### THIS WEEK: CSP HOSTS UMD

This Saturday, Concordia will host Minnesota Duluth in its first NSIC North Division game of the season after opening division-play on the road at Bemidji State last Saturday.

Its just the third time UMD will play at Sea Foam Stadium since it opened in 2009, with UMD last visiting in 2016 in a 52-49 shootout win for the Bulldogs, while their first trip in 2012 featured a 70-24 UMD win.

### WEATHER OUTLOOK

Saturday in St. Paul is forecast for a high of 53 degrees, warming from an overnight low of 33 degrees on Friday evening into Saturday morning. Conditions will be partly cloudy in the morning turning to cloudy in the afternoon with winds from the west at 10-15 mph.

### FIFTH-RANKED STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE IN DIVISION II

The Golden Bears have had a daunting first half of the season, with a combined opponent record of 28-8 through six weeks and none of Concordia's opponents have more than two losses.

The Golden Bears add another 2-loss team to the strength of schedule this Saturday against Minnesota Duluth (4-2).

Entering week seven, CSP holds the 5th-toughest strength of schedule in Division II football with a past opposition winning percentage of .733 (excluding CSP games). The next closest NSIC teams are UMary and Minot State with the 18th-ranked strength of schedules (19-11, .636).

While unable to put a positive mark in the win column, the Golden Bears have remained competitive deep into the second half against Augustana (5-1), Southwest Minnesota State (4-2), Minnesota State (4-2) and Bemidji State (4-2).

# CSP LED BY "COACH C" - ALL-TIME WINS LEADER AT CSP

In 2018, head coach **Shannon Currier** became the school's all-time wins leader, winning his 41st game 16-10 at SMSU in week 10 on November 3, 2018, surpassing **Mark Mauer** (40-39), who coached the program for seven seasons from 2004-10.

Currier, now in his 11th overall season at Concordia, is closing

in on becoming the first coach to reach the 50-win milestone with a 48-57 career record. He has a 29-21 home record and is 9-1 in home openers. He's been head coach across two different stints, 2000 to 2003 and 2016-present while also serving as head coach at Truman State for five seasons from 2004-08. He was 2003 NSIC Coach of the Year, leading the program to its first NSIC Championship and the program's first-ever postseason appearance at the 2003 Mineral Water Bowl.

# NOTES ABOUT THE BULLDOGS

The Bulldogs are tied for first with a 2-0 NSIC North Division record and hold a 4-2 overall record, falling by a TD at Minnesota State in week two and by a field goal (34-31) at Sioux Falls in week four. They've scored 28-plus points in five of six games this year but have yet to post a road victory in two road contests. UMD will finish the season with four of five on the road starting this week at Sea Foam Stadium.

UMD leads the league and is 12th in the country in total defense and second in the league and 20th nationally in red zone defense, surrendering just 255.8 total yards per game and allowing opponents to reach the red zone just 11 times in six games, permitting only seven scores (all TDs).

The defense features big-play capability from **Day**via **Gbor** with a league-best four INTs (5th NCAA). **Brad Dati** leads the team with 39 tackles, adding 4.0 TFLs while **Drew Hennessey** leads the team with 6.0 sacks, adding a forced fumble and a recovery.

Offensively, UMD is third in the NSIC and 14th in the country in rushing offense (226.8). The heavy-run offense was ignited in a 49-14 win over UMary last week by signal-caller **Kyle Walljasper**, who is coming off of a 4-rushing TD performance on 123 rushing yards while adding a 29-yard pass on his lone completion.

Walljasper is second on the team with 368 rushing yards at 6.5 per carry with six TDs while **Wade Sullivan** leads the team with 439 yards, averaging 4.8 per carry on a team with four 100-plus yard rushers.

UMD has used two other QBs, **Garrett Olson** (65.2%, 536 yards, 5 TDs, 0 INTs) and **Logan Graetz** (49.2%, 428 yards, 4 TDs, 1 INT) while seven players have attempted passes on the roster. **Byron Bynum** is the top target with 17-266 receiving and five TDs.

On special teams, UMD limits opponents to just 9.8 yards per kickoff returns for a total of just 156 kickoff return yards on the season (26.0/game).

working out near his home in the Twin Cities that summer. Head coach **Shannon Currier** has opted to honor Brown by selecting a player who fits Billy's work ethic and commitment to the program to wear the number each season.

"Billy Brown's legacy has been talked about since the day I became a part of this football program, and rightfully so," said Cheeks. "The mark he left was one that was full of love for this team, passion for the game, and doing whatever it took to win. It is an honor to be able to wear that jersey as I know he is watching down on us and has sowed a seed that will never be forgotten."

Cheeks, a native of Aurora, Illinois, debuted in game action in 2021 with the jersey number 31, after redshirting in 2019 and missing 2020 due to the COVID-19 season cancellation. As a third-year member of the program, Cheeks played in seven games, including four starts at safety, finishing the year with 17 tackles (10 solo) with a season-high six tackles at UMD (10/16).

He's played all six games in 2022, picking up a start in week five against Minnesota State. On the year, he's made 10 tackles and picked up a fumble recovery. In 13 career games, Cheeks has 27 tackles, a pass breakup and a pair of fumble recoveries.

