THIS WEEK: CSP TRAVELS TO MSU MOORHEAD

The Golden Bears will make head to Moorhead, Minnesota and Nemzek Stadium to square off against the MSU Moorhead Dragons in NSIC North Division play.

WEATHER OUTLOOK

Saturday in Moorhead is expected feature a high of 47 degrees, sunshine pregame transitioning to partly cloudy by the end of the game and a SSE 8-11 mph wind. A noon kickoff could see temperatures in the upper 30s at kickoff, warming throughout the afternoon.

#12 NCAA STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

Despite finally facing a team with a sub-.500 record in week nine against a 1-7 UMary squad, Concordia's strength of schedule still ranks #12 in the nation, dropping from fifth last week.

CSP's opposition has posted a 43-29 record in non-CSP contests, a .597 cumulative winning percentage.

It remains the toughest strength of schedule in the Northern Sun, with Augustana next in line in 19th (.583, 42-30).

While unable to put a positive mark in the win column, the Golden Bears have remained competitive into the second half against Augustana (6-3), Southwest Minnesota State (4-5), Minnesota State (7-2), Bemidji State (7-2), Northern State (6-3), and UMary (2-7) - in that order.

CSP LED BY "COACH C" - ALL-TIME WINS LEADER AT CSP

In 2018, head coach **Shannon Currier** became the school's all-time wins leader, winning his 41st game 16-10 at SMSU in week 10 on November 3, 2018, surpassing **Mark Mauer** (40-39), who coached the program for seven seasons from 2004-10.

Currier, now in his 11th overall season at Concordia, is closing in on becoming the first coach to reach the 50-win milestone with a 48-59 career record. He has a 29-23 home record and is 9-1 in home openers. He's been head coach across two different stints, 2000 to 2003 and 2016-present while also serving as head coach at Truman State for five seasons from 2004-08. He was 2003 NSIC Coach of the Year, leading the program to its first NSIC Championship and the program's first-ever postsea-

son appearance at the 2003 Mineral Water Bowl.

NOTES ABOUT THE DRAGONS

The Dragons enter Saturday's game with three victories on the season, taking care of business against teams lower in the standings with a 24-21 week two win at Upper Iowa (1-8), a 36-14 week six win at home against Minot State (0-9) and a 40-38 week eight road win at UMary (2-7).

Aside from an 8-point loss (36-28) at Minnesota Duluth, the Dragons have not come within two touchdowns of anyone else in the Northern Sun.

The Dragons feature a strong passing attack, ranking 15th in the country and second in the NSIC with 282.3 air yards per game led by top receiver **Gage Florence** who leads the country with 9.9 catches per game and is 15th in the nation and second in the NSIC with 97.2 receiving yards per game.

Quarterback **Jack Strand's** 263.7 passing yards per game ranks 18th in the country and second NSIC while backup **Tommy Falk** adds 99.3 yards per game as each passer has played in seven of the team's nine games. Strand has a 13-10 TD-INT ratio and 68.3% of his 281 passes while Falk is completing 52.6% with a 3-2 TD-INT ratio in 133 attempts.

While Florence leads the targets at 89-979 with six TDs, the receiving threats are deep, with **Ryan Beiberdorf** (35-538, 3 TDs), **Carter Birrenkott** (35-416, 4 TDs) and **Brady Perryman** (29-294, 3 TDs) all complimenting him.

Running back **Luke Imdieke** is more of a threat in the pass game, with 49 catches for 292 yards with a 6.0 average than he is on the ground, where he averages 2.9 yards per carry with 179 rushing yards.

The Dragons only average 16.0 rushing yards as a team, with **Tyson Powell** (24-98) and **Hayden Boll** (46-75, 4 TDs) each contributing. The team has been sacked 42 times on the season, subtracting 304 yards from the team rushing totals.

Defensively, **Josiah Behm** (77 TT, 8.0 TFL) and **Marcus Gulley** (68 TT, 9.0 TFL, 4.0 SK) lead the squad while **Jake Bettcher** (44 TT, 4 INT) and **Cody Sorenson** (39 TT, 8 PBU, 1 INT) lead the secondary.

