The Golden Bears issued just 131 yards of offense to the Dragons in the first half, aided by a pair of sacks and three tackles for loss from sophomore **Keegan Larson**.

In the third quarter, Dahlquist rumbled his way for three 5-yard gains on CSP's opening drive, and Sievers added a 7-yard scramble for a first down to jumpstart the ground game.

Sievers would also connect with **Mason Van Zeeland** for 16 yards on 3rd-and-4 from the CSP 43 to move into Dragon territory, and hit **Jaheim Arnold** for 16 yards to move into field goal range, where freshman **Sam Henson** made a 41-yarder, his third 40-plus yard FG of the year while moving to 8-of-11 overall.

Concordia out-gained the Dragons 78-70 in the third quarter with each team making a field goal, and CSP held MSU Moorhead to just 201 yards of total offense through three quarters.

In the fourth quarter, each team had just two possessions, but MSUM's 12-play, 80-yard drive spanning 4:48 of important clock time extended the Dragon lead to 24-3 with 8:18 to go, a three score lead that would prove too much to overcome.

While Larson had a pair of first half sacks, he was joined in the backfield by **Mark O'Reilly** who also finished with a pair of sacks while junior **Luke Dunsmoor** added punch to the DL with 2.0 TFLs on the day.

Dahlquist finished the day with 21 rushing yards on 13 attempts in his first extended look as a ball carrier while Sievers led the team's run game with 8-24 and completed 11-26 for 116 yards.

He found Van Zeeland five times for 61 yards while Arnold had 3-39 receiving.

Dragon quarterback **Tommy Falk** finished a productive day 33-41 for 274 yards, connecting with **Grady Bresnahan** 12 times for 119 yards and two TDs.

FROM THE "GRIFF MYTH" TO "HOME SWEET FOAM"

Prior to head coach **Shannon Currier** returning to lead the Golden Bears, CSP had posted an 11-24 record at Sea Foam Stadium (2009 to 2015) and had never posted more than two home wins in a row with just two winning seasons since football returned to campus in 2009.

In Currier's first season back, the Bears won the 2016 home opener and did so again to start the 2017 season.

In 2017, CSP also nabbed a win in the home finale, a 37-20 win over SMSU that started a three game home winning streak including the first two games of 2018 for the first time in Sea Foam Stadium's history. It was also the first three game home winning streak since the 2005 NSIC Championship season, played down the street at St. Paul Central High School's Griffin Stadium.

In Currier's first term leading the Bears (2000-03), he posted an 18-2 home record at Griffin Stadium, starting the "Griff Myth," a 19-game home winning streak that began in 2002 and spanned four full seasons of perfect home football (2002, 2003, 2004, 2005).

Currier now holds a 29-18 career record in home games at Concordia, a perfect 9-0 mark in home openers, a 4-4 mark in home finales and led the team to a winning record at Sea Foam Stadium in 2018 for the third time since 2009.

HEAD COACH SHANNON CURRIER | 10TH SEASON



Originally the 8th head coach of CSP football in 2000, Shannon Currier returned to lead the program for his 2nd stint in December, 2015.

He became the program's all-time wins leader on November 3, 2018 with a 16-10 win at SMSU.

In his first stint, he compiled a 32-12 (.727) record and brought the program its first NSIC Championship in 2003 when he was named NSIC Coach of the Year. The conference title also brought a berth in the Mineral Water Bowl, the first post-season game in school history.

He coached Concordia to four consecutive winning seasons and is the only coach in program history to achieve the feat - consecutive or cumulative.

THE GRIFF MYTH - PROTECTING HOME TURF

The team also established the longest home winning streak in school history under his guidance. Known to teams of the era as the "Griff Myth," Concordia tallied 19 consecutive home victories down the street at Griffin Stadium. The streak began in 2002 and stretched two years after Currier left through the 2005 season, finally falling at the beginning of 2006.

In Currier's first four years, his teams only lost two home games, producing a record of 18-2 after winning his first and last nine home games.