He served last year as the CSP Student-Athlete Advisory Committee President and this year was appointed as the NSIC's NCAA Division II National SAAC representative. Further, he was elected as the 2022-23 CSP Student Body President and appointed as one of the first two student-athletes to serve on the NCAA Division II President's Council, the highest-ranking body of NCAA DII governance.

Cheeks is a public relations major at Concordia with a minor in business management and marketing.

# **SERIES HISTORY: UMD 11, CONCORDIA 3**

The Golden Bears shocked the Bulldogs by scoring a 35-27 win at Griffin Stadium in St. Paul in CSP's first season of NCAA Division II football in 1999. Concordia showed it wasn't a fluke in 2000, winning 37-27 at Malosky Stadium and the all-time series was split at three games apiece when CSP secured a convincing 38-6 win over the Bulldogs at Griffin Stadium in 2004.

But the Bulldogs have taken command of the series since, winning the last eight meetings. CSP and UMD played to a pair of tightly contested games in 2014 with UMD winning 2013 in Duluth and again in 2016 with UMD winning 52-49, preventing CSP from a 3-0 start in head coach **Shannon Currier's** first season back with the team since 2003.

The 52-49 shootout also featured CSP with the ball late in the game and a chance to win it on their home turf in UMD's last trip to St. Paul.

The Bulldogs, who rejoined the NSIC in 2008, have only made two trips to Sea Foam Stadium, once in 2012 (70-24 UMD) and again in 2016 (52-49 UMD), but with CSP now in the NSIC North Division, the teams will square-off every year moving forward.

Coach Currier holds a 1-6 record against UMD, dropping the previous six after the 2000 road win.

# LAST MEETING, 2021: UMD 33, CONCORDIA 13

Concordia's offensive front faced one of its toughest tests of the year against a Bulldog defense that entered play leading the league with 285 yards of total offense allowed per game and a league-high 23 sacks. CSP's offensive line and game plan worked in concert, allowing just one sack and four tackles for loss while keeping CSP tied through the first quarter, within a field goal at the half and within 12 points entering the fourth quarter.

The Golden Bears kept UMD off the scoreboard for nearly the entire first half, with UMD finally converting a 51-yard field goal off the crossbar as time expired in the second quarter.

After shutting UMD down on the game's opening drive to a 3-andout with no yards gained, the Golden Bears executed the bend, but don't break defense well, forcing UMD to miss its first two field goals of the day on the next two drives in the red zone. Concordia had executed its first half game plan to perfection, taking 5:44 off the clock on a 5-minute, 44-second possession that resulted in a punt from their own 47-yard line, and a 12-play, 38-yard possession that spanned 7:45 of clock on its third possession that resulted in a punt from the UMD 42 yard line after advancing to the 32 yard line.

UMD also drained the clock, taking 8:10 off the clock on its second drive that saw the Bulldogs march 66 yards on 16 plays before a missed field goal into the wind at the CSP 14 yard line, and a 4:27 drive taking nine plays and 61 yards for a missed field goal from the CSP 19.

UMD's final drive of the half is what broke the scoreless tie, with UMD moving 52 yards in 11 plays to reach the CSP 34-yard line to set up the 51 yard field goal with the wind at their backs, needing just 1-minute and 16-seconds to do so.

It was the first of four made field goals for Bulldog kicker **Curt Cox**, who made his fourth field goal as the third quarter expired to cap a third quarter that featured three made field goals from 33, 31 and 28 yards to give UMD a 12-0 lead.

In week 7 at Malosky Stadium, the Golden Bears and Bulldogs each entered play with uncertainty on their two-deeps at the quarterback position. The previous week in St. Paul, four different players completed passes for the Golden Bears against BSU while three different Bulldogs had earned significant playing time since week four.

Against the Bulldogs, it was **Abe Schwartz** handling sole possession of the duties under center for CSP in his first career start. He completed 12-22 for 154 yards and a pair of fourth quarter touchdown passes including a long of 67 to **Mason Van Zeeland** on the first play of a drive following UMD's first touchdown to cut the score to 19-7 with 10:34 to play in the game.

He also connected with running back **Brian Lankford-Johnson** on 3rd-and-goal from the 2-yard line with 1:01 to play in the game's final score.

While Concordia was able to drain clock in the first half, the third quarter saw an aggressive Bulldog defense adapt, limiting CSP to just 12 plays and 30 yards.

With just 12 total points between the teams combined across the first three quarters, the offenses finally broke free for a 34-point fourth quarter, but it was UMD who found the end zone three times compared to two touchdowns for Concordia.

In the fourth quarter, Concordia flipped its result from the 30-yard third quarter, putting up 120 yards of total offense while averaging 8.6 yards per play to close the game out strong offensively.

Concordia's defense was led by **Andrew Egnarski's** nine tackles, with six coming in the fourth quarter. In the secondary, cornerback **Preston Piltoff** had three pass breakups while his lone tackle was behind the line of scrimmage as CSP had 6.0 team TFLs, two more than UMD.

Up front, defensive end **Richard Ficociello** had a two-sack performance while freshman defensive tackle **Brad Walker** secured his first career sack as CSP had three sacks to UMD's one.

