THIS WEEK: CSP HEADS TO WAYNE AMERICA

This Saturday, Concordia continues its early season trend of night games, heading to Bob Cunningham Field at Memorial Stadium to face Wayne State for the Wildcats' Family Day game.

WEATHER OUTLOOK

Saturday in Wayne features a high of 81 degrees on a generally sunny day in Northeast Nebraska, with temperatures cooling in the evening hours. Winds WNW at 10-20 mph with clouds appearing in the afternoon and becoming more present in the evening hours when the wind calms.

STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

The Golden Bears have had a daunting first third of the season, with an opponent record of 8-1 through three weeks with a 3-0 Wayne State squad on the horizon.

Entering week four, CSP holds the 12th-toughest strength of schedule in Division II football, a mark that will become more firm in the coming weeks. While unable to put a positive mark in the win column, the Golden Bears have remained competitive, tied with #25 Augustana (now 3-0) late in the third quarter as the Vikings are now ranked #13 in the nation, followed by a 14-6 road loss to Southwest Minnesota State (now 2-1) after trailing 7-6 in the fourth quarter, and in week three fell 44-23 to Sioux Falls but played to a 24-23 margin after falling into a 20-0 first half deficit in a comeback attempt against a 3-0 Cougars team.

This week, the Wildcats hold a 3-0 record with road wins at UMary and Minot State along with a home win over Northern State. Next week, CSP hosts 2-1 Minnesota State who has been nationally-ranked this season followed by home games against formerly-ranked Bemidji State (1-2) and annual NSIC North power Minnesota Duluth (2-1).

CSP LED BY "COACH C" - ALL-TIME WINS LEADER AT CSP

In 2018, head coach **Shannon Currier** became the school's all-time wins leader, winning his 41st game 16-10 at SMSU in week 10 on November 3, 2018, surpassing **Mark Mauer** (40-39), who coached the program for seven seasons from 2004-10.

Currier, now in his 11th overall season at Concordia, is closing in on becoming the first coach to reach the 50-win milestone

with a 48-54 career record. He has a 29-20 home record and is 9-1 in home openers. He's been head coach across two different stints, 2000 to 2003 and 2016-present while also serving as head coach at Truman State for five seasons from 2004-08. He was 2003 NSIC Coach of the Year, leading the program to its first NSIC Championship and the program's first-ever postseason appearance at the 2003 Mineral Water Bowl.

NOTES ABOUT THE WILDCATS

After a 3-0 start, Wayne State has cracked the 'receiving votes' section of the AFCA Division II Coaches Poll, the second-straight year the program has earned votes. It's WSC's first 3-0 start since the 2012 season, and they'll be hunting their first 4-0 start since 1993 when they finished 9-1 overall.

Senior wide receiver **Mason Lee** is coming off of his first career 100-yard performance (5-130, TD) at Minot State, has a 16-game reception streak and has caught a pass in 32 of 33 games dating back to week four of his freshman year in 2018. He has 10-215 on the year while **Jadon Johnson** has 9-239 with three TDs.

Nick Bohn is the signal-caller, with 536 yards on 60.4 (29-48) passing and a 181.72 rating while **Tavian Willis** adds 7-11 (63.6) passing for 103 yards and a TD.

The duo ranks sixth nationally with a 179.96 rating, 11th in the country with 17.75 yards per completion while engineering the nation's best red zone offense (100%).

Bohn is also a rushing threat with 181 rushing yards on 4.9 per carry while Willis adds 51 yards on a 6.4 average. **Anthony Watkins** is the lead back with 204 yards and three TDs, averaging 3.8 per carry.

Alex Kowalczyk leads the defense with 28 tackles, adding 2.5 TFLs and an INT while **Jaxson Johnson** (3.5 TFL, 3.0 sacks, INT) and **Jaylan Scott** (3.5 TFL, 2.0 sacks, INT) add pressure. **Tanner Cooper** leads the team with 2 INTs while adding 12 tackles on a defense that has 5 INTs and two fumble recoveries.

The Wildcat defense ranks 12th in the country on third downs (22.9%), 36th on fourth downs (25.0%) and 15th in the red zone (57.1%)

working out near his home in the Twin Cities that summer. Head coach **Shannon Currier** has opted to honor Brown by selecting a player who fits Billy's work ethic and commitment to the program to wear the number each season.

"Billy Brown's legacy has been talked about since the day I became a part of this football program, and rightfully so," said Cheeks. "The mark he left was one that was full of love for this team, passion for the game, and doing whatever it took to win. It is an honor to be able to wear that jersey as I know he is watching down on us and has sowed a seed that will never be forgotten."

Cheeks, a native of Aurora, Illinois, debuted in game action in 2021 with the jersey number 31, after redshirting in 2019 and missing 2020 due to the COVID-19 season cancellation. As a third-year member of the program, Cheeks played in seven games, including four starts at safety, finishing the year with 17 tackles (10 solo) with a season-high six tackles at UMD (10/16).