MSUM is 12th nationally with a team 16.50 punt return average but have only returned six punts with **Kolby Vander Wal** returning his only attempt for a 51-yard touchdown while Landon Lundquist has 418 kickoff return yards on 20 attempts.

became a part of this football program, and rightfully so," said Cheeks. "The mark he left was one that was full of love for this team, passion for the game, and doing whatever it took to win. It is an honor to be able to wear that jersey as I know he is watching down on us and has sowed a seed that will never be forgotten."

Cheeks, a native of Aurora, Illinois, debuted in game action in 2021 with the jersey number 31, after redshirting in 2019 and missing 2020 due to the COVID-19 season cancellation. As a third-year member of the program, Cheeks played in seven games, including four starts at safety, finishing the year with 17 tackles (10 solo) with a season-high six tackles at UMD (10/16).

He played in the first six games in 2022, picking up a start in week five against Minnesota State. On the year, he's made 10 tackles and picked up a fumble recovery. In 13 career games, Cheeks has 27 tackles, a pass breakup and a pair of fumble recoveries.

He served last year as the CSP Student-Athlete Advisory Committee President and this year was appointed as the NSIC's NCAA Division II National SAAC representative. Further, he was elected as the 2022-23 CSP Student Body President and appointed as one of the first two student-athletes to serve on the NCAA Division II President's Council, the highest-ranking body of NCAA DII governance.

Cheeks is a public relations major at Concordia with a minor in business management and marketing.

SERIES HISTORY: CONCORDIA 10, MSU MOORHEAD 4

Despite being in the same conference since 1999, the Golden Bears and Dragons will only be meeting for the 15th time this Saturday with Concordia making its eighth trip to Moorhead.

The Golden Bears hold decisive advantages in both the overall (10-4) and road (5-2) series although the Dragons have captured wins in three of the last four contests since 2015, marking a dramatic turnaround as CSP won the first five and nine of the first 10 matchups through 2013.

Head coach **Shannon Currier's** Golden Bear squads hold a 4-2 record against MSU Moorhead, winning on the road in 2002 (35-28) and 2003 (34-17) while dropping the last visit 21-20 in 2017.

LAST MEETING, 2021: MSUM 24, CONCORDIA 3

The Golden Bear defense once again had its hands full against a pass-first NSIC North Division opponent, hosting the fifth-ranked passing offense in the league (274.8 per game), having previously played each of the top three passing programs in the league in the four weeks leading up to the tilt.

Concordia rose to the occasion early, holding the Dragons to just 42 yards on 18 plays in the first quarter including just 36 passing yards despite 6-of-8 passing. CSP's defense also held MSUM to 1-of-5 on third downs and stopped the Dragons on fourth down on the CSP 17 yard line when **Kahlil Robinson** broke up a 4th-and-2 pass near the sideline.

The result of the strong defensive quarter was a scoreless tie, the fifth time of the season that CSP had either led or been tied at the end of the first quarter.

The Dragons finally broke through with a short rushing touchdown early in the second quarter, converting a 4th-and-1 and a 3rd-and-2 to keep the drive moving.

Three plays later, MSUM picked up its second INT at the CSP 40-yard line and scored on a 26-yard pass on the next play to claim a sudden 14-0 lead just over three and a half minutes into the quarter.

From there, the Golden Bear defense held the Dragons scoreless for the next three possessions, keeping the game within reach, 14-0 at the break.

The defense issued just 131 yards of total offense in the first half including a pair of sacks and three tackles for loss from **Keegan Larson**. While Larson had a pair of first half sacks, it was **Mark O'Reilly** who would add two more sacks in the second half while **Luke Dunsmoor** had a pair of tackles for loss in the game.

In the third quarter, the offense started to roll as sophomore line-backer **Chandler Dahlquist** bruised his way forward for a pair of 5-yard runs to open the drive with QB **Bryce Sievers** scrambling 7-yards for a first down, CSP's second first down of the game.

It was the first two of three 5-yard runs by Dahlquist on the drive and the first of two third down conversions by Sievers, who would connect with **Mason Van Zeeland** for 16 yards on 3rd-and-4 from the CSP 43 to push the ball into MSUM territory.

Dahlquist, who converted to running back prior to week 9 at UMary, carried 13 times for 21 yards in a strong effort while Sievers led the team's ground game with 24 rushing yards on eight carries which included eight lost yards from three sacks.