NEW TO THE NORTH

The 2021 Golden Bears have shifted to the NSIC North Division after the elimination of football at St. Cloud State University and the University of Minnesota Crookston - both former members of the North Division.

The result of the 14-team NSIC is two 7-team divisions, where each program plays the other six teams once every year, rotating between home sites, while facing five of the seven teams from the opposite division.

Previously, CSP played seven games against the NSIC South Division, with that total cut down by two in 2021; and played the NSIC North four times, with that total increased by two.

In 2021, Concordia will not face Wayne State for the first time since joining the league in 1999, or Augustana for the first time since 2004, including four non-conference games with the Vikings each year from 2004 to 2007 with Augie joining the NSIC in 2008.

The Golden Bears will now face every NSIC North team at home every other year, which means they will welcome MSU Moorhead to Sea Foam Stadium for just the third time when the Dragons visit St. Paul on November 6. Meanwhile, Minnesota Duluth won't come to St. Paul this year, and has only played at Sea Foam Stadium twice as well, in 2012 and 2016.

Under head coach **Shannon Currier**, the Golden Bears are 16-16 against the NSIC North Division teams across his career and 5-12 against NSIC North Division teams since rejoining the program

He opened his return to the program with a 17-0 shutout win over U-Mary in 2016, snapping a 6-game home losing streak and a former school record 8-game overall losing streak. His CSP teams are 9-0 all-time in home openers and he holds a career 29-17 home mark at Concordia between Griffin & Sea Foam Stadium.

CAREER AT TRUMAN

Following the program's 2003 NSIC title run, Currier accepted the head coach position at Truman State where he turned a losing program into a pair of 6-5 winning campaigns in his 3rd and 4th seasons.

His tenure was highlighted in his third year, leading the Bulldogs to a 6-3 record in a strong MIAA, finishing fourth in the league. He left the program following a 4-7 season in 2008 with a 20-35 overall record.

PRIOR TO REJOINING CONCORDIA'S SIDELINES

Following his departure from Truman, Currier spent seven years working outside of the coaching profession as a senior sales manager with iHigh.com working to build a digital platform for high school sports, reaching up to 1.5 million Minnesotans in his final year with the company.

NSIC BACKGROUND & ST. PAUL PRIVATE EDUCATION

He arrived at Concordia in 1999 as offensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator for former head coach and athletics director Dan O'Brien, now an assistant coach for the University of Minnesota.

Prior to joining Concordia, Currier spent two years each in similar roles at Southwest Minnesota State and Minnesota Crookston following his start in college coaching at Bemidji State as an offensive graduate assistant where earned his master's degree in physical education.

A native of Cosmos, Minnesota, Currier was a quarterback at Hamline University where he graduated with a degree in physical education in 1993.

TURNOVERS MATTER

Since head coach **Shannon Currier** rejoined the program in 2016, Concordia has produced a 9-6 record when winning the turnover battle. Meanwhile, when losing the turnover battle, CSP is 2-22 and CSP is 5-9 when turnovers are even.

CSP hadn't committed an offensive turnover until week four this year, with the -3 against SMSU leading to a 34-24 loss as the Mustangs outscored CSP 14-0 in points off turnovers.

SIEVERS BECOMES LATEST FR TO START AT QB

Freshman **Bryce Sievers** joined **Conner Cordts** in the freshman starting quarterback club in week 9 at UMary, making his first career start against the Marauders. In doing so, he becomes the eighth freshman to start at quarterback since 1999 when Concordia became a Division II program, it's also the first time since 1999 that the Golden Bears have started two freshmen quarterbacks in the same year.

In the start, Sievers did something no other freshman has done in their debut when he had 50 pass attempts, completing 22 for 173 yards and a TD - all career highs.

Prior to his first start at UMary, Sievers had played parts of four different games, making his debut with one pass attempt (0-1) at Minnesota State in week 5. He had his first completion in week 6 in an extended look under center, completing 9-16 for 83 with a long of 33, and finished the game against Northern State in week eight against Northern State, completing 1-5 for seven yards and adding an 11-yard run.