He's played all three games in 2022 with four tackles as a reserve safety and key member of the special teams. In 10 career games, Cheeks has 21 career tackles, a pass breakup and a fumble recovery.

He served last year as the CSP Student-Athlete Advisory Committee President and this year was appointed as the NSIC's NCAA Division II National SAAC representative. Further, he was elected as the 2022-23 CSP Student Body President and appointed as one of the first two student-athletes to serve on the NCAA Division II President's Council, the highest-ranking body of NCAA DII governance.

Cheeks is a public relations major at Concordia with a minor in business management and marketing.

SERIES HISTORY: CONCORDIA 11, WAYNE STATE 10

The Golden Bears and Wildcats will battle for the 22nd time in a series that commenced with CSP's entry into the NSIC and NCAA Division II ranks in 1999. The teams had met every year through 2019 until the series was disrupted by the cancelled COVID 2020 season, with CSP shifting to the NSIC North Division causing another gap year in 2021.

The Golden Bears bring a 2-game winning streak to the series, winning the last meeting in Wayne in 2019 (28-21) while their 2018 win at Sea Foam Stadium on a stormy Thursday night NSIC Game of the Week saw CSP weather a lightning delay as part of a 29-7 home win to snap a 4-game skid in the series.

Concordia has split 10 road games at Wayne State and have won three of the last five trips dating back to 2010 with all five contests decided by seven points or less.

Under head coach **Shannon Currier**, CSP holds a 6-2 record against the Wildcats, winning four straight from 2000-03 in his first term leading the program, while splitting the most recent four contests played from 2016-19.

His six wins against WSC are the second-most against any program while leading the CSP program, trailing the seven wins he's compiled against Southwest Minnesota State (7-3).

LAST MEETING, 2019: CONCORDIA 28, WAYNE STATE 21

Concordia secured a road comeback win to improve to 3-1 in the 2019 season, the first 3-1 record through four games since the 2013 squad while picking up its second-straight road victory.

In the win, CSP started strong with a first quarter 49-yard field goal (**Danny Laudet**), finished the first half strong with a **Maxon Hutton** to **Marcus Gustaveson** 6-yard touchdown strike with 27 seconds to play in the half to make it a 14-10 deficit entering the break.

In the second half, CSP started strong as Laudet delivered a red zone field goal from 21-yards out on a 6-plus minute drive to open the half, cutting it to a 14-13 game.

And the Golden Bears finished strong, with **Darios Crawley-Reid**

scoring on the ground from three yards out with three minutes to play to finish a steady 12-play, 75-yard drive in the end zone and a 28-21 lead following the 2-point conversion pass to **Jabril Clewis**.

Prior to the game-winning fourth quarter drive, Hutton had the biggest play of the game, a 76-yard touchdown run on third down with 5:20 to play in the third quarter to give CSP its first lead since 3-0 in the first quarter.

The Concordia defense stepped up in the third quarter after allowing 258 yards in the first half, CSP held WSC to just 54 yards including 0-3 on third downs, all around midfield.

Hutton produced his second career 100-yard rushing performance (16-120, TD) while completing 16-24 for 172 yards and a TD through the air while playing turnover-free at the QB position.

CSP rushed for 191 yards at a 5.5 average as a team with **Crawley-Reid** adding 9-46 and a TD and **Lajuan Preston** adding 6-26 while surpassing the 1,000 yard mark for his career.

MJ Williams was the top receiving option with 4-50 with **Gustaveson** adding 3-46 and crossing the 1,700 career receiving yard threshold while the TD was the 18th of his career.

Chris Garrett led the defense with eight tackles, 2.0 for loss, a forced fumble and a fourth quarter pass breakup on fourth down to end the Wildcats final comeback attempt.

Laudet, who made a pair of field goals, averaged 51.0 yards on four punts including a school record 82-yard long from his own 2-yard line, pushing WSC back to its own 25 despite CSP's field position on the kick.

Laudet's day in the kicking game helped CSP offset disadvantages in first downs (17-28), rushing (191-227), passing (172-213), total offense (363-440) and time of possession (27:31 to 32:29) although CSP did win the turnover margin, 1-0, leading to Laudet's first quarter field goal.

WSC was led by QB **Tavian Willis** who was 10-13 for 129 yards and a TD passing, adding 16-68 rushing. **Alex Thrasher** also played QB, completing 7-12 for 84 yards and a TD, adding 6-37 rushing.

Ryvan Wilkins led the WSC ground game (14-70) while **Taurean Grady** had 4-64 receiving and a TD with **Corbin Foster** adding 4-62 receiving.

LAST WEEK: SIOUX FALLS 44, CONCORDIA 23

Concordia produced a season-high with 306 passing yards while rushing for 105 yards against a USF defense that had been issuing -11 rushing yards per game entering play.

Sophomore quarterback **Conner Cordts** produced a career-high of 365 yards of total offense, completing 18-46-1 for 306 yards and three TDs while rushing for a career-high 59 yards on eight attempts with a long run of 35. He was only sacked once by a Cougar defense that was among the nation's best with 6.5 sacks per game entering play.