**Jaylin Richardson** led CSP's ground game with 18 carries for 40 yards while Schwartz added 6-28 rushing. Out of the backfield, Lankford-Johnson had a pair of catches for 18 yards including a long of 16 along with the short touchdown catch.

In the pass game, seven different Golden Bears secured receptions out of 10 players targeted. Wide receiver **Jake Shepley** led the team in receptions with three, going for 36 yards. He competed against his brother, UMD safety **Marcus Shepley**, who had four tackles in the game to finish third on the Bulldogs in tackles.

# LAST WEEK: BEMIDJI STATE 44, CONCORDIA 0

Concordia's streak of 49-straight games without being shutout came to a close at Bemidji State, falling 44-0 to the Beavers. It was CSP's first shutout loss since 2016, a 38-0 loss at Winona State.

Junior linebacker **Andrew Egnarski** came one tackle within matching the school record for most tackles in a single game with 19 stops including a half tackle for loss, tying former teammate **Gabe Nkumu** for second-most in a game in program history.

Despite the final margin, CSP held firm with the Beavers, with BSU breaking a scoreless tie with 24 seconds to play in the first quarter and CSP trailing by just 13 points entering halftime. The Golden Bears had a chance to cut into the lead late in the first

 half but came up empty on downs at the BSU 24-yard line with 18 seconds to play before the break.

The stalled momentum carried over to the third quarter when CSP came up empty in the BSU red zone when the Beavers blocked a 31-yard field goal. After CSP's defense once again held up to the challenge against one of the nation's top passing offense, stopping BSU to a field goal on the ensuing drive for a 16-0 deficit, the Golden Bears fumbled on their next two possessions including the second time at the goal line, coming up empty on three scoring chances in a span of four possessions.

BSU countered by scoring points on five straight possessions including the field goal to make it 16-0, followed by four-straight TDs to put the game away.

Sophomore running back **Jaylin Richardson** led CSP with 16-84 rushing and a 16-yard reception to give him a 100-yard all-purpose day for the third time on the season. Sophomore wide receiver **Nathan Gimza** had his best game of the year with 4-76 receiving and a long of 37 and **Conner Cordts** completed 12-28 for 134 yards while adding 2-9 rushing. He didn't throw an INT and was not sacked in the game.

While Egnarski had the busy day on defense, he was aided by linebacker **Brayden Hilgemann's** six tackles and 1.0 TFL and cornerback **Zantavious Graham** who had six tackles and a pass breakup. **Anthony Ukofia** and **Keyshawn Pettis** each had a

tackle for loss, as well, and Javon Jones had his first career sack.

### FROM THE "GRIFF MYTH" TO "HOME SWEET FOAM"

Prior to head coach **Shannon Currier** returning to lead the Golden Bears, CSP had posted an 11-24 record at Sea Foam Stadium (2009 to 2015) and had never posted more than two home wins in a row with just two winning seasons since football returned to campus in 2009.

In Currier's first season back, the Bears won the 2016 home opener and did so again to start the 2017 season.

In 2017, CSP also nabbed a win in the home finale, a 37-20 win over SMSU that started a three game home winning streak, including the first two games of 2018, for the 3-game streak in Sea Foam Stadium's history. It was also the first 3-game home winning streak since the 2005 NSIC Championship season, played down the street at St. Paul Central High School's Griffin Stadium.

In Currier's first term leading the Bears (2000-03), he posted an 18-2 home record at Griffin Stadium, starting the "Griff Myth," a 19-game home winning streak that began in 2002 and spanned four full seasons of perfect home football (2002, 2003, 2004, 2005).

Currier now holds a 29-21 career record in home games at Concordia, a solid 9-1 mark in home openers, a 4-4 mark in home finales and led the team to a winning record at Sea Foam Stadium in 2018 for the third time since 2009.

# **HEAD COACH SHANNON CURRIER | 11TH SEASON**



Originally the 8th head coach of CSP football in 2000, Shannon Currier returned to lead the program for his 2nd stint in December, 2015.

He became the program's all-time wins leader on November 3, 2018 with a 16-10 win at SMSU.

In his first stint, he compiled a 32-12 (.727) record and brought the program its first NSIC Championship in 2003 when he was named NSIC Coach of the

Year. The conference title also brought a berth in the Mineral Water Bowl, the first postseason game in school history.

He coached Concordia to four consecutive winning seasons and is the only coach in program history to achieve the feat - consecutive or cumulative.

# THE GRIFF MYTH - PROTECTING HOME TURF

The team also established the longest home winning streak in school history under his guidance. Known to teams of the era as the "Griff Myth," Concordia tallied 19 consecutive home victories down the street at Griffin Stadium. The streak began in 2002 and stretched two years after Currier left through the 2005 season, finally falling at the beginning of 2006.

In Currier's first four years, his teams only lost two home games, producing a record of 18-2 after winning his first and last nine home games.

He opened his return to the program with a 17-0 shutout win over U-Mary in 2016, snapping a 6-game home losing streak and a former school record 8-game overall losing streak. His CSP teams are 9-1 all-time in home openers and he holds a career 29-21 home mark at Concordia between Griffin & Sea Foam Stadium.