On the year, Sievers has passed for 379 yards, completing 43-98 with a TD and four INTs.

SCHWARTZ HANDLED QB ROLE IN WEEKS 7 & 8

Sophomore quarterback **Abe Schwartz**, now in his fourth year in the program, assumed the starting quarterback position in weeks 7 and 8. He had attempted just one pass prior to the 2021 season, but in his first start in week 7 at UMD, completed his first career TD pass on a 67-yard deep sideline route to **Mason Van Zeeland**, and added his second TD pass late in the game to **Brian Lankford-Johnson**. He finished the game taking all of the snaps under center, completing 12-22 for 154 yards, two TDs and one INT, adding 6-28 rushing with a long of 11.

In his second start against Northern State in week 8, Schwartz bested all of his previous career-highs set at UMD, by completing 22-37 for 200 yards and rushing 13 times for 32 yards, adding 1 TD and 1 INT.

On the year, Schwartz is 41-73 (56.2%) for 398 yards with a 3-3 TD-INT ratio. He missed weeks 9 & 10 due to injury.

QB SHUFFLE IN WEEK SIX

In Concordia's 42-14 loss in week six, four different players completed a pass in the contest. Starter **Conner Cordts** (1-of-1) left the game following a running play in the first quarter, did not return and is no longer listed on the team's official two-deep. Sophomore backup **Abe Schwartz** (5-of-8) also left the game following a running play and did not return to the field, but was able to return and start week 7 at UMD. Third string freshman quarterback **Bryce Sievers** made his most extended appearance under center, finishing the rest of the game and leading the team in pass completions (9), attempts (16) and yards (83). The second completion of the day actually belonged to wide receiver **Evan Peterson** on a double-pass, finding **Jake Shepley** for a 40-yard TD strike.

FRESHMAN QB CONNER CORDTS

The Golden Bears entered 2021 with freshman **Conner Cordts** declared the starter, just the second freshman opening day starting quarterback for the program since moving to NCAA Division II in 1999, joining CSP Athletic Hall of Famer, two-time

NSIC Champion and a former Harlon Hill candidate **James McNear** (2002-05).

Cordts is the seventh freshman to start a game at quarterback since CSP football has been a Division II program (1999) - all of them having used a redshirt season prior to making their debut.

He made his debut at Winona State, completing 25-of-40 for 130 yards while leading the team in rushing with 39 yards on 11 attempts. He did not commit any turnovers.

His breakout game was a week 2 win over Upper Iowa, completing 20-of-27 for 249 yards and two touchdowns, once again playing turnover-free football under center.

Cordts topped the 300-yard mark for total offense in a game for the first time in week 4 against SMSU, passing for 260 yards and three TDs and rushing for 41 yards on nine attempts (301).

It took him until his fourth career game until committing his first turnover, an interception that snapped a streak of 111 consecutive passes without an INT to start his career.

Injured in week six, the rookie signal-caller committed only one turnover in 2021 and has a new streak of 28 passes without an INT. The team does not publicly release injury status updates or timelines for return.

PILTOFF A PRESEASON NATIONALLY-RANKED CB

Senior cornerback **Preston Piltoff** is on the national map, ranked as the #4 cornerback in the country by CFB Network entering the 2021 season. He led the league in pass breakups as a junior in 2019, also leading the team with two interceptions including one for a 92 yard touchdown - the longest INT in the NSIC in 2019.

In 2021, he was fifth on the team with 31 tackles along with 23 solo stops and a team-high seven pass breakups through the first seven games before missing weeks 8 & 9 due to injury. He had been ranked as high as third in the NSIC with seven PBUs and just one shy of the co-league leaders prior to his injury. He had a season-high three pass breakups in week 7 at UMD.

He rejoined the lineup in week 10, making three solo tackles against MSU Moorhead.

Piltoff is a junior college transfer, competing at Grossmont College in 2018 with 36 tackles, eight pass breakups and two interceptions after an All-Conference freshman year at Shasta College with 16 tackles and five pass breakups.