It was CSP's first 300-plus yard passing performance as a team since November 4, 2017 in a road loss to Augustana where **Ron Johnson** completed 27-54 for 349 yards, a touchdown and three interceptions in a 28-13 loss.

The big offensive night led to a season-high 23 points, as Cordts struck via the big play, hitting his targets in space and in stride.

After falling behind 20-0 with 3:52 to play in the first half, CSP finished the half strong, marching 72 yards in 13 plays with **Sam Henson** converting a field goal from 25 yards out in the red zone with 46 seconds to head into half with points, and momentum.

In the second half, CSP started with the ball and Cordts connected with redshirt freshman wide receiver **Troy Ellison** for his first career catch underneath, hitting him in stride over the middle with Ellison doing most of the work with his feet, racing for a 32-yard touchdown and a 20-10 deficit early in the third quarter.

Although USF answered with a quick TD, the Cordts came back and hit **Joey Farley** over the middle near the first down line with Farley catching the ball in stride and at top speed, hitting the gas for a 75-yard TD on the first play of the drive to make it 27-16 with 10:18 to play in the third.

CSP's comeback ran out of steam, as USF scored the next 10 points, but Cordts wasn't finished, escaping pressure in the

pocket, collecting himself under duress and finding a wide open **Jaire Moore** out of the backfield down the left sideline for a 64-yard strike.

Cordts' touchdowns came from 32, 75 and 64 yards to three different targets on a night when he completed passes to 10 different receivers while his 18 completions for 306 yards averaged 17 yards per completion.

Defensively, CSP had its hands full with a balanced USF attack as the Cougars rushed for 250 yards and four touchdowns at 5.8 per carry and **Adam Mullen** completed 15-22 for 268 yards and two more scores, averaging 17.9 per completion.

Thuro Reisdorfer led the ground game with 19-159 and two scores while **Landon Freeman** added the other two TD runs on 13-49 rushing.

Ethan Wittenburg had the top receiving line in the game at 5-128 with a TD.

CSP safeties **Rhett Sheehan** and **Cyrus McClure** once again led the charge on defense with nine tackles each while sophomore linebacker **Brayden Hilgemann** had seven stops.

FROM THE "GRIFF MYTH" TO "HOME SWEET FOAM"

Prior to head coach **Shannon Currier** returning to lead the Golden Bears, CSP had posted an 11-24 record at Sea Foam

Stadium (2009 to 2015) and had never posted more than two home wins in a row with just two winning seasons since football returned to campus in 2009.

In Currier's first season back, the Bears won the 2016 home opener and did so again to start the 2017 season.

In 2017, CSP also nabbed a win in the home finale, a 37-20 win over SMSU that started a three game home winning streak, including the first two games of 2018, for the 3-game streak in Sea Foam Stadium's history. It was also the first 3-game home winning streak since the 2005 NSIC Championship season, played down the street at St. Paul Central High School's Griffin Stadium.

In Currier's first term leading the Bears (2000-03), he posted an 18-2 home record at Griffin Stadium, starting the "Griff Myth," a 19-game home winning streak that began in 2002 and spanned four full seasons of perfect home football (2002, 2003, 2004, 2005).

Currier now holds a 29-20 career record in home games at Concordia, a solid 9-1 mark in home openers, a 4-4 mark in home finales and led the team to a winning record at Sea Foam Stadium in 2018 for the third time since 2009.

The Golden Bears are now 11-18 at Sea Foam Stadium under Currier since 2016 including winning seasons in 2018 (3-2) and 2019 (4-2), the only back-to-back winning seasons in Sea Foam Stadium's history.

Originally the 8th head coach of CSP football in 2000, Shannon Currier returned to lead the program for his 2nd stint in December, 2015.

He became the program's all-time wins leader on November 3, 2018 with a 16-10 win at SMSU.

In his first stint, he compiled a 32-12 (.727) record and brought the program its first NSIC Championship in 2003 when he was named NSIC Coach of the Year. The conference title also brought a berth in the Mineral Water Bowl, the first postseason game in school history.

He coached Concordia to four consecutive winning seasons and is the only coach in program history to achieve the feat - consecutive or cumulative.

THE GRIFF MYTH - PROTECTING HOME TURF

The team also established the longest home winning streak in school history under his guidance. Known to teams of the era as the "Griff Myth," Concordia tallied 19 consecutive home victories down the street at Griffin Stadium. The streak began in 2002 and stretched two years after Currier left through the 2005 season, finally falling at the beginning of 2006.

In Currier's first four years, his teams only lost two home games, producing a record of 18-2 after winning his first and last nine home games.

He opened his return to the program with a 17-0 shutout win over U-Mary in 2016, snapping a 6-game home losing streak and a former school record 8-game overall losing streak. His CSP teams are 9-1 all-time in home openers and he holds a career 29-20 home mark at Concordia between Griffin & Sea Foam Stadium.