Sievers also added a 16-yard pass to **Jaheim Arnold** two plays later, moving into field goal range where **Sam Henson** delivered from 41 yards with plenty of distance to spare. It was Henson's third field goal from 40-plus yards on the year.

In the third quarter, the Golden Bears out-gained the Dragons with 78 yards of total offense compared to MSUM's 70 as each team produced a field goal in the quarter, keeping the game within reach at 17-3 at the end of three quarters.

In the fourth quarter, each team had just two possessions, but the Dragons converted in their trip to the red zone, a 16-yard touchdown pass to complete a 12-play, 80-yard drive most importantly spanning 4:48 of clock time to extend the lead to 24-3, a three-score margin with just 8:18 to play.

Concordia answered with a strong drive, with Sievers connecting with Van Zeeland twice for gains of 15 and 16 yards to move into MSUM territory to the 35-yard line with **Isaiah Koran** rushing for 13 yards into the red zone at the 11-yard line.

Sievers completed 11-of-26 for 116 yards on the day, with five of his completions to Van Zeeland for 61 yards and three to Arnold for 39 yards. He targeted seven different receivers.

A completion to **Jack Munsterteiger** moved the ball to the 3-yard line, the Golden Bears were stopped on 4th-and-1 from the MSUM 2-yard line, turning it over on downs to the Dragons with just under four minutes left, with MSUM running out the clock on the ensuing drive.

The Golden Bears tackling leaders were veterans **Andrew Egnarski** (11), **Dalton Smerchek** (9) and **Rhett Sheehan** (9) with Larson and O'Reilly each adding six and Dunsmoor five.

The Dragons were led by quarterback **Tommy Falk** and wide receiver **Grady Bresnahan**. Falk completed 12 of his 33 passes to Bresnahan, accounting for 119 of his 274 yards and both Dragon passing scores. Falk completed 33-of-41 and was sacked four times.

Luke Imdieke led MSUM's ground game with 11-39 and a TD.

LAST WEEK: UMARY 23, CONCORDIA 13

Concordia junior linebacker **Andrew Egnarski** set the single game record with 22 tackles including eight solo stops and a pair of tackles for loss in the game. The 22 tackles is one shy of the NCAA Division II single game high for the season, currently held by Grant Bruner of Washburn with 23.

Earlier this year, Egnarski produced 19 tackles at Bemidji State, the sixth-most in a game in the country this year, giving him the top two single game tackles totals in the NSIC. In just seven games, he's made a career-high 76 tackles this season and has 159 in 29 career games.

He broke **Mike Willett's** 2012 record against Upper Iowa, making 20 tackles against the Peacocks at Sea Foam Stadium.

While Concordia's offense was slow to get rolling, the second half provided some highlights as sophomore running back **Jaylin Richardson** had a pair of touchdowns, a 21-yard reception from **Conner Cordts** on the final play of the third quarter and a 2-yard plunge with 6:54 to play in the fourth quarter. His touchdowns each brought the deficit back to 10 points after the Marauders opened with a 17-0 lead, scoring a field goal in the first quarter and touchdowns in the second and third quarters.

Richardson finished with 95 all-purpose yards, with 12-45 rushing and adding 4-50 receiving with 53 yards after the catch.

With Concordia on the comeback trail in the fourth, the Marauders pushed in a score from 1-yard out on the ground after a 57-yard kickoff return by All-American wide receiver **Danny Kittner** set them up with strong field position, leading to the score.

The Concordia defense performed well against Kittner, who

was stifled offensively with just three catches for 21 yards while being targeted nine times, picking up only four yards after the catch. He had 93 all-purpose yards on the day including a pair of punt returns (2-14) and the big play on the kickoff return (1-57). Entering play, he was seventh in the country with 166.1 all-purpose yards per game, second in the nation with 8.9 receptions per game and ninth in the country with 833 receiving yards.

The defense produced seven pass breakups with **Zantavious Graham** and **Rhett Sheehan** each picking up a pair, while sophomore safety **Cyrus McClure** secured his fourth interception of the year as Concordia outscored Mary 6-0 off turnovers.