# **CAREER AT TRUMAN**

Following the program's 2003 NSIC title run, Currier accepted the head coach position at Truman State where he turned a losing program into a pair of 6-5 winning campaigns in his 3rd and 4th seasons.

His tenure was highlighted in his third year, leading the Bulldogs to a 6-3 record in a strong MIAA, finishing fourth in the league. He left the program following a 4-7 season in 2008 with a 20-35 overall record.

# PRIOR TO REJOINING CONCORDIA'S SIDELINES

Following his departure from Truman, Currier spent seven years working outside of the coaching profession as a senior sales manager with iHigh.com working to build a digital platform for high school sports, reaching up to 1.5 million Minnesotans in his final year with the company.

### ADJUSTING TO THE NORTH

The Golden Bears have shifted to the NSIC North Division in the 2021 season after the elimination of football at St. Cloud State University and the University of Minnesota Crookston - both former members of the North Division.

The result of the 14-team NSIC is two 7-team divisions, where each program plays the other six teams once every year, rotating between home sites, while facing five of the seven teams from the opposite division.

Previously, CSP played seven games against the NSIC South Division, with that total cut down by two starting in 2021; and previously played the NSIC North four times, with that total increased by two.

In 2021, Concordia did not face Wayne State for the first time since joining the league in 1999, or Augustana for the first time since 2004, including four non-conference games with the Vikings each year from 2004 to 2007 with Augie joining the NSIC in 2008.

In 2022, Concordia will not face Winona State, halting an annual series that dates back to 1999 (22 games) and Upper Iowa, halting a streak of 15-straight meetings dating back to UIU's entry to the NSIC for the 2006-07 academic year.

The Golden Bears will now face every NSIC North team at home every other year, welcoming MSU Moorhead to Sea Foam Stadium for just the third time last year. Meanwhile, Minnesota Duluth heads to Sea Foam Stadium for the third-time ever this year, previously playing in St. Paul in 2012 and 2016.

Under head coach **Shannon Currier**, the Golden Bears are 16-18 against the NSIC North Division teams across his career and 5-14 against NSIC North Division teams since rejoining the program in 2016. The Golden Bears are seeking their first division win as members of the NSIC North Division (0-7).

### **TURNOVERS MATTER**

Since head coach **Shannon Currier** rejoined the program in 2016, Concordia has produced a 9-6 record when winning the turnover battle. Meanwhile, when losing the turnover battle, CSP is 2-25 and CSP is 5-12 when turnovers are even.

Through four weeks, CSP is -5 in turnover margin but the scoring margin doesn't reflect it, with opponents taking advantage to a +25 scoring margin, 31-6 off turnovers.

### SOPHOMORE QUARTERBACKS

In 2021 as freshmen, quarterbacks **Conner Cordts** and **Bryce Sievers** became the seventh and eighth players to start a game at quarterback as a freshman (or redshirt freshman) since Concordia made the jump to NCAA Division II in 1999.

Cordts joined elite company in becoming just the second freshman to start a season opener at quarterback, joining **James McNear**, who is a CSP and NSIC Hall of Famer and ended his career as the Division II leader in career total offense, playing from 2002-05.

Cordts started the first six games before a season-ending injury derailed his rookie season, committing just one turnover with one INT in 141 pass attempts after starting his career INT-free for 111 passes. Sievers earned playing time in six games, starting three.

# SOPHOMORE QB CONNER CORDTS

The Golden Bears entered the 2021 season with **Conner Cordts** declared the starter, just the second freshman opening day starting quarterback for the program since moving to NCAA Division II in 1999, joining CSP Athletic Hall of Famer, two-time NSIC Champion and a former Harlon Hill candidate **James McNear** (2002-05).

Cordts became the seventh freshman to start a game at QB since CSP football has been a Division II program (1999) - all of them having used a redshirt season prior to making their debut.

His freshman breakout game was a week 2 win over Upper Iowa in 2021, completing 20-of-27 for 249 yards and two touchdowns, playing turnover-free football under center.

Cordts topped the 300-yard mark for total offense in a game for the first time in week 4 against SMSU last year, passing for 260 yards and three TDs, adding 9-41 rushing (301 total offense).

It took him until his fourth career game until committing his first turnover, an interception that snapped a streak of 111 consecutive passes without an INT to start his career.

Injured in week six of his freshman year, the rookie signal-caller committed only one turnover in 2021.

In 2022, Cordts had his first career 300-yard passing performance, completing 18-46 for 306 with three TDs and one INT against Sioux Falls, averaging 17 yards per completion in the first 300-yard passing game since November 4, 2017 (**Ron Johnson**, at Augustana). Cordts also achieved a career-high of 365 yards of total offense and 59 rushing yards in the contest.

A point of emphasis for the Golden Bears is a more efficient passing game. Even a slight improvement in completion percentage and a decrease in interceptions can lead to a significant boost in wins.

Since **Shannon Currier** has returned to the program in 2016, when the Golden Bears complete at least 54 percent of passes, the team holds a 10-14 record (.417), with team producing a 6-28 record (.176) when completing sub-54 percent.

### **CONCORDIA ST CLOUD GOLDEN HUSKIES**

Concordia's week two road trip to face Southwest Minnesota State featured seven former St. Cloud State Huskies facing their former head coach **Scott Underwood**, who now patrols the SMSU sidelines in his first season with the Mustangs.