CONCORDIA ST CLOUD GOLDEN HUSKIES

At the conclusion of the 2019 football season, the administrations at St. Cloud State University and the University of Minnesota Crookston made the difficult decision to end their football programs.

Immediately, the CSP coaches put together a plan and worked with Concordia administration to provide an opportunity for student-athletes to continue to pursue their goals towards graduating from college while remaining members of an NSIC football program.

Coach Currier and his staff successfully recruited 11 members of the 2019 SCSU football team, and one from UMC.

Robby Carrillo, Luke Dunsmoor, Jake Edwards, Nathan Gimza, Taylon Hensley, Sarek Hoerth, Robert Kraklow, Dominic LaCombe, Luke Shepherd, Mason Van Zeeland and Nick Webley all joined Concordia from SCSU while Ryan Martin changed his golden from the Eagles to the Bears. They've been part of the campus community since the pandemic shortened spring 2020 semester and were with us through the 2020-21 academic year.

Of that group, all have challenged for a travel roster spot while **Robert Kraklow (LT)**, **Taylon Hensley (RG)**, **Luke Shepherd (TE)**, **Nathan Gimza (WR)** and **Mason Van Zeeland (WR)** have earned at least one start.

Kraklow is a returning All-NSIC North Division Second Team offensive lineman and has started every game in 2021.

While Gimza was leading the team in catches (11), yards (153) and long (65) before an injury has held him out after three games, Van Zeeland has stepped forward to lead the team with a 19.8 yard per catch average and receiving yards (435) with three TDs. He has eight catches of at least 25 yards including his season-long of 67 yards for a TD in week 7 against UMD.

Shepherd had ascended to the top of the TE depth chart before falling victim to injury ahead of week 4 and has not returned while Hensley made his first start at right guard in week 7.

SKILL POSITION TURNOVER

The Golden Bears entered 2021 looking to replace all but one passing attempt (**Abe Schwartz**), 88 percent of its rushing yards with its leading returner being **Lajuan Preston** (177) and over 90 percent of its receptions with its leader being **Kevin Ventura-Cortes** (11-76).

GROUND CONTROL LEADS TO VICTORIES

Since 2016 when **Shannon Currier** returned to CSP's sidelines, Concordia has rushed for 200-plus yards 11 times, producing an 8-3 record.

By contrast, when Concordia holds opponents under 100 yards, the Golden Bears are also 8-3.

Just five times since 2016 have the Golden Bears rushed for 200-plus and held an opponent to under 100 yards in the same game - with CSP producing a 4-1 record in those contests, most recently a 2019 week 10 win over SMSU.

PRESTON BOOSTED BY DI TALENT IN BACKFIELD

Concordia's running game entered 2021 led by junior **Lajuan Preston**, the top returner from a strong and versatile rushing attack in 2019. "LP" has played in 31 career games with 1,123 rushing yards and a 5.7 career average. His breakout year was in 2018 when he averaged 6.5 per carry and rushed for 704 yards.

He was off to another strong start in 2019 with 177 yards in four games with two touchdowns and a 5.5 average before a season-ending injury.

He had his biggest outing of 2021 in week 6 against Bemidji State, breaking a 71-yard TD run early in the third quarter amid a 9-83 rushing day. He was the team's second leading rusher with 110 yards and leads the team in average among players with at least 20 carries.

Preston has missed the last four games with injury.

He's aided by Purdue junior transfer **Brian Lankford-Johnson** and Northern Iowa freshman transfer **Jaylin Richardson**.

Lankford-Johnson played in 12 games including a start in 2016 as a freshman for the Boilermakers, earning Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors with 18 carries for 127 yards and a touchdown against Illinois and finished the year second on the team with 314 yards on the ground and 6.5 per carry, adding the team's longest run (48) and 11 catches for 90 yards. He played in six games as a sophomore with 22-86 rushing before deciding to transfer to CSP for the spring 2020 term.