The secondary held Marauder backup quarterback **Jesse Forknell**, who started in place of **Logan Nelson**, to 15-30 passing for 147 yards. But he picked up a receiving TD, as Kittner completed a 4th-and-2 on a reverse pass play to the QB late in the third quarter to cap a 7-minute, 44-second drive to make it a 17-point game.

The Marauders were 4-of-6 on fourth down compared to CSP going 0-for-2.

While the Golden Bears were able to slow Kittner and the passing game, the Marauders pivoted to the ground game, rushing 46 times for 202 yards on the day despite averaging just 100 yards per game on the ground entering play.

The final totals showed Mary with 351 yards of total offense to CSP's 307 with the Marauders picking up 21 first downs to CSP's 17, but Mary held a 35:06 to 24:54 time of possession margin

due to the run game's 202-86 margin, keeping CSP from stealing the momentum.

While Richardson had the strong performance in the run and pass game, so did wide receiver **Troy Ellison** with 3-20 rushing and 4-43 receiving.

Sophomore quarterback **Conner Cordts** completed 19-30 for 221 yards and a touchdown while targeting and completing passes to nine different options.

On special teams, sophomore punter **Parker Dahlman** launched four punts for a 46.5 average with a long of 58 yards and a pair inside the 20.

FROM THE "GRIFF MYTH" TO "HOME SWEET FOAM"

Prior to head coach **Shannon Currier** returning to lead the Golden Bears, CSP had posted an 11-24 record at Sea Foam Stadium (2009 to 2015) and had never posted more than two home wins in a row with just two winning seasons since football returned to campus in 2009.

In Currier's first season back, the Bears won the 2016 home opener and did so again to start the 2017 season.

In 2017, CSP also nabbed a win in the home finale, a 37-20 win over SMSU that started a three game home winning streak, including the first two games of 2018, for the 3-game streak in Sea Foam Stadium's history. It was also the first 3-game home winning streak since the 2005 NSIC Championship season, played

HEAD COACH SHANNON CURRIER | 11TH SEASON



Originally the 8th head coach of CSP football in 2000, Shannon Currier returned to lead the program for his 2nd stint in December, 2015.

He became the program's all-time wins leader on November 3, 2018 with a 16-10 win at SMSU.

In his first stint, he compiled a 32-12 (.727) record and brought the program its first NSIC Championship in 2003 when he was named NSIC Coach of the Year. The conference title also brought a berth in the Mineral Water Bowl, the first postseason game in school history.

He coached Concordia to four consecutive winning seasons and is the only coach in program history to achieve the feat - consecutive or cumulative.

THE GRIFF MYTH - PROTECTING HOME TURF

The team also established the longest home winning streak in school history under his guidance. Known to teams of the era as the "Griff Myth," Concordia tallied 19 consecutive home victories down the street at Griffin Stadium. The streak began in 2002 and stretched two years after Currier left through the 2005 season, finally falling at the beginning of 2006.

In Currier's first four years, his teams only lost two home games, producing a record of 18-2 after winning his first and last nine home games.

He opened his return to the program with a 17-0 shutout win over U-Mary in 2016, snapping a 6-game home losing streak and a former school record 8-game overall losing streak. His CSP teams are 9-1 all-time in home openers and he holds a career 29-23 home mark at Concordia between Griffin & Sea Foam Stadium.

CAREER AT TRUMAN

Following the program's 2003 NSIC title run, Currier accepted the head coach position at Truman State where he turned a losing program into a pair of 6-5 winning campaigns in his 3rd and 4th seasons.

His tenure was highlighted in his third year, leading the Bulldogs to a 6-3 record in a strong MIAA, finishing fourth in the league. He left the program following a 4-7 season in 2008 with a 20-35 overall record.

PRIOR TO REJOINING CONCORDIA'S SIDELINES

Following his departure from Truman, Currier spent seven years working outside of the coaching profession as a senior sales manager with iHigh.com working to build a digital platform for high school sports, reaching up to 1.5 million Minnesotans in his final year with the company.

NSIC BACKGROUND & ST. PAUL PRIVATE EDUCATION

He arrived at Concordia in 1999 as offensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator for former head coach and athletics director Dan O'Brien, now an assistant coach for the University of Minnesota.

Prior to joining Concordia, Currier spent two years each in similar roles at Southwest Minnesota State and Minnesota Crookston following his start in college coaching at Bemidji State as an offensive graduate assistant where earned his master's degree in physical education.