CAREER AT TRUMAN

Following the program's 2003 NSIC title run, Currier accepted the head coach position at Truman State where he turned a losing program into a pair of 6-5 winning campaigns in his 3rd and 4th seasons.

His tenure was highlighted in his third year, leading the Bulldogs to a 6-3 record in a strong MIAA, finishing fourth in the league. He left the program following a 4-7 season in 2008 with a 20-35 overall record.

PRIOR TO REJOINING CONCORDIA'S SIDELINES

Following his departure from Truman, Currier spent seven years working outside of the coaching profession as a senior sales manager with iHigh.com working to build a digital platform for high school sports, reaching up to 1.5 million Minnesotans in his final year with the company.

NSIC BACKGROUND & ST. PAUL PRIVATE EDUCATION

He arrived at Concordia in 1999 as offensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator for former head coach and athletics director Dan O'Brien, now an assistant coach for the University of Minnesota.

Prior to joining Concordia, Currier spent two years each in similar roles at Southwest Minnesota State and Minnesota Crookston following his start in college coaching at Bemidji State as an offensive graduate assistant where earned his master's degree in physical education.

A native of Cosmos, Minnesota, Currier was a quarterback at Hamline University where he graduated with a degree in physical education in 1993.

ADJUSTING TO THE NORTH

The Golden Bears have shifted to the NSIC North Division in the 2021 season after the elimination of football at St. Cloud State University and the University of Minnesota Crookston - both former members of the North Division.

The result of the 14-team NSIC is two 7-team divisions, where each program plays the other six teams once every year, rotating between home sites, while facing five of the seven teams from the opposite division.

Previously, CSP played seven games against the NSIC South Division, with that total cut down by two starting in 2021; and previously played the NSIC North four times, with that total increased by two.

In 2021, Concordia did not face Wayne State for the first time since joining the league in 1999, or Augustana for the first time since 2004, including four non-conference games with the Vikings each year from 2004 to 2007 with Augie joining the NSIC in 2008.

In 2022, Concordia will not face Winona State, halting an annual series that dates back to 1999 (22 games) and Upper Iowa, halting a streak of 15-straight meetings dating back to UIU's entry to the NSIC for the 2006-07 academic year.

The Golden Bears will now face every NSIC North team at home every other year, welcoming MSU Moorhead to Sea Foam Stadium for just the third time last year. Meanwhile, Minnesota Duluth heads to Sea Foam Stadium for the third-time ever this year, previously playing in St. Paul in 2012 and 2016.

Under head coach **Shannon Currier**, the Golden Bears are 16-17 against the NSIC North Division teams across his career and 5-13 against NSIC North Division teams since rejoining the program in 2016. The Golden Bears are seeking their first division win as members of the NSIC North Division (0-6).

TURNOVERS MATTER

Since head coach **Shannon Currier** rejoined the program in 2016, Concordia has produced a 9-6 record when winning the turnover battle. Meanwhile, when losing the turnover battle, CSP is 2-22 and CSP is 5-12 when turnovers are even.

Through three weeks, CSP is -1 in turnover margin while the scoring margin off turnovers is minimal on both sides, 14-6 in favor of the opposition with each side scoring twice off turnovers but opponents converting to TDs to CSP's FGs.

SOPHOMORE QBs BECOME SEASONED

In 2021, freshman quarterbacks **Conner Cordts** and **Bryce Sievers** became the seventh and eighth players to start a game at quarterback as a freshman (or redshirt freshman) since Concordia made the jump to NCAA Division II in 1999.

Cordts joined elite company in becoming just the second fresh-

man to start a season opener at quarterback, joining **James McNear**, who is a CSP and NSIC Hall of Famer and ended his career as the Division II leader in career total offense, playing from 2002-05.

Cordts started the first six games before a season-ending injury derailed his rookie season, committing just one turnover with one INT in 141 pass attempts after starting his career INT-free for 111 passes. Sievers earned playing time in six games, starting three.

SOPHOMORE QB CONNER CORDTS

The Golden Bears entered the 2021 season with **Conner Cordts** declared the starter, just the second freshman opening day starting quarterback for the program since moving to NCAA Division II in 1999, joining CSP Athletic Hall of Famer, two-time NSIC Champion and a former Harlon Hill candidate **James McNear** (2002-05).

Cordts became the seventh freshman to start a game at quarterback since CSP football has been a Division II program (1999) - all of them having used a redshirt season prior to making their debut.

His freshman breakout game was a week 2 win over Upper Iowa in 2021, completing 20-of-27 for 249 yards and two touchdowns, playing turnover-free football under center.

Cordts topped the 300-yard mark for total offense in a game for the first time in week 4 against SMSU last year, passing for 260 yards and three TDs, adding 9-41 rushing (301 total offense).

It took him until his fourth career game until committing his first turnover, an interception that snapped a streak of 111 consecutive passes without an INT to start his career.

Injured in week six, the rookie signal-caller committed only one turnover in 2021.