Richardson was a highly recruited RB from the Kansas City area, initially committing to Kansas before signing with Northern Iowa where he was an early enrollee in spring 2020. He made his debut in the 2021 COVID shortened

spring season for the Panthers, and retained his full eligibility for his first year with CSP.

In 2021, Richardson leads the CSP backfield with 74 carries for 234 rushing yards with two TDs and has added 15-85 receiving. He had team-highs of 7-69 receiving in his debut at Winona State.

Lankford-Johnson is second on the team with 151 rushing yards including a long run of 27 at Minnesota State. He had his top performance of the year in week 8 with 17 carries for 55 yards and a TD.

New to the scene, second year freshman running back **Brandon Marengo** made his debut in week 5 at Minnesota State with eight carries for 67 yards and the team's longest run of the year, a 36-yard TD against the Mavericks. After missing multiple games due to injury, Marengo returned with a 10-carry, 51-yard game in week 8 against Northern State. In parts of just three games, Marengo is third on the team in rushing with 117 yards and would lead the team in average (6.2) with just one more carry to qualify (min. 20).

Redshirt freshman **Daimarion Nelson** stepped into the starting RB role in week 9 at UMary, carrying 13 times for 45 yards with his first career TD.

All five of the team's top RBs, Richardson (234), Lankford-Johnson (151), Marengo (117), Preston (110) and Nelson (52) missed week 10 due to injury.

OFFENSIVE LINE NOTES

While the Golden Bears replaced four starting offensive linemen, the unit brings back plenty of experience and through nine games, nine different players have started up front and 12 different players have played offensive snaps.

The group is led by transfer tackle **Robert Kraklow**, an All-NSIC North Division Second Team performer at St. Cloud State and former Division I player at Northern Illinois.

The top returner is guard **Matthew Montgomery**, a regular starter at center in 2019, while new center **Sam Marshalek** had stepped into a starting guard role late in 2019. The two players flipped positions on the line for 2021.

Joining them on the interior has been redshirt freshman **Brody Card**, who has started nine of 10 games.

At the other tackle opposite Kraklow, three different players have started at the one position that has been hit by injuries. Sophomore **Adam Cook** earned the first three starts before freshman **Jac Carver**, a second year player, ascended to the top of the depth chart and started weeks 4, 5 and 6. While Carver missed three games due to injury, sophomore **Jake Edwards** has filled in with four starts down the stretch.

Marshalek and Kraklow have each started every game of the season, while Card and Montgomery have started all but one game each at the guard spots.

Earning first career starts in weeks six and seven were **Elliott Wolfe** and **Taylon Hensley**, respectively.

BROTHERLY LOVE

The 2021 Concordia-St. Paul roster features four sets of brothers: **Jake** and **Jaylin Richardson**, **Mel** and **El-Osiris Jeudy**, **Robby** and **Austin Carrillo**, and **Justin** and **Connor Higgins**.

The **Richardsons**, from Kansas City, are newcomers to the program in 2021 as Division I transfers.

Jake, a senior, transferred to CSP from South Dakota where he played 25 games across three seasons for the Coyotes, securing 16 tackles, 5.0 for loss and 5.0 sacks along with two forced fumbles and a fumble recovery. At CSP, he's picked up a pair of sacks, 4.0 tackles for loss and 10 tackles on the year. He's also added a forced fumble and fumble recovery.

Jaylin, a freshman, transferred to CSP from Northern Iowa where he competed during UNI's shortened spring season in 2021 and was not charged a season of eligibility due to the COVID-19 pandemic. He made his college football debut against #5 South Dakota State, recording a tackle. He's been a key part of CSP's backfield in 2021, leading the backfield with 74-234 rushing and a pair of TD runs along with 15-85 receiving while contributing 112 combined kick/punt return yards

for a team-leading 431 all-purpose yards.

The Richardsons have both been hit by injuries recently and are not part of the week 11 two deep.

The **Jeudys** are from Miami, Florida with Mel joining the program as a transfer prior to the 2020 spring term and El-Osiris being a freshman during the 2020-21 academic year.