At the conclusion of the 2019 football season, the administrations at St. Cloud State University and the University of Minnesota Crookston made the difficult decision to end their football programs.

Immediately, the CSP coaches put together a plan and worked with Concordia administration to provide an opportunity for student-athletes to continue to pursue their goals towards graduating from college while remaining members of an NSIC football program.

**Coach Currier** and his staff successfully recruited 11 members of the 2019 SCSU team, and one from UMC.

Robby Carrillo, Luke Dunsmoor, Jake Edwards, Nathan Gimza, Taylon Hensley, Sarek Hoerth, Robert Kraklow, Dominic La-Combe, Luke Shepherd, Mason Van Zeeland and Nick Webley all joined Concordia from SCSU while Ryan Martin changed his golden from the Eagles to the Bears. They became a part of the campus community during the pandemic shortened spring 2020 semester and continued through the 2020-21 academic year.

In 2022, seven of the Huskies: Carrillo, Dunsmoor, Edwards, Gimza, Hensley, Hoerth, LaCombe and Shepherd, along with Martin from UMC, remain with team.

Meanwhile, Kraklow joined the coaching staff as a first-year graduate assistant working with the OL.

Look for the group to continue making a strong impact on the field for the Golden Bears.

Through six weeks, CSP ranks in the top half of the league, allowing 199.2 passing yards per game with four interceptions, three coming from sophomore safety **Cyrus McClure** who is 22nd in DII & 2nd NSIC in INTs/game.

### **GROUND CONTROL LEADS TO VICTORIES**

Since 2016 when **Shannon Currier** returned to CSP's sidelines, Concordia has rushed for 200-plus yards 12 times, producing an 8-4 record.

By contrast, when Concordia holds opponents under 100 yards, the Golden Bears hold a similar record at 8-3.

Just five times since 2016 have the Golden Bears rushed for 200-plus and held an opponent to under 100 yards in the same game - with CSP producing a 4-1 record in those contests, most recently a 2019 week 10 win over SMSU.

# **DIVISION I BACKFIELD**

Concordia's running game entering the 2022 season features its top four backs as Division I transfers: Northern Iowa transfer **Jaylin Richardson**, now a sophomore in his second year at CSP, has opened the year as the lead back.

He had his best game as a college running back in week two at SMSU, rushing for 175 yards on 12.5 per carry (14-175). He got stronger as the game wore on, with 9-151 in the second half, ripping off runs of 20, 31 and 74 yards in the process.

Richardson topped 100 all-purpose yards again in week five against Minnesota State with 18-81 rushing, 3-7 with a receiving TD and a 33-yard kickoff return for 121 a/p yards and in week six at Bemidji State with 16-84 rushing and 1-16 receiving.

He's the league's fourth-leading rusher (75.8/game) and sixth in the NSIC with 115.7 all-purpose yards per game. The versatile back is tied for the team lead with 16 receptions (16-141) and has found the end zone twice, once on the ground and once by air.

Richardson was a highly recruited RB from the Kansas City area, initially committing to Kansas before signing with Northern lowa where he was an early enrollee in spring 2020. He made his debut in the 2021 COVID shortened spring season for the Panthers, and retained his full eligibility for his CSP career.

In 2021, Richardson led CSP with 61.6 all-purpose yards per game, playing in seven games with three starts. He was second on the team in rushing yards (234) while leading the backfield with two rushing TDs. He added 15-85 rec and 5-99 on KR.

In his two seasons with CSP, Richardson has compiled 689 rushing yards in 13 games, averaging 4.5 yards per carry with three TDs while adding 31-226 with a receiving TD, 9-197 on kickoff returns and 4-13 on punt returns for 1,125 all-purpose yards.

He's aided by Kansas transfer **Gayflor Flomo** who had 7-18 rushing including a TD run in the season opener and through five games has 23-77 rushing and 9-186 on kick returns (20.7).

Flomo, originally from the metro (Fridley) and graduate of Totino-Grace High School, was a standout at lowa Western Community College out of high school before transferring to Kansas where he was an Academic All-Big 12 Second Team selection, playing in nine games and earning six carries for the Jayhawks.

A transfer from Northern Colorado, **Jaire Moore** has turned on the gas with his rushing as of late, ranking third on the team (30-135) while adding 4-87 receiving. He's added a pair of long touchdowns, a 32-yard run in week five against MSU and a 64-yard receiving TD in week three against USF. He joined the kickoff return group in week six and is 3-72 (24.0) on the year and is second on the team with 294 all-purpose yards.

Moore is originally from Dallas, Texas and rushed 12-38 for Northern Colorado in 2021, spending three seasons there including a redshirt and a missed year due to COVID-19.

Senior running back **Ethan Falaniko**, a transfer from South Dakota, returned to the lineup for the 2022 season after missing 2021 due to injury. He spent three seasons with the Coyotes before heading to St. Paul where he's now in his fourth year, a career disrputed by the missed COVID season

as well as a medical hardship. He picked up an 11-yard reception in week three against Sloux Falls and earned a start in week four at Wayne State but has missed the past two games.