In 2022, Cordts had his first career 300-yard passing performance, completing 18-46 for 306 with three TDs and one INT against Sioux Falls, averaging 17 yards per completion in the first 300-yard passing game since November 4, 2017 (Ron Johnson, at Augustana). Cordts also achieved a career-high of 365 yards of total offense and 59 rushing yards in the contest.

CONCORDIA ST CLOUD GOLDEN HUSKIES

Concordia's week two road trip to face Southwest Minnesota State featured seven former St. Cloud State Huskies facing their former head coach **Scott Underwood**, who now patrols the SMSU sidelines in his first season with the Mustangs.

At the conclusion of the 2019 football season, the administrations at St. Cloud State University and the University of Minnesota Crookston made the difficult decision to end their football programs.

Immediately, the CSP coaches put together a plan and worked with Concordia administration to provide an opportunity for student-athletes to continue to pursue their goals towards graduating from college while remaining members of an NSIC football program.

Coach Currier and his staff successfully recruited 11 members of the 2019 SCSU football team, and one from UMC.

Robby Carrillo, Luke Dunsmoor, Jake Edwards, Nathan Gimza, Taylon Hensley, Sarek Hoerth, Robert Kraklow, Dominic LaCombe, Luke Shepherd, Mason Van Zeeland and Nick Webley all joined Concordia from SCSU while Ryan Martin changed his golden from the Eagles to the Bears. They became a part of the campus community during the pandemic shortened spring 2020 semester and continued through the 2020-21 academic year.

In 2022, seven of the Huskies: Carrillo, Dunsmoor, Edwards, Gimza, Hensley, Hoerth, LaCombe and Shepherd, along with Martin from UMC, remain with team.

Meanwhile, Kraklow joined the coaching staff as a first-year graduate assistant working with the offensive line.

Look for the group to continue making a strong impact on the field for the Golden Bears.

Since 2016 when **Shannon Currier** returned to CSP's sidelines, Concordia has rushed for 200-plus yards 12 times, producing an 8-4 record.

By contrast, when Concordia holds opponents under 100 yards, the Golden Bears hold a similar record at 8-3.

Just five times since 2016 have the Golden Bears rushed for 200-plus and held an opponent to under 100 yards in the same game - with CSP producing a 4-1 record in those contests, most recently a 2019 week 10 win over SMSU.

DIVISION I BACKFIELD

Concordia's running game entering the 2022 season features its top four backs as Division I transfers: Northern Iowa transfer **Jaylin Richardson**, now a sophomore in his second year at CSP, has opened the year as the lead back.

In week one, Richardson topped the team in offensive touches against Augustana with 16 (11-30 rushing, 5-59 receiving).

He had his best game as a college running back in week two at SMSU, rushing for 175 yards on 12.5 per carry (14-175). He got stronger as the game wore on, with 9-151 in the second half, ripping off runs of 20, 31 and 74 yards in the process.

In week three, he led the team in carries (9) and tied for the team lead with three receptions to finish with 12 touches for 67 yards.

He leads the league and is 15th in the country in yards per carry (7.03), ranks fifth in the NSIC with 239 rushing yards,

seventh in the NSIC with 127.7 all-purpose yards per game and 13th in the NSIC with 3.3 receptions per game.

Richardson was a highly recruited RB from the Kansas City area, initially committing to Kansas before signing with Northern Iowa where he was an early enrollee in spring 2020. He made his debut in the 2021 COVID shortened spring season for the Panthers, and retained his full eligibility for his CSP career.

In 2021, Richardson led CSP with 61.6 all-purpose yards per game, playing in seven games with three starts. He was second on the team in rushing yards (234) while leading the backfield with two rushing TDs. He added 15-85 receiving and 5-99 on kickoff returns.

In his two seasons with CSP, Richardson has compiled 473 rushing yards in 10 games, averaging 4.4 yards per carry with two TDs while adding 25-184 receiving, 7-144 on kickoff returns and 4-13 on punt returns for 814 all-purpose yards.

He's aided by Kansas transfer **Gayflor Flomo** who had 7-18 rushing including a TD run in the season opener and through three games has 18-67 rushing and 3-68 on kickoff returns (22.7), ranking fourth on the team with 130 all-purpose yards.

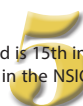
Flomo, originally from the metro (Fridley) and graduate of Totino-Grace High School, was a standout at Iowa Western Community College out of high school before transferring to Kansas where he was an Academic All-Big 12 Second Team selection, playing in nine games and earning six carries for the Jayhawks.

A transfer from Northern Colorado, **Jaire Moore** is right behind Flomo for season rushing, with 17-52 while adding a pair of catches for 90 yards, with his receptions going for 26 yards at SMSU and a 64-yard TD against USF. With his big plays in the pass game, he ranks third on the team with 142 all-purpose yards.

Moore is originally from Dallas, Texas and rushed 12-38 for Northern Colorado in 2021, spending three seasons there including a redshirt and a missed year due to COVID-19.