Mel, a junior nose tackle, played three games at Alderson Broaddus University, a Division II program in 2019 after spending his first two years of college football at Division I Eastern Kentucky, including a redshirt season. The junior has played in nine games for CSP including seven starts up front. His six tackles and 3.0 TFLs in week 6 were season-highs. He now has 16 total tackles and 4.0 TFLs.

El-Osiris, a freshman linebacker, has appeared in eight games, primarily as a special teams contributor.

The **Carrillos** are offensive linemen from Case High School in Racine, Wisconsin with **Robby** joining the program prior to the 2020 spring term as a transfer from St. Cloud State with four years of eligibility remaining after redshirting with the Huskies in the final season of SCSU's program. He made his CSP debut in week 5 at MSU and has played every game since. **Austin** is a true first year freshman.

The **Higgins** are defensive backs from Rochester, Minnesota

and the only set of brothers from this group to both join CSP as freshmen. Graduates of John Marshall High School, the duo are each preparing to make their college football debuts.

ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS ON DEFENSE

The Golden Bears have a pair of defensive starters who earned CoSIDA Academic All-America Second Team honors for the 2020-21 academic year, that was held without a season: **Shawn Aarhus** and **Dalton Smerchek**.

Smerchek, a senior linebacker, is a returning 2019 All-NSIC South Division honorable mention performer when he had 60 tackles, 7.5 tackles for loss, 3.0 sacks, led the NSIC with four fumble recoveries and ranked second in the league with three forced fumbles.

He has played in 43 career games with 169 tackles, 14.0 TFL, 3.0 sacks, seven fumble recoveries and five forced fumbles.

In 10 games this year, he is third on the defense with 52 tackles, has 3.5 TFLs and handles long/short snapping duties as a special teams standout. He has made seven tackles in a game this season five different times.

Aarhus is a junior defensive tackle who has played in 32 career games while stepping into a starting role in 2021. He has 69 total tackles, 7.5 TFL, 5.5 sacks and three fumble recoveries in his career. In 2021, he has 32 tackles and added a blocked field goal to his season register in week 8 against Northern State.



EXPERIENCED LINEBACKERS GROUP

All three of Concordia's starting linebackers from 2019's 6-5 squad returned for 2021: senior whip **Dalton Smerchek**, junior mike **Jake Portz** and junior sam **Gabe Nkumu**.

Smerchek and Portz earned All-NSIC South Division honorable mention honors in 2019 as Smerchek led the league in fumble recoveries and added 8.5 TFL with 60 tackles while Portz was second in the league with 105 tackles and had an 18 tackle performance, third most in a game in school history. Nkumu, meanwhile, topped Portz's 18 tackles with 19, an NSIC single-game high for 2019 as he finished second on the team with 73 tackles.

In 2021, Smerchek has produced five games with at least seven tackles and added 3.5 TFLs, ranking third on the defense with 52 total tackles.

Nkumu was fifth on the defense with 18 tackles including 3.0 TFL through four weeks but has been injured since.

Portz has contributed 31 tackles, seventh-most on the team, while making at least three tackles in seven games on the year. He's had a tremendous career, compiling 214 tackles over 32 games with 7.5 TFLs.

The unit was bolstered with the emergence of **Andrew Egnarski**, who has ascended to the starting MLB spot. He had his breakout effort in week 2 against Upper Iowa with a team-high 11 tackles, 3.5 TFL, 3.5 sacks, a forced fumble and recovery, earning NSIC Defensive Player of the Week honors.

His 3.5-sack performance is an NSIC single game high while the 3.5 TFL are tied for fourth-most in a game in the NSIC this year.

On the year, Egnarski is seventh in the league with 5.0 sacks, 23rd with 57 tackles and third on the team with 6.0 TFLs. He also has an INT, forced fumble and fumble recovery.

Adding depth at the LB unit is **Foster Conzet** at the whip, and a tribute to the quality and the depth at the LB position, Conzet is fourth on the team with 48 total tackles.