Concordia's backfield also includes **Daimarion Nelson**, a St. Paul native who had 15-52 rushing last year with a TD as well as true freshman **Daniel Hornacek** who has made his early impact on the field as a member of the special teams, securing his first snaps on offense in week four at Wayne State with a carry for two yards and a 26-yard reception.

### **BROTHERLY LOVE**

The 2021 Concordia-St. Paul roster features two sets of brothers: **Mel** & **El-Osiris Jeudy**, along with **Robby** & **Austin Carrillo**.

The **Jeudys** are from Miami, Florida with Mel joining the program as a transfer prior to the 2020 spring term and El-Osiris being a freshman during the 2020-21 academic year.

Mel, a senior nose tackle, played three games at Alderson Broaddus University, a Division II program in 2019 after spending his first two years of college football at Division I Eastern Kentucky, including a redshirt season. He has played in 16 career games for CSP including 10 starts up front. In 2021, he put up 22 total tackles and 4.0 TFLs. He's made nine tackles in 2022 through six weeks including a 5-tackle performance against USF in week three.

**El-Osiris**, a sophomore linebacker, has appeared in 15 career games. With an increased role in 2022, he's made 20 tackles in six games. He made his first career start in week three against USF, making a career-high six tackles, starting again in week four at WSC with another career-high of eight tackles against the Wildcats in the midst of a stretch of three-straight starts, including a week five forced fumble against Minnesota State.

The **Carrillos** are offensive linemen from Case High School in Racine, Wisconsin with **Robby** joining the program prior to the 2020 spring term as a transfer from St. Cloud State with four years of eligibility remaining after redshirting with the Huskies in the final season of SCSU's program.

**Robby** played each of the final seven games in 2021 while **Austin** redshirted in his first year in the program in 2021. The brothers each appeared in the first three games to start the 2022 season. While Austin has been inactive the past three weeks, Robby has picked up three straight starts at right tackle.

# FRESHMEN DEBUTS

A number of players made their Golden Bear debuts as freshmen or redshirt freshmen early on this season.

On defense, new starters up front include redshirt freshman **Keyshawn Pettis** (18 tackles, 1.5 TFL), and **Isaac Reed** (8 tackles, 2 QB hurries, 1 blocked kick) on the interior of the defensive line along with **Drake Teal** (12 tackles, 0.5 TFL, 0.5 sacks) and **Javon Jones** (4 tackles, 1.0 TFL, 1.0 sacks, 2 QB hurries) on the edge.

Redshirt freshman **Richard Wauer** has started all six games at outside linebacker, collecting 32 total tackles, 1.5 TFLs and a fumble recvoery. Redshirt freshman **Jawon Carr** saw time as a reserve and special teams contributor in week one before picking up his first start at SMSU in week two when he produced back-to-back six-tackle performances in weeks 2-3 and has 14 tackles on the year.

True freshman **Zantavious Graham** has been one of the team's starting cornerbacks this year, with 22 tackles (14 solo) and a team-high four pass breakups while redshirt freshman corner **Quintin Balentine** has also cycled into the CB position, making three tackles and picking up his first start in week three. True freshman **Dylan Phillips** and redshirt freshman **Hudson Jean** have also cycled in at corner, playing three games each.

Offensively, redshirt freshman **Jacob Cannon** secured a pair of key receptions in the first two weeks (2-21) at tight end while redshirt freshman tackle **Austin Carrillo** is the only freshman or redshirt freshman to see time along the offensive line so far.

The skill position group has seen running back **Daniel Hornacek** receive playing time each week on special teams

before making his debut on offense in week four at Wayne State, receiving his first carry for two yards and his first reception for 26 yards. In the pass game, redshirt freshman **Troy Ellison** had his first two catches in week three against Sioux Falls for 48 yards, breaking a TD for 32 yards and now has 7-92 receiving in four games. Redshirt freshman receiver **Julius Reynolds** had his first career catch in week four at Wayne State, getting into the end zone for a 13-yard TD catch and true freshman receiver **Dion Green** made his debut in week five against MSU, drawing a pair of red zone targets before picking up his first catch for one yard in week six at BSU.

Redshirt freshman quarterback **Jaylen DeVries** made his debut in week four at Wayne State, completing two passes for 35 yards.

Finally, while a number of other freshmen have seen the field in various packages and on special teams, the specialists received key contributions from new snappers **Peyton Ihns** (long), a true freshman, and **Caydon Christensen** (short), a redshirt freshman.

# SHEEHAN LEADS THE SAFETIES

Sixth-year senior **Rhett Sheehan** has remained a top leader in the program, putting together a strong first half of 2022.

He opened the season with a strong performance with eight tackles including two for loss while helping shut down the Augustana pass game to just 7-14 for 62 yards.

He continued in week two by matching his career-high with 10 tackles at SMSU, adding another TFL while helping limit the Mustangs to 106 passing yards on 8-17 passing with two INTs.

His 3.0 tackles for loss on the year in the first two games set a new career-high for the veteran safety, who has now made a team-high 41 tackles in six games in 2022.

Sheehan is eighth in the NSIC with 6.8 tackles per game while leading a secondary that ranks among the league's upper half, allowing less than 200 passing yards per game.