Senior running back **Ethan Falaniko**, a transfer from South Dakota, returns healthy for the 2022 season after missing 2021 due to injury. He spent three seasons with the Coyotes before heading to St. Paul where he's now in his fourth year, a career disrupted by the missed COVID season as well as a medical hardship. He picked up an 11-yard reception in week three against Sioux Falls.

Concordia's backfield also includes **Daimarion Nelson**, a St. Paul native who had 15-52 rushing last year with a TD as well as true freshman **Daniel Hornacek** who has made his early impact on the field as a member of the special teams.



BROTHERLY LOVE

The 2021 Concordia-St. Paul roster features two sets of brothers: **Mel** and **El-Osiris Jeudy**, along with **Robby** and **Austin Carrillo**.

The **Jeudys** are from Miami, Florida with Mel joining the program as a transfer prior to the 2020 spring term and El-Osiris being a freshman during the 2020-21 academic year.

Mel, a senior nose tackle, played three games at Alderson Broaddus University, a Division II program in 2019 after spending his first two years of college football at Division I Eastern Kentucky, including a redshirt season. He has played in 13 career games for CSP including nine starts up front. In 2021, he put up 22 total tackles and 4.0 TFLs. He's made seven tackles in 2022 through three weeks including a 5-tackle performance against USF.

El-Osiris, a sophomore linebacker, has appeared in 12 career games, primarily as a special teams contributor as a freshman in 2021. He's seen action on special teams and at linebacker in 2022, making nine tackles in three games. He made his first career start in week three against USF, making a career-high six tackles.

The **Carrillos** are offensive linemen from Case High School in Racine, Wisconsin with **Robby** joining the program prior to the 2020 spring term as a transfer from St. Cloud State with four years of eligibility remaining after redshirting with the Huskies in the final season of SCSU's program.

Robby played each of the final seven games in 2021 while **Austin** redshirted in his first year in the program in 2021, but the brothers have each appeared in all three games to start the 2022 season.

FRESHMEN DEBUTS

A number of players made their Golden Bear debuts as freshmen or redshirt freshmen early on this season.

On defense, new starters up front include redshirt freshman **Keyshawn Pettis** (12 tackles, 0.5 TFL), and **Isaac Reed** (4 tackles, 2 QB hurries) on the interior of the defensive line along with **Drake Teal** (5 tackles) and **Javon Jones** (2 tackles, 1 QB hurry) on the edge.

Redshirt freshman **Richard Wauer** has started all three games at outside linebacker, collecting 13 total tackles. Redshirt freshman **Javon Carr** saw time as a reserve and special teams contributor in week one before picking up his first start at SMSU in week two and has back-to-back six tackle performances.

True freshman **Zantavious Graham** has been the team's starting cornerback this year, with four tackles and two pass breakups in three games while redshirt freshman corner **Quintin Balentine** has also cycled into the CB position, making three tackles and picking up his first start in week three.

Offensively, redshirt freshman **Jacob Cannon** has secured a pair of key receptions early (2-21) with a long of 11 at tight end while redshirt freshman tackle **Austin Carrillo** is the only freshman or redshirt freshman to see time along the offensive line so far.

Finally, while a number of other freshmen have seen the field in various packages and on special teams, the specialists received key contributions from new snappers **Peyton Ihns** (long), a true freshman, and **Caydon Christensen** (short), a redshirt freshman.

SHEEHAN LEADS THE SAFETIES

Sixth-year senior **Rhett Sheehan** has remained a top leader in the program, putting together strong performances in each of the first three weeks with eight tackles including two for loss while helping shut down the Viking pass game to just 7-14 for 62 yards on the evening.

He continued in week two by matching his career-high with 10 tackles at SMSU, adding another TFL while helping limit the Mustangs to 106 passing yards on 8-17 passing with two INTs.

His 3.0 tackles for loss to have already set a new career-high for the veteran safety.

Sheehan is fifth in the NSIC with 9.0 tackles per game while sparking a secondary that is 24th in the country with 145.3

passing yards allowed per game.

As a junior in 2021, Sheehan was an All-NSIC North Division Second Team safety, ranking second on the team and 23rd in the NSIC with 63 total tackles. His three interceptions, all in CSP's five home games, ranked ninth in the Northern Sun, and he added up 85 return yards in the process while adding two pass breakups for five passes defended, second-most on the team while contributing a team-leading two forced fumbles.

He's had at least four tackles in 12 straight games dating back to week three of 2021 at Sioux Falls, a run that includes his career-high of 10 tackles twice, once in 2021 and once in 2022 at SMSU.

In his career, Sheehan has secured 170 tackles and 6.0 TFLs across 36 games with a career-high 63 tackles in 2021. He has 12 career passes defended, three interceptions and two forced fumbles with one fumble recovery.

MCCLURE FINDS THE BALL

While Sheehan has been the sure-tackler in the secondary, it's been sophomore **Cyrus McClure** from the other safety position creating the turnovers with three interceptions in three games to start the 2022 season, ranking third in the country.