With an injury to Nkumu prior to week 5, freshman **Caden Baarts** stepped in with his first career start in week 5, making a season-high five tackles which led the team for the game at MSU. He has 26 tackles and a pair of pass breakups on the year, starting five games and appearing in nine.

SHEEHAN LEADS THE SAFETIES (AND LBs?)

Junior **Rhett Sheehan**, in his fifth year in the program, has put together a strong campaign in the secondary, leading the team and 21st in the NSIC with 59 total tackles. His three interceptions, all in CSP's five home games, are ninth in the Northern Sun, and he has racked up 85 return yards in the process while adding two pass breakups for five passes defended, second-most on the team while contributing a team-leading two forced fumbles.

He's had at least four tackles in eight straight games including a career-high of 10 against Bemidji State in week 6, adding an INT in the game.

In his career, Sheehan has secured 139 tackles across 32 games, and his 59 tackles in 2021 are a new career-high. He has 12 career passes defended including five each the past two seasons, three interceptions and two forced fumbles.

TRENDING TOPIC: SACKS / WINS CORRELATION

In the 54 games since head coach **Shannon Currier** has been back with the program since 2016, the CSP defense has produced 4-plus sacks 14 times and had more sacks than the opponent 20 times.

In the 4-plus sack games, Concordia has a 10-4 record and has won six of its last eight games when sacking the quarterback four or more times including week 2's five sack performance against Upper Iowa.

When producing more sacks than the opponent which factors line play on both sides, Concordia is 12-9 since 2016.

DEFENSIVE LINE SEES MAJOR TURNOVER

The 2021 Golden Bears were supposed to feature the return of two-time All-American and two-time NSIC sack champion **Chris Garrett**, the NCAA DII career record holder with 15 forced fumbles and CSP career sack record holder.

But Garrett was drafted following the cancelled COVID season in the seventh round by the Los Angeles Rams, making the 53 man roster this fall.

Garrett made his NFL debut in week 3 as the Rams beat defending Super Bowl champion Tampa Bay 34-24. In the win, Garrett played four defensive snaps (5%) and six on special teams (20%).

Leaving the program after 2019 with Garrett were the other three outgoing senior starting linemen, as well as three key rotation reserves.

In 2021, the Golden Bears have filled the defensive line with three players who played key roles in 2019: ends **Richard Ficociello** and **Mark O'Reilly** and tackle **Shawn Aarhus** while impact transfers **Mel Jeudy** joined Aarhus in the middle and **Jake Richardson** joined the defensive end rotation.

Ficociello has emerged as a consistent pass rush threat in the Northern Sun, ranking seventh in the league with 5.0 sacks and 13th with 8.5 TFLs. He's been a force in recent weeks, with at least a sack in three straight games in weeks 7-9, totalling 4.0 sacks during that stretch with 5.0 TFLs and a forced fumble. In his career, he's played 25 games with 53 tackles, 12.5 TFLs and 6.0 sacks.

Aarhus has played in 32 career games with 69 tackles, 7.5 TFL and 5.5 sacks, and O'Reilly has secured 35 tackles, 13.0 TFL and 6.5 sacks across 21 career games.

In 2021, Aarhus has contributed a team-best among defensive linemen with 32 total tackles while O'Reilly has chipped in 23 tackles and 6.5 TFLs including a pair of 2.0 TFL games down the stretch in weeks 8 and 9 and now ranks second on the defense with 6.5 TFLs.

Despite missing five games including each of the last four, Richardson has added 4.0 TFL and 2.0 sacks with one FF and one FR from the defensive end spot. Jeudy has matched Richardson's 4.0 TFL from the interior including 3.0 TFL in one game.

The unit also features SCSU transfer **Luke Dunsmoor**, UMC transfer **Ryan Martin** and returner **Keegan Larson** with first year freshman **Brad Walker** cracking the rotation mid-year.

Larson is coming off of his best career game with six tackles, 3.0 TFLs and 2.0 sacks in week 10 against MSU Moorhead and has 16 tackles, 5.0 TFLs and 2.0 sacks on the year.