A native of Cosmos, Minnesota, Currier was a quarterback at Hamline University where he graduated with a degree in physical education in 1993.

down the street at St. Paul Central High School's Griffin Stadium.

In Currier's first term leading the Bears (2000-03), he posted an 18-2 home record at Griffin Stadium, starting the "Griff Myth," a 19-game home winning streak that began in 2002 and spanned four full seasons of perfect home football (2002, 2003, 2004, 2005).

Currier now holds a 29-23 career record in home games at Concordia, a solid 9-1 mark in home openers, a 4-4 mark in home finales and led the team to a winning record at Sea Foam Stadium in 2018 for the third time since 2009.

The Golden Bears are now 11-21 at Sea Foam Stadium under Currier since 2016 including winning seasons in 2018 (3-2) and 2019 (4-2), the only back-to-back winning seasons in Sea Foam Stadium's history.

CONCORDIA ST CLOUD GOLDEN HUSKIES

Concordia's week two road trip to face Southwest Minnesota State featured seven former St. Cloud State Huskies facing their former head coach **Scott Underwood**, who now patrols the SMSU sidelines in his first season with the Mustangs.

At the conclusion of the 2019 football season, the administrations at St. Cloud State University and the University of Minnesota Crookston made the difficult decision to end their football programs.

Immediately, the CSP coaches put together a plan and worked with Concordia administration to provide an opportunity for student-athletes to continue to pursue their goals towards graduating from college while remaining members of an NSIC football program.

Coach Currier and his staff successfully recruited 11 members of the 2019 SCSU team, and one from UMC.

Robby Carrillo, Luke Duns Moor, Jake Edwards, Nathan Gimza, Taylon Hensley, Sarek Hoerth, Robert Kraklow, Dominic LaCombe, Luke Shepherd, Mason Van Zeeland and **Nick Webley** all joined Concordia from SCSU while **Ryan Martin** changed his golden from the Eagles to the Bears. They became a part of the campus community during the pandemic shortened spring 2020 semester and continued through the 2020-21 academic year.

In 2022, six of the Huskies: Carrillo, Duns Moor, Edwards, Gimza, Hensley and Hoerth, along with Martin from UMC, remain with team.

Meanwhile, Kraklow joined the coaching staff as a first-year graduate assistant working with the OL for the 2022 season.

For the second year in a row, the Golden Bears have infused the roster with nine players who have experience as members of NCAA Division I programs on the roster. SOPHOMORE QUARTERBACKS

In 2021 as freshmen, quarterbacks **Conner Cordts** and **Bryce Sievers** became the seventh and eighth players to start a game at quarterback as a freshman (or redshirt freshman) since Concordia made the jump to NCAA Division II in 1999.

Cordts joined elite company in becoming just the second freshman to start a season opener at quarterback, joining **James McNear**, who is a CSP and NSIC Hall of Famer and ended his career as the Division II leader in career total offense, playing from 2002-05.

Cordts started the first six games before a season-ending injury derailed his rookie season, committing just one turnover with one INT in 141 pass attempts after starting his career INT-free for 111 passes. Sievers earned playing time in six games, starting three.

Sophomore quarterback **Conner Cordts** registered his first career 300-yard passing performance, completing 18-46 for 306 with three TDs and one INT in week three against Sioux Falls, averaging 17 yards per completion in the first 300-yard passing game since November 4, 2017 (**Ron Johnson**, at Augustana). Cordts also achieved a career-high of 365 yards of total offense and 59 rushing yards in the contest.

EGNARSKI AMONG DIVISION II TACKLES LEADERS

Junior **Andrew Egnarski** returned to the field in week three, and shortly thereafter returned to the starting lineup. Despite missing two games and playing in a reserve role in three others, Egnarski is already seventh in the country and leading the NSIC with 10.9 tackles per game, making 76 total stops in seven contests, adding 3.5 TFLs and a forced fumble.

He set the school record with 22 total tackles in week nine against UMary, the second-most tackles in a Division II game in the 2022 season, and has the top two single game totals in the NSIC, making 19 tackles against Bemidji State, the sixth-most in a game in the country this season which was one shy of the school record at the time.

He's currently had at least 10 tackles in a game in four straight contests, piling up 61 tackles in the four game span.