He had two INTs in the first quarter of the 2022 opener against Augustana, and added another INT against SMSU in

week two - the first three of his career.

He played in eight games as a freshman in 2021, including four starts, making 26 tackles with a pair of pass breakups, a forced fumble and a blocked kick.

He's taken his game to a new level to start 2022, adding 16 tackles to go with his three interceptions, which match Sheehan's total from last year's squad.

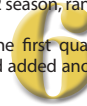
HILGEMANN STEPS UP

Sophomore linebacker **Brayden Hilgemann** has cracked the starting linebacker group at the MIKE position in the first three games, and is second on the team and eighth in the NSIC with 22 total tackles, he has the team's lone sack and he intercepted a pass at SMSU deep in the red zone in the fourth quarter.

He filled a void created with **Andrew Egnarski** missing the first two games of the season, although Egnarski has returned to the lineup in week three, making five tackles in his season debut.

Hilgemann played all 11 games in 2021, primarily on special teams, making 16 total tackles with 0.5 TFL.

In the 2022 opener in his first career start, Hilgemann produced a career-high eight tackles with a sack and a TFL. In week two, he showed consistency in his hometown of Mar-



shall, Minnesota, adding seven tackles to go with his INT. He's had at least seven tackles in each game this season.

Meanwhile, Egnarski led the 2021 team with 68 total tackles, earning NSIC Defensive Player of the Week honors in CSP's week two win over Upper Iowa with 11 tackles, 3.5 TFLs, 3.5 sacks, a forced fumble and fumble recovery. He produced 6.0 TFLs, tied for the team lead with 5.0 sacks and had an INT on the season.

TRENDING TOPIC: SACKS / WINS CORRELATION

In the 58 games since head coach **Shannon Currier** has been back with the program since 2016, the CSP defense has produced 4-plus sacks 14 times and had more sacks than the opponent 20 times.

In the 4-plus sack games, Concordia has a 10-4 record and has won six of its last eight games when sacking the quarterback four or more times.

When producing more sacks than the opponent which factors line play on both sides, Concordia is 12-9 since 2016.

DUNSMOOR LEADS DEFENSIVE LINE

The 2022 Concordia defensive line has been led by senior defensive end **Luke Dunsmoor**, who made a career-high nine tackles in week two at SMSU. The St. Cloud State transfer is fourth on the defense and leads the position group with 15 tackles on the season, adding a quarterback hurry in week one on a pass that was deflected by **McKinley Egland-Young** and intercepted by **Cyrus McClure**.

As a Golden Bear, Dunsmoor has played in 14 games, starting all three games of the 2022 season, and has amassed 43 total tackles with 4.0 TFLs and a 0.5 sacks.

Other defensive ends making an impact early on include redshirt freshman starter **Drake Teal** (5 tackles) on the other edge, sophomore transfer **Lucas Becker** (7 tackles) from South Dakota and sophomore **Ryan Martin** (4 tackles), a transfer from Minnesota Crookston in his third year at CSP. **Keegan Larson** made his 2022 debut in week three, making a tackle for loss against USF.

On the interior, Northern State transfer tackle **Koffi Gbekle** and redshirt freshman **Keyshawn Pettis** each have 12 tackles while **Isaac Reed** (4 tackles) and **Mel Jeudy** (7 tackles) have also made a difference up front.

The team also features numerous defensive linemen making their way back into the lineup from offseason injury, bolstering the unit over the course of the season.

CONTINUITY DEFINES OFFENSIVE LINE

The 2022 offensive line is defined by its continuity, with nearly the entire two-deep having played together for at least three seasons and many having gained valuable playing experience last season.

Junior center **Sam Marshalek** is the leader up front, entering the year with 21 games and 13 starts under his belt. Left tackle **Jake Edwards** is credited by the coaching staff as being among the league's best at his position, starting five games last year and playing in all 11.

The line features four former St. Cloud State players: Edwards, guards **Taylor Hensley** and **Sarek Hoerth** who have each started at CSP and **Robby Carrillo**, a key reserve tackle with solid game experience as a Golden Bear.

As a unit, the offensive line ranks 28th in the country and second in the NSIC with 1.00 sacks allowed per game, and ranks 29th in the country and third in the NSIC in fewest TFLs allowed per game (4.67).

WIDE RECEIVERS & TIGHT ENDS

Concordia's pass game is built upon its depth, with four different receivers picking up at least seven catches and 90 yards: Jaylin Richardson (7-99), Nathan Gimza (9-91), Drew Enke (8-96, TD) and Joey Farley (7-119, TD).

From the wide receivers group, **Jack Munsterteiger** (6-54), **Evan Peterson** (4-21), **Troy Ellison** (2-48, TD) and **Jaheim Arnold** (1-34) have all seen action, as well.

The tight ends have been led by **Jacob Cannon** (2-21) while squad's other tight ends to appear offensively include **Jake Dodd**, **Brock Thornton** and **Riley Heller** while **CJ Picazo** has changed to #44 to accommodate a role as a tight end, as well.