Dunsmoor also had a big week 10, matching his season-high with five tackles while adding a season-high 2.0 TFLs. On the year, Dunsmoor has 25 tackles and 4.0 TFLs.

ROOKIE KICKING GAME

Concordia-St. Paul has featured some of the top kickers and punters in the Northern Sun as well as nationally over the past decade, and in 2021 the kicking and punting jobs will be handled by a pair of talented freshmen: second year kicker **Sam Henson** and first year punter **Parker Dahlman**.

Henson was recently named to the Fred Mitchell Award Watch List for September, to become the fourth consecutive CSP kicker to be recognized by the national award which is presented to the top placekicker in small college football (FCS, DII, DIII, NAIA, NJCAA). He's one of 10 named to the list and one of three from NCAA Division II and the only one from the Northern Sun.

Henson had a standout debut, converting his only two field goal attempts from 38 and 48 yards, before adding 3-3 PAT and 1-2 FG in a week 2 win over Upper Iowa.

He added another 48 yard field goal in week 8 at UMary and is 8-11 on the season in field goal attempts. His only misses are all from 40-plus yards (40, 51, 52) and he's also made three kicks of 40-plus yards.

His 48 yard field goals are the third longest in the Northern Sun this year. He ranks third in the NSIC and 24th in NCAA Division II with a .727 field goal percentage.

In addition to being 8-11 on field goals, Henson is 16-16 on PATs, leads the team with 40 points and has 10 kickoff touchbacks on 36 kickoffs on the year.

Dahlman has been busy so far, as well and is third in the league with a 40.6 season punting average on a league-high 63 punts. His 11 punts of 50-plus yards leads the league, and his 12 punts inside the 20 is three shy of the league lead while also forcing 12 fair catches and just five touchbacks.

His 77 yard punt at Sioux Falls is the third longest in the league so far and he holds the fifth-ranked single game punting average on the year, 50.2 (at USF).

His first 10 game averages (40.6) puts him within striking distance of CSP single season (41.3) and career (39.3) punting average records.

FARLEY A RELIABLE TARGET

Junior wide receiver **Joey Farley** has emerged as a favorite target in recent weeks in the Concordia offense. Having missed two games earlier in the season and adapting to a new program this fall, he's ascended to the team lead with 29 receptions in 8 GP, compiling 164 yards and a TD.

After a 5-26 debut in week 2 against Upper Iowa, Farley missed week 3 and then had 5 total catches over the next 5 games.

But in weeks 8 and 9, Farley compiled 19 catches for 92 yards and a TD. It started with a 9-39 effort against Northern State in week 8 before 10-53 on 19 targets in week 9 at UMary.

He's not the only short yardage target in the CSP passing game, with junior **Isaiah Koran** coming in just behind with 27-239 in 9 GP. Also involved out of the backfield and in the return game, Koran has 374 all-purpose yards and had a season-high of 9-78 receiving and 149 all-purpose yards in week 4 against SMSU. Koran also has a 6-63 line in week 3 at Sioux Falls and 5-45 in week 8 against Northern State.

VAN ZEELAND LEADS DOWNFIELD TARGETS

While Farley and Koran have been reliable short yardage targets, redshirt freshman wide receiver **Mason Van Zeeland** leads the deep threats. He's played in all 10 games including 7 starts, and is third on the team with 22 catches but leads the team with 435 yards, nearly 200 more than Koran in second. He averages 19.8 yards per catch and has 8 catches for at least 25 yards including a long TD grab of 67 yards in week 7 at UMD.

Van Zeeland is tied with fellow deep target **Jake Shepley** for the team lead with three receiving TDs. Shepley is averaging 15.6 per catch with career-highs of 12 catches for 187 yards this year. He's started 7 and played all 10 games. He had a pair of TD grabs among his 3-66 game with a long of 49 against SMSU, and hauled in a 40-yard TD against BSU.

True first year freshman **Jaheim Arnold** has also had a strong deep presence, catching 12 passes for 182 yards, a 15.2 average and two TDs.