In 2021, Egnarski led the team with 68 total tackles, earning NSIC Defensive Player of the Week honors in CSP's week two win over Upper Iowa with 11 tackles, 3.5 TFLs, 3.5 sacks, a forced fumble and fumble recovery. He produced 6.0 TFLs, tied for the team lead with 5.0 sacks and had an INT on the season.

As a Golden Bear, Egnarski has accumulated 159 career tackles in 29 games, adding 10.5 TFLs, 5.0 sacks, two forced fumbles, a recovery and an interception.

SHEEHAN LEADS THE SAFETIES

Sixth-year senior **Rhett Sheehan** has remained a top leader in the program, putting together a strong 2022 campaign.

He opened the season with eight tackles including 2.0 TFLs while helping shut down the Augustana pass game to just 7-14 for 62 yards.

He continued in week two by matching his career-high with 10 tackles at SMSU, adding another TFL while helping limit the Mustangs to 106 passing yards on 8-17 passing with two INTs.

Arguably his top individual performance of the season came in week eight at Northern State, registering three turnovers in the second half with a pair of interceptions and a fumble recovery while adding a pair of pass break-ups and five tackles.

His 3.0 tackles for loss on the year set a new career-high for the veteran safety, who is second on the team and 15th in the league with 54 tackles.

As a junior in 2021, Sheehan was an All-NSIC North Division Second Team safety, ranking second on the team and 23rd in the NSIC with 63 total tackles. His three interceptions, all in CSP's five home games, ranked ninth in the Northern Sun, and he racked up 85 return yards in the process while adding two pass breakups for five passes defended, second-most on the team while contributing a team-leading two forced fumbles.

In his career, Sheehan has secured 197 tackles and 6.0 TFLs across 42 games with a career-high 63 tackles in 2021. He has 18 career passes defended on 13 breakups and five interceptions, adding three forced fumbles with two fumble recoveries.

MCCLURE WITH FOUR INTS

Safety **Cyrus McClure** had a tremendous start to his sophomore season, securing three interceptions in the first two weeks, twice in the season's opening quarter against #25 Augustana, now a 6-1 squad, and securing another INT in week two at SMSU. He added his fourth pick in week nine against UMary.

He's tied for the league lead with his four INTs, ranking 22nd in the country.

It's the second-straight year a Golden Bear safety has registered at least three interceptions in a season, with McClure joining his teammate **Rhett Sheehan**, who had three INTs in 2021 as a junior, with Sheehan adding two more in 2022.

As a sophomore, McClure has a career-high 42 tackles, adding 1.5 TFLs, four INTs and a pass breakup.

McClure has played in 17 career games, registering 68 tackles with seven passes defended (3 PBU, 4 INT), a forced fumble and a blocked kick.

DIVISION I BACKFIELD

Concordia's running game entering the 2022 season features its top four backs as Division I transfers: Northern Iowa transfer **Jaylin Richardson**, now a sophomore in his second year at CSP, has opened the year as the lead back. He's backed up by Kansas transfer **Gayflor Flomo** and Northern Colorado transfer **Jaire Moore**, with all three backs playing a role consistently throughout the season.

RICHARDSON TOPS 100-RUSHING

Sophomore running back **Jaylin Richardson** had his best game as a college running back in week two at SMSU, rushing for 175 yards on 12.5 per carry (14-175). He got stronger as the game wore on, with 9-151 in the second half, ripping off runs of 20, 31 and 74 yards in the process. While it's his lone 100-yard rushing performance, he's consistently topped 100 all-purpose yards (below).

RICHARDSON TOPS 100 ALL-PURPOSE YARDS

Richardson has topped 100 all-purpose yards four times in 2022, starting with his career-best 207 all-purpose yards in week two at SMSU (14-175 rush, 2-7 rec, 1-25 KR).

While topping 100 all-purpose yards four times, Richardson has also surpassed 85 all-purpose yards in eight out of nine games this season.

He's among the league's top-10 in rushing (587 yards, 8th) and all-purpose yards (103.2/game, 9th). The versatile back is also leading the team with 23 receptions out of the backfield and third on the team in receiving yards (23-244).