HENSON IN THE KICKING GAME

Concordia-St. Paul has featured some of the top kickers and punters in the Northern Sun as well as nationally over the past decade, and after new kickers debuted in 2021, the roles will be consistent once again in 2022 with the kicking game led by sophomore **Sam Henson**.

Henson entered the 2022 season as the 13th-ranked kicker in Division II football by The College Football Network and 20th-ranked by FBPI Football.

He was a three-time Fred Mitchell Award Watch List candidate in 2021, hitting the monthly recognition chart in September, October and November for the award that honors the top placekicker for their on-field and volunteer service in small college football (FCS, DII, DIII, NAIA, NJCAA).

Henson had a standout debut season in 2021, leading the NSIC and ranking 21st nationally with a 76.9 field goal percentage (10-13) while hitting 10-11 from inside of 50 yards with a long of 48 which he converted in his career debut at Winona State.

He ranked 40th in the country and fifth in the NSIC with 0.91 field goals made per game, a well.

He led the team in scoring in 2021 with 48 points, averaged 53.3 yards on 41 kickoffs with 10 touchbacks and made two field goals in a game twice.

In 2022, he's 3-6 on field goals, with his misses all being from 42-plus yards (42, 47, 50) while connecting on each of his trips to the red zone from 22, 24 and 25 yards.

He added his third career 2-field goal performance in week two at SMSU.

He's never missed a kick inside of 40 yards at Concordia, going 9-9 in his two seasons while hitting 22-23 on PAT attempts.

He's added power to his kickoffs in 2022, upping his average to 59.1 yards with three touchbacks on 11 kickoffs.

DAHLMAN IN THE PUNTING GAME

Like the kicking game, sophomore **Parker Dahlman** continues to provide one of the top legs to CSP for his second year as the Golden Bear punter.

In 2022, Dahlman has averaged 37.0 yards on 12 punts, but more importantly has dropped three inside the 20, has a fair catch and a 50-plus yard punt (57) with only one touchback.

In week two at SMSU, Dahlman put together three punts for a consistent 41.0 average with a long of 45 and all three punts pinning SMSU inside the 20.

As a freshman in 2021, Dahlman ranked fifth in the league with a 40.1 season punting average on a league-high 67 punts. His 12 punts of 50-plus yards topped the league charts, and his 14 punts inside the 20 finished two off the league lead, ranking third. He forced 12 fair catches and only had five touchbacks.

His 77 yard punt at Sioux Falls was the third longest in the league last year and the third-longest in program history.

His top single-game effort in his career, a 6-punt, 50.2 average at Sioux Falls (2021) with four punts of 50-plus yards, ranks as the best single-game punting average with at least five punts in a game.

In his young career, Dahlman's 39.65 career average is on pace to be a career record and his name is already plastered on the game, season and career punting charts for the program. *(see full punting records on page 11)*

SUPER BOWL CHAMPIONS

Concordia-St. Paul football has produced two Super Bowl winning players in the last decade: **Zach Moore** as a rookie with the 2014 New England Patriots and **Chris Garrett** as a rookie with the 2021 Los Angeles Rams.

A member of CSP's inaugural football team in 1969, **Michael Bailey** was signed by the Dallas Cowboys during preseason with the Cowboys eventually winning the Super Bowl and awarding Bailey a ring in recognition of his time with the organization.

Additionally, the CSP coaching staff has a Super Bowl ring as wide receivers coach **Michael Floyd**, now in his second year in the program, was a member of the 2016 New England Patriots title team.

Zach Moore, a 2014 NFL Draft Pick by the New England Patriots in the 6th round (198 overall), with a strip sack of Chicago Bears quarterback **Jay Cutler** in his rookie season in 2014. Moore was CSP football's first-ever NFL Draft selection and played in 26 games (2 starts) across five years in the NFL, suiting up for the Patriots, Minnesota Vikings (2015), Dallas Cowboys (2016) and Arizona Cardinals (2018) while also spending an offseason with the Carolina Panthers (2018).

Chris Garrett, a 2021 NFL Draft Pick by the LA Rams in the 7th round (252 overall), was CSP's second NFL Draft pick and helped the Rams to the Super Bowl as a rookie, turning heads in a preseason game against the Raiders with 1.5 sacks including a strip-sack, an additional TFL and a pass breakup. Last week (9/14), he signed a free agent contract to the Minnesota Vikings practice squad for the 2022 season.

Michael Floyd captured a Super Bowl while a member of the New England Patriots in 2016. He played 2012 games in seven NFL seasons, amassing 266 catches, 3,959 yards and 25 TDs with his top season in 2013 for the Arizona Cardinals with 65-1,049 and 5 TDs. He was a 2012 NFL Draft First Round pick of the Cardinals (13 overall).

Michael Bailey was a standout for the Comets' inaugural team in 1969 and again in 1970, compiling 1,652 yards and 25 rushing TDs, earning a spot on the Dallas Cowboys during preseason of their 1971 Super Bowl season.