As a junior in 2021, Sheehan was an All-NSIC North Division Second Team safety, ranking second on the team and 23rd in the NSIC with 63 total tackles. His three interceptions, all in CSP's five home games, ranked ninth in the Northern Sun, and he acked up 85 return yards in the process while adding two pass breakups for five passes defended, second-most on the team while contributing a team-leading two forced fumbles.

In his career, Sheehan has secured 184 tackles and 6.0 TFLs across 39 games with a career-high 63 tackles in 2021. He has 12 career passes defended, three interceptions and two forced fumbles with one fumble recovery.

# MCCLURE FINDS THE BALL

While Sheehan has been the sure-tackler in the secondary, it's been sophomore **Cyrus McClure** from the other safety

position creating the turnovers with three interceptions on the year, ranking 22nd in the country and second in the NSIC.

He had two INTs in the first quarter of the 2022 opener against Augustana, and added another INT against SMSU in week two - the first three picks of his career.

He played in eight games as a freshman in 2021, including four starts, making 26 tackles with a pair of pass breakups, a forced fumble and a blocked kick.

He's taken his game to a new level to start 2022, adding 27 tackles which ranks fifth on the CSP defense, to go with his three INTs along with 1.0 TFL.

#### HILGEMANN STEPS UP

Sophomore linebacker **Brayden Hilgemann** cracked the starting linebacker group at the MIKE position to start the year, recently moving to one of the OLB spots, and is second on the team and 15th in the NSIC with 37 total tackles, adding 2.0 TFLs, 1.0 sacks and his INT at SMSU was deep in the red zone in the fourth quarter in a tight week two loss to the Mustangs.

In the 2022 opener in his first career start, Hilgemann produced a career-high eight tackles with a sack and a TFL. In week two, he showed consistency in his hometown of Marshall, Minnesota, adding seven tackles to go with his INT. He's had at least four tackles in each game this season.

Hilgemann played all 11 games in 2021, primarily on special teams, making 16 total tackles with 0.5 TFL.

He filled a void created with **Andrew Egnarski** missing the first two games of the season, although Egnarski returned to the lineup in week three, making five tackles in his season debut against Sioux Falls and has now made 34 tackles with 1.5TFL in four games, returning to the top of the two-deep at the MIKE linebacker position.

He had his career-high with 19 tackles in week six at Bemidji State, tied with former teammate **Gabe Nkumu** for the second-most in a game in team history, just one shy of the school record.

In 2021, Egnarski led the team with 68 total tackles, earning NSIC Defensive Player of the Week honors in CSP's week two win over Upper lowa with 11 tackles, 3.5 TFLs, 3.5 sacks, a forced fumble and fumble recovery. He produced 6.0 TFLs, tied for the team lead with 5.0 sacks and had an INT on the season.

# TRENDING TOPIC: SACKS / WINS CORRELATION

In the 61 games since head coach **Shannon Currier** has been back with the program since 2016, the CSP defense has produced 4-plus sacks 14 times and had more sacks than the opponent 22 times.

In the 4-plus sack games, Concordia has a 10-4 record and has won six of its last eight games when sacking the quarterback four or more times.

When producing more sacks than the opponent which factors line play on both sides, Concordia is 12-10 since 2016.

### **DUNSMOOR LEADS DEFENSIVE LINE**

The 2022 Concordia defensive line has been led by senior defensive end **Luke Dunsmoor**, who made a career-high nine tackles in week two at SMSU while playing against his former head coach Scott Underwood.

The St. Cloud State transfer is sixth on the defense and leads the position group with 24 tackles on the season, adding a team-high four quarterback hurries with his first hurry of the year in week one on a pass that was deflected by **McKinley Egland-Young** and intercepted by **Cyrus McClure**. He also has 2.0 TFLs and a half sack on the season.

As a Golden Bear, Dunsmoor has played in 17 games, starting four times in the 2022 season, and has amassed 52 total career tackles with 6.0 TFLs and a 1.0 sacks.

Other defensive ends making an impact early on include redshirt freshman starter **Drake Teal** (12 tackles, 0.5 sacks) who has started three times at the other edge, sophomore transfer **Lucas Becker** (16 tackles, 2.0 TFL, 1.0 sack) with three starts on the edge from South Dakota and sophomore **Ryan Martin** (5 TT, 1.0 TFL), a transfer from Minnesota Crookston in his third year at CSP. **Keegan Larson** made his 2022 debut in week three, making a tackle for loss against USF before earning back-to-back starts in weeks four and five (5 TT, 1.0 TFL).

On the interior, Northern State transfer tackle **Koffi Gbekle** is second among DL in tackles with 22, and redshirt freshman **Keyshawn Pettis** has added 18 tackles while **Isaac Reed** (8 tackles) and **Mel Jeudy** (9 tackles) have also made a difference up front. So far, Reed leads the DTs with four strarts, Pettis and Gbekle have three starts, and Jeudy two.

Sophomore **Brad Walker** returned to the field in week five following an offseason injury, making two tackles against MSU and has four tackles (0.5 TFL) in two games.

The team also features numerous defensive linemen continuing to make their way back into the lineup from offseason injury, bolstering the unit over the course of the season.

#### CONTINUITY DEFINES OFFENSIVE LINE

The 2022 offensive line is defined by its continuity, with nearly the entire two-deep having played together for at least three seasons and many having gained valuable playing experience last season.