Richardson was a highly recruited RB from the Kansas City area, initially committing to Kansas before signing with Northern Iowa where he was an early enrollee in spring 2020. He made his debut in the 2021 COVID shortened spring season for the Panthers, and retained his full eligibility for his CSP career.

In 2021, Richardson led CSP with 61.6 all-purpose yards per game, playing in seven games with three starts. He was second on the team in rushing yards (234) while leading the backfield with two rushing TDs. He added 15-85 rec and 5-99 on KR.

In his two seasons with CSP, Richardson has compiled 821 rushing yards in 16 games, averaging 4.6 yards per carry with four TDs while adding 38-329 with two receiving TDs, 9-197 on kickoff returns and 4-13 on punt returns for 1,360 all-purpose yards.

Flomo is second on the team with 469 all-purpose yards with a team-high 372 on kickoff returns (21.9 avg, 55 long) while Moore's 381 all-purpose yards feature balance with 177 rushing, 105 receiving and 99 via kickoff returns.

Flomo, originally from the metro (Fridley) and graduate of Tinto-Grace High School, was a standout at Iowa Western Community College out of high school before transferring to Kansas where he was an Academic All-Big 12 Second Team selection, playing in nine games and earning six carries for the Jayhawks.

Moore is originally from Dallas, Texas and rushed 12-38 for Northern Colorado in 2021, spending three seasons there including a redshirt and a missed year due to COVID-19.

BROTHERLY LOVE

The 2021 Concordia-St. Paul roster features two sets of brothers: **Mel & El-Osiris Jeudy**, along with **Robby & Austin Carrillo**.

The **Jeudys** are from Miami, Florida with Mel joining the pro-

gram as a transfer prior to the 2020 spring term and El-Osiris being a freshman during the 2020-21 academic year.

Mel, a senior nose tackle, played three games at Alderson Broaddus University, a Division II program in 2019 after spending his first two years of college football at Division I Eastern Kentucky, including a redshirt season. He has played in 19 career games for CSP including 10 starts up front. In 2021, he put up 22 total tackles and 4.0 TFLs. He's made 15 tackles in 2022 including a pair of 5-tackle performances.

El-Osiris, a sophomore linebacker, has appeared in 18 career games. With an increased role in 2022, he's made 27 tackles. He made his first career start in week three against USF, making a career-high six tackles, starting again in week four at WSC with another career-high of eight tackles against the Wildcats in the midst of a stretch of three-straight starts, including a week five forced fumble against Minnesota State.

The **Carrillos** are offensive linemen from Case High School in Racine, Wisconsin with **Robby** joining the program prior to the 2020 spring term as a transfer from St. Cloud State with four years of eligibility remaining after redshirting with the Huskies in the final season of SCSU's program.

Robby played each of the final seven games in 2021 while **Austin** redshirted in his first year in the program in 2021. The brothers have appeared in games together six times in 2022. Robby picked up three straight starts at right tackle in weeks 4-to-6 and has been a regular in the offensive line rotation, while Austin has seen a regular role on the PAT and FG units.

CONTINUITY DEFINES OFFENSIVE LINE

The 2022 offensive line is defined by its continuity, with nearly the entire two-deep having played together for at least three seasons and many having gained valuable playing experience last season.

Junior center **Sam Marshalek** is the leader up front with 30 games played and 22 starts under his belt, occupying the center position in 2022. Left tackle **Jake Edwards** has been a steady performer, moving to the LT spot in 2022 and has 14 career starts among his 20 games played at CSP.

The line features four former St. Cloud State players: Edwards, guards **Taylor Hensley** and **Sarek Hoerth** and tackle **Robby Carrillo**. All of the SCSU transfer offensive linemen have started in their time at CSP and are continuing to contribute to the travel roster and offensive line rotation.

The group also features sophomores **Elliott Wolfe** (17 GP, 10 GS) at guard and **Jac Carver** (14 GP, 9 GS) at right tackle.

As a unit, the CSP offensive line ranks 31st in the country and fifth in the NSIC with 1.33 sacks allowed per game, and ranks 28th in the country and fourth in the NSIC in fewest TFLs allowed per game (4.78).

The line is coming off of a strong performance at Northern



State two weeks ago, helping the offense rack up 511 yards of total offense, the highest output since week three of 2016, while issuing no sacks and three TFLs to one of the top-ranked defenses in the country with the Wolves ranking 12th in total defense, fourth in sacks and fifth in TFLs entering the game.

50-PLUS YARD WIDE RECEIVERS

Concordia's pass game is built upon its depth, with six different targets picking up at least 17 catches and 185 yards: **Joey Farley** (22-213, TD), **Jack Munstersteiger** (21-216), **Jaylin Richardson (RB)** (23-244, 2 TD), **Drew Enke** (21-322, TD), **Nathan Gimza** (19-270) and **Troy Ellison** (17-185, 2 TD).

Eight different players have found the end zone among the 10 touchdown passes including a pair of running backs, with Richardson and Ellison leading the team with two TD grabs apiece.

Five different players have topped 50 receiving yards in a game this year with Richardson leading the team with three 50-plus games while Enke and Gimza have each topped 70 yards twice.

DAHLMAN LEADS PUNTING UNIT

Sophomore **Parker Dahlman** continues to provide one of the top legs in the country on a punt unit that plays to its coverage unit and directional kicking.

In 2022, Dahlman is third in the NSIC and 31st in the country with a 40.1 average on the fourth-fewest punts (36), but more importantly has dropped nine inside the 20, has nine fair catches and four 50-plus yard punts (57, 61, 54, 58).

His directional punting and hangtime have helped the special teams produced the nation's 18th-ranked and league-leading opposing punt return average of 2.71 yards per return along with the 27th-ranked net punt average (37.32), second-best in the NSIC.

In week two at SMSU, Dahlman put together three punts for a consistent 41.0 average with a long of 45 and all three punts pinning SMSU inside the 20.

In week four, he averaged 49.0 yards on three punts with a long of 61 yards at Wayne State, the fifth-best single game average in school history with at least two punts in a game.

He's produced a 41-plus yard punting average in a game four times on the year and topped 38.0 yards in eight out of nine contests with only two touchbacks.

As a freshman in 2021, Dahlman ranked fifth in the league with a 40.1 season punting average on a league-high 67 punts. His 12 punts of 50-plus yards topped the league charts, and his 14 punts inside the 20 finished two off the league lead, ranking third. He forced 12 fair catches and only had five touchbacks.

His 77 yard punt at Sioux Falls was the third longest in the league last year and the third-longest in program history.

His top single-game effort in his career, a 6-punt, 50.2 average at Sioux Falls (2021) with four punts of 50-plus yards, ranks as the best single-game punting average with at least five punts in a game.

In his young career, Dahlman's 40.16 career average is on pace to be a career record and his name is already plastered on the game, season and career punting charts for the program. He's climbed to fourth with 103 career punts and fourth with 4,136 career punt yards, as well.

HENSON IN THE KICKING GAME

Concordia-St. Paul has featured some of the top kickers in the country over the past decade with sophomore **Sam Henson** handling the duties in 2021 and 2022.

Henson entered the 2022 season as the 13th-ranked kicker in Division II football by The College Football Network and 20th-ranked by FBPI Football.

Henson was recently named a Fred Mitchell Award Watch List candidate for his performance on the field and in the community for September, 2022, his fourth time earning monthly watch list honors for the award that honors the top placekicker for their on-field and volunteer service in small college football (FCS, DII, DIII, NAIA, NJCAA).

Henson had a standout debut season in 2021, leading the NSIC and ranking 21st nationally with a 76.9 field goal percentage (10-13) while hitting 10-11 from inside of 50 yards with a long of 48 which he converted in his career debut at Winona State.

He ranked 40th in the country and fifth in the NSIC with 0.91 field goals made per game, a well.

He led the team in scoring in 2021 with 48 points, averaged 53.3 yards on 41 kickoffs with 10 touchbacks and made two field goals in a game twice.

In 2022, he's 3-10 on field goals, with his misses all being ei-

ther from 42-plus yards (42, 46, 47, 50) or being blocked (3). He's connected on his other three attempts from 22, 24 and 25 yards. He added his third career 2-field goal performance in week two at SMSU.

In his career, he's connected on 13 of his 23 field goal attempts with a long of 48 yards and he's cashed in all but two of his PATs (30-32).

He's added power to his kickoffs in 2022, upping his average to 59.2 yards with seven touchbacks on 27 kickoffs.