Junior center **Sam Marshalek** is the leader up front with 27 games and 19 starts under his belt, occupying the center position in 2022. Left tackle **Jake Edwards** is credited by the coaching staff as being among the league's best at his position and has 11 career starts among his 17 games played at CSP.

The line features four former St. Cloud State players: Edwards, guards **Taylon Hensley** and **Sarek Hoerth** and tackle **Robby Carrillo**. All of the SCSU transfer offensive linemen have started in their time at CSP and are continuing to contribute to the travel roster and offensive line rotation.

The group also features starting guard **Elliott Wolfe** and sophomore tackle **Jac Carver**.

As a unit, the offensive line ranks 16th in the country and fourth in the NSIC with 1.0 sacks allowed per game, and ranks 27th in the country and fourth in the NSIC in fewest TFLs allowed per game (4.67). They've paved the way for sophomore running back **Jaylin Richardson** who is the league's fourth leading rusher with 75.8 rushing yards per game while averaging 5.8 per carry while the three quarterbacks have combined for just three interceptions in 216 team pass attempts while being sacked just six times.

### WIDE RECEIVERS & TIGHT ENDS

Concordia's pass game is built upon its depth, with five different targets picking up at least 13 catches and 138 yards: Jack Munsterteiger (16-138), Jaylin Richardson (16-141, TD), Joey Farley (16-177, TD), Drew Enke (13-193, TD), and Nathan Gimza (13-167).

From the wide receivers group, **Evan Peterson** (7-45), **Troy Ellison** (7-92, TD), **Jaheim Arnold** (2-64), **Julius Reynolds** (1-13, TD) and **Dion Green** (1-1) have all secured receptions.

The tight ends have been led by Jacob Cannon (2-21) in the pass game while the squad's other tight ends to appear offensively include Jack Dodd, Brock Thornton and Riley Heller while CJ Picazo has changed to #44 to accommodate a role as a tight end, as well.

# HENSON IN THE KICKING GAME

Concordia-St. Paul has featured some of the top kickers and punters in the Northern Sun as well as nationally over the past decade, and after new kickers debuted in 2021, the two roles will be consistent once again in 2022 with the kicking game led by sophomore **Sam Henson**.

Henson entered the 2022 season as the 13th-ranked kicker in Division II football by The College Football Network and 20th-ranked by FBPI Football.

Henson was recently named a Fred Mitchell Award Watch List candidate for his performance on the field and in the community for September, 2022, his fourth time earning monthly watch list honors for the award that honors the top placekicker for their on-field and volunteer service in small college football (FCS, DII, DIII, NAIA, NJCAA).

Henson had a standout debut season in 2021, leading the

NSIC and ranking 21st nationally with a 76.9 field goal percentage (10-13) while hitting 10-11 from inside of 50 yards with a long of 48 which he converted in his career debut at Winona State.

He ranked 40th in the country and fifth in the NSIC with 0.91 field goals made per game, a well.

He led the team in scoring in 2021 with 48 points, averaged 53.3 yards on 41 kickoffs with 10 touchbacks and made two field goals in a game twice.

In 2022, he's 3-10 on field goals, with his misses all being either from 42-plus yards (42, 46, 47, 50) or being blocked (3). He's connected on his other three attempts from 22, 24 and 25 yards. He added his third career 2-field goal performance in week two at SMSU.

In his career, he's connected on 13 of his 23 field goal attempts with a long of 48 yards and he's cashed in all but one of his PATs (26-27).

He's added power to his kickoffs in 2022, upping his average to 59.9 yards with four touchbacks on 18 kickoffs.

### DAHLMAN IN THE PUNTING GAME

Like the kicking game, sophomore **Parker Dahlman** continues to provide one of the top legs to CSP for his second year as the Golden Bear punter.

In 2022, Dahlman is seventh in the NSIC with a 39.0 average on the second-fewest punts (23) in the NSIC, but more importantly has dropped fiveinside the 20, has six fair catches and a pair of 50-plus yard punts (57, 61). His directional punting and hangtime have helped the special teams hold opponents to just two punt return attempts for eight yards on the season for a standout 37.3 net punting average.

In week two at SMSU, Dahlman put together three punts for a consistent 41.0 average with a long of 45 and all three punts pinning SMSU inside the 20.

In week four, he averaged 49.0 yards on three punts with a long of 61 yards at Wayne State, the fifth-best single game average in school history with at least two punts in a game.

As a freshman in 2021, Dahlman ranked fifth in the league with a 40.1 season punting average on a league-high 67 punts. His 12 punts of 50-plus yards topped the league charts, and his 14 punts inside the 20 finished two off the league lead, ranking third. He forced 12 fair catches and only had five touchbacks.

His 77 yard punt at Sioux Falls was the third longest in the league last year and the third-longest in program history.

His top single-game effort in his career, a 6-punt, 50.2 average at Sioux Falls (2021) with four punts of 50-plus yards, ranks as the best single-game punting average with at least five punts in a game.

In his young career, Dahlman's 39.83 career average is on pace to be a career record and his name is already plastered on the game, season and career punting charts for the program. (see full punting records on page 11)
